SUMMARY:

The Planning & Compulsory Purchase Act came into force in September 2004. This introduced a new planning system consisting of Local Development Frameworks (LDF) to replace the Unitary Development Plans (UDP).

This report will provide details of the representations received from October 2005 until January 2006 when the council consulted on planning issues and options for the borough and how these have assisted in the preparation of preferred options.

The report seeks agreement to the preferred options for the LDF core strategy, generic development control policies and site allocations development plan documents. It also seeks agreement to the sustainability appraisal report that will accompany the preferred options document.
