The seating is directly under sleeping areas of all the flats in the building and not everyone is an adult or necessarily in good health thus there should be a minimum of disturbance. Just going in and out and certainly no music being audible outside the interior of the premises.

So these "concessions" merely harden my heart as enforcement of conditions is not something the authority has covered themselves in glory with and calling up whoever be it Environmental Health, LBHF etc. just raises the stress levels.

The applicant can blame the developers for not providing more than adequate sound attenuation be it on the ground, reflective wall surfaces, dense vegetation etc.
