HEAD OF CUSTOMER FIRST, COMMERCIAL SERVICES MANAGER In 2001 the Registration Service was consolidated at Fulham Register Office. A limited service was to be provided at Hammersmith Hospital.

Hammersmith Registration Office was kept open as a temporary outstation whilst the accommodation was prepared. A temporary receptionist was employed from an agency. Once the move to the hospital was made the receptionist would no longer be needed and this was offered and accepted as a saving of £30K.

The hospital then decided it could no longer offer the accommodation. The Outstation is still operating and causing an overspend.

The report seeks to improve access to the Council's Registration Service and address the budget overspend through the closure of the Registrar's Outstation in Nigel Playfair Avenue.
