The Planning and Compulsory Purchase Act 2004 introduced a new planning system consisting of Local Development Frameworks (LDF) to replace Unitary Development Plans (UDP). The Local Development Scheme (LDS) sets out the content and programme for preparing the LDF.

The Act requires the council to revise its LDS at such time as it considers appropriate. A first revision came into effect in March 2007, and this report to Cabinet will seek agreement to further adjustments to the LDS that are required in respect of the agreed programmes for LDF documents as well for new documents that are identified for inclusion in the Scheme.

The report will also seek agreement to bring the revised LDS into effect once it has been agreed by Government Office for London.
