2. DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST

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1. THE APPLICATION

On 05 January 2022, Parklife Trading Ltd ("the applicant") submitted an application for a new premises licence to be granted in respect of the premises known as The Tea House located at Tea Rooms Bishop's Park Bishop's Avenue London SW6 6EA.

1.1 Application Requested

The applicant has applied for a new premises licence for the sale of alcohol both on and off the premises as outlined below:

Sale of alcohol - Both On and Off the Premises

Monday to Sunday 09:00 – 23:00

*the sale of alcohol between 17:00 and 23:00 shall cover events at the venue

Hours open to public:

Monday to Friday 08:00 - 17:00 Saturday to Sunday 09:00 - 17:00

On 03 February 2022 the applicant added a seasonal variation to this application, please see below:

Between the spring and summer months the applicant proposes to extend the premises closing hours from 17:00 to 20:00.

On 07 February 2022 the applicant further amended the application. Therefore, the updated licensable activities are as follows:

Sale of alcohol – On the Premises Only

Monday to Sunday 11:00 – 20:00

*the sale of alcohol shall include events at the venue

Hours open to public:

Monday to Friday 08:00 – 17:00 Saturday to Sunday 09:00 – 17:00

Non-standard timings for Hours open to public - British Summer Time Period Only

Monday to Friday 08:00 - 20:00 Saturday to Sunday 09:00 - 20:00

1.2 Applicants Operating Schedule

The applicant has proposed a number of steps to promote the four licensing objectives if the application is granted. A copy of these steps can be seen on page 12 of this report.

On 03 February 2022, following correspondence received from the Police, the applicant agreed to amend the alcohol location and hours as well as add extra conditions to their licence if granted. A copy of this amendment and relevant correspondence can be seen on pages 17-18 of this report.

On 04 February 2022, following correspondence received from the Environmental Health Authority, the applicant sent some further clarifications regarding their risk and safety assessments. A copy of relevant correspondence can be seen on pages 19-36 of this report.

2. BACKGROUND

The premises is located within Bishop's Park. The main access to the premise's unit will be via Bishop's Avenue as well as Bishop's Park Road and its junction with Stevenage Road. There are primarily residential premises within the area, therefore, there is only one other neighbouring licensed premises within the selected 75m buffer zone. A map showing the location of the premises can be seen on pages 37-38 of this report.

There are several options for transport away from the area including buses and taxis which run from in and around the Bishop's Avenue area. Parsons Green tube station is a 19-minute walk away and Putney Bridge tube station is a 11-minute walk away.

3. CONSULTATION

A public notice was displayed at the premises for 28 days. The application was advertised in a local circular and all statutory consultees were notified as required by the Regulations. The Council has served written notice of hearing upon the applicant and all those parties that have made representations in respect of the application.

3.1. Relevant Representations

The licensing section received one representation from Cllr Lloyd-Harris objecting to the licence application. A copy of this representation can be seen on pages 39-40 of this report.

The licensing section received one representation from Cllr Johnson objecting to the licence application. A copy of this representation can be seen on page 41 of this report.

The licensing section received one representation from the Fulham Society Residents Group objecting to the licence application. A copy of this representation can be seen on pages 42-43 of this report.

The licensing section received one representation from the Bishops Mansions Residents Group objecting to the licence application. A copy of this representation can be seen on pages 44-57 of this report.

The licensing section received 147 representations from local residents objecting to the licence application. A copy of these representations can be seen on pages 58-209 of this report.

The licensing section received eight representations from local residents supporting the licence application. A copy of these representations can be seen on pages 210-218 of this report.

4. OTHER INFORMATION

4.1 Enforcement History

There have not been any warnings, simple cautions or prosecutions given in respect of the premises during the past three years.

4.2 Temporary Event Notices ("TENs")

No TENs have been submitted in respect of this premises in the past twelve months.

5. POLICY CONSIDERATIONS

- **5.1** Section 5.1 page 12 of the Statement of Licensing Policy ("SLP") states that where there is a relevant representation, the Licensing Authority will consider each particular case on its merits having regard in particular to the following matters:
 - Whether the licensed activities are likely to have an adverse impact especially
 on local residents and, if there is potential to have an adverse impact, what, if
 any, appropriate measures will be put in place to prevent it;
 - Whether there will be a substantial increase in the cumulative adverse impact from these or similar activities, on an adjacent residential area;
 - Whether there is a suitable level of public transport accessibility to and from the premises at the appropriate times;
 - Whether the activity will be likely to lead to a harmful and unmanageable increase in car parking demand in surrounding residential streets suffering high levels of parking stress or on roads forming part of the Strategic London Road Network or the London Bus Priority Network leading to a negative impact on the Licensing Objectives relating to the prevention of crime, disorder and nuisance; and
 - Whether there have been any representations made by Responsible Authorities, or other relevant agency or representative.

