4. REVIEW OF STATEMENT OF LICENSING POLICY 2010

6 - 156

This report seeks the Committee's approval for the Council's Statement of Licensing Policy 2010, which has been publicly consulted upon, prior to its submission to Council.

Section 5 of the Licensing Act 2003 requires a licensing authority to prepare, consult and publish a Statement of Licensing Policy every three years, it was last reviewed in 2007 and the new policy must be published by January 2011.

A draft revised Statement of Licensing Policy was sent out for consultation between the 8th June 2010 to the 30th August 2010. Issues which arose during consultation were recorded and taken into account during the review.

This report outlines the review and consultation process, issues for consideration and the proposed amendments which were the subject of public consultation, and seeks the views of the committee. The draft

new statement is attached as Appendix 6.

Once approved, the Statement of Licensing Policy will supersede the 2007 policy and will be the key document which the Licensing Committee will use to assist in the determination of applications.

5. SEXUAL ESTABLISHMENT VENUES AND SEX ESTABLISHMENT LICENSING POLICY

157 - 230

In April 2010, section 27 of the Policing and Crime Act 2009, amended Schedule 3 of the Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1982, by introducing a new type of sex establishment called a 'sexual entertainment venue'.

The new legislation offers the Council and local residents greater power to control the number and location of lap dancing clubs and similar venues in the borough. If the Council wishes to adopt the powers offered by the legislation it needs to resolve to do so.

A draft Sex Establishment Licensing Policy was sent out for a 12 week consultation which began on the 8th June 2010 and ended on the 30th August 2010.

This report seeks the Committee's recommendation that Council resolve to exercise these powers and to adopt the policy which reflects and set out the Council's position, attached as Appendix 5.
