SUMMARY:

Part 5 of The London Local Authorities and Transport for London Act, 2008, enables The London Borough of Hammersmith & Fulham (along with four other authorities) to assume powers to take action to deal with persistent evader vehicles (i.e. those with multiple unpaid penalty charges at a certain stage), from an 'appointed day'. The Act requires that the 'appointed day' is fixed by way of a Full Council resolution.

The five participating authorities will initially undertake a pilot scheme to trial the legislation, and if successful it is intended that the scheme be extended to all London boroughs.

SUMMARY:

Section 349 of the Gambling Act 2005 requires all licensing authorities to prepare and publish a statement of the principles that they propose to apply in exercising their functions under the Act during the three year period to which the policy applies.

The first Statement of Policy was published by the London Borough of Hammersmith and Fulham on the 20th December 2006 and took effect on the 31st January 2007. This draft policy is our second in the required three year period and must be published 28 days before it comes into effect.

In reviewing this policy there have only been minor alterations to the Statement of Policy. The Policy needs to be approved at Full Council on the 28th October 2010.

Although ordinarily network technology is obsolete within five years H&F Bridge Partnership have saved the council money by prolonging the current network assets' life beyond their normal lifecycle. The network is now however overdue an upgrade.

Retirement of the corporate ATM network (used at Hammersmith Town Hall, the extension and at other major sites) is primarily driven by the fact that the kit is obsolete and can no longer be either supported or maintained.
