This investment proposal is to overhaul the income management IT system that H&F currently use to take payments. This will allow H&F to gain a tighter financial control of its cash and debt positions and consequently increase the efficiency of financial reconciliation and the debt management process. In addition and included in the proposal is the work needed to become PCI (Payment Card Industry) compliant which is a mandatory standard for all organisations taking credit card payments. The rules are enforced and mandated by Visa and Mastercard. There is a significant risk of being noncompliant and continuing to taking credit card payments beyond September 2009.
