REPORT CONTRIBUTORS This report recommends the establishment of a Resident Services department which will build upon the existing Customer First Division. The new Department will bring together all transactional services type (e.g. Housing Benefits, Council Tax and Parking Permits) so that they can be redesigned around the needs and expectations of customers (e.g. better use of phone and web functionality). Service re-design will also offer significant opportunities for savings and efficiencies.
