3. **DECISION:**

- 1. 4. **REASON FOR DECISION:**

The five accommodation contracts are critical to the council's strategic priority to end rough sleeping. The original procurement timetable for new services was delayed due to the impact of COVID. Five directly awarded 12 months contracts are necessary to ensure service continuity while services are procured to commence by 1 November 2021.

5. **ALTERNATIVE OPTIONS CONSIDERED:**

Option 1 – Do not award the contracts bringing the current arrangements to an immediate end

This option is not viable as there will be a gap before new services are in place for vulnerable residents. This option would likely increase the demand for more intensive health, housing and social care services and increase rough sleeping. For these reasons this option is not recommended.

Option 2 - Directly award five short-term interim contracts to the incumbent providers

This option will enable service continuity to vulnerable residents while new contract arrangements are put in place. For this reason, this option is recommended.