- 5.2 Section 5.2 page 12 of the SLP states that the Licensing Authority will closely scrutinise extended hours applications to ensure that the Licensing Objectives are met. In determining an application, the licensing committee might decide that the circumstances are such that a restriction on hours is the only appropriate means to achieve the Licensing Objectives. If an 'hours' restriction is imposed, the Licensing Authority will normally require that customers should be allowed a minimum of thirty minutes to consume alcohol. For example, if the closing time on the application is stated as 12 midnight, the latest time that a licence would be granted to serve alcohol would be 11:30pm, as the Licensing Authority will normally allow a minimum of 30 minutes to consume alcohol that has been purchased before the terminal hour.
- **5.3** Section 5.4 page 13 of the SPL states that the Licensing Authority advises applicants that it would be beneficial if a lawful planning use can be demonstrated for the activities proposed in all applications for premises licences.
- **5.4** Section 8.1 page 15 of the SLP states that the Licensing Authority will require applicants to detail in their operating schedule the steps proposed to ensure the deterrence and prevention of crime and disorder on, and in the vicinity of, the premises, having regard to their location, character, condition, the nature and extent of the proposed use and the persons likely to use the premises.
- 5.5 Section 8.2 pages 15 and 16 of the SLP states that the Licensing Authority will require the licence holder to indicate what steps will be put in place to control the excessive consumption of alcohol and drunkenness on relevant premises in order to reduce the risk of anti-social behaviour occurring elsewhere after customers have left the premises.
- 5.6 Section 9.1 page 17 of the SLP states that the Licensing Authority will require the applicant to detail in their operating plan the steps proposed to ensure the physical safety of people using the relevant premises or place.
- **5.7** Section 10.3 page 19 of the SLP states that the Licensing Authority will particularly consider the following matters where they are material to the individual application:
 - The proximity of residential accommodation;
 - The type of use proposed, including the likely numbers of customers, proposed hours of operation and the frequency of activity;
 - The steps taken or proposed to be taken by the applicant to prevent noise and vibration escaping from the premises, including music, noise from ventilation equipment, and human voices. Such measures may include the installation of soundproofing, air conditioning, acoustic lobbies and sound limitation devices;
 - The steps taken or proposed to be taken by the applicant to prevent disturbance by customers arriving at or leaving the premises. This will usually be of greater importance late at night and/or in the early hours of the morning. However, nuisance can arise at any time of the day or night so the Licensing Authority will consider representations from Responsible Authorities and/or Interested Parties relating to potential nuisance from any activity at all times dependent on the merits of the application/steps taken or proposed to prevent nuisance.
 - The steps taken or proposed to be taken by the applicant to prevent queuing (either by pedestrian or vehicular traffic). If some queuing is inevitable then

- queues should be diverted away from neighbouring premises or be otherwise managed to prevent disturbance or obstruction;
- The steps taken or proposed to be taken by the applicant to ensure staff leave the premises quietly;
- The arrangements made or proposed for parking by patrons, and the effect of parking by patrons on local residents;
- The provision for public transport in the locality (including taxis and private hire vehicles) for patrons;
- The level of likely disturbance from associated vehicular and pedestrian movement to and from the premises;
- The delivery and collection areas and delivery/collection times;
- The siting of external lighting, including security lighting that is installed inappropriately;
- The arrangements for refuse disposal, storage and the prevention/tidying of litter (including fly posters and illegal placards);
- The generation of odour, e.g. from the preparation of food;
- Any other relevant activity likely to give rise to nuisance;
- **5.8** Section 11.1 page 20 of the SLP states that the Licensing Authority will require operating plans to specify the measures and management controls in place to protect children from harm. Where appropriate a written childcare policy should be available and be incorporated in the induction of staff.

6. DETERMINATION

- **6.1** In determining this application, the Committee must have regard to the representations and take such of the following steps as it considers necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives. The steps are:
- (a) Grant the application in full
- (b) Grant the application in part modifying the proposed hours, activities or conditions.
- (c) Reject the application.

It is the Council's duty under the Licensing Act 2003 ("The Act") to determine applications with a view to promoting the four licensing objectives; Prevention of Crime and Disorder, Public Safety, Prevention of Public Nuisance and the Protection of Children from Harm.

In reaching a decision the Council shall consider the details of any relevant representations received; the applicant's Operating Schedule; the Council's adopted Statement of Licensing Policy and the guidance issued by the Secretary of State under section 182 of the Act.

If the Committee is minded to grant the application, conditions may be attached to the licence to alleviate the concerns raised through any representation(s).





Good Afternoon Licensing,

The Police confirm that they are happy with this amendment regarding any day when Fulham FC play a home fixture. The conditions agreed between the applicant and the Police are as follows:-

The sale of alcohol **ON the premises only.**

Days and times sought for licensable activity:-

Monday to Sunday between 11:00 to 20:00

1. High Definition CCTV shall be installed, operated and maintained, at all times that the premises are open for licensable activities and;

- shall be checked every two weeks to ensure that the system is working properly and that the date and time are correct. A record of these checks, showing the date and name of the person checking, shall be kept and made available to Police or authorised Council officers on request
- one camera will show a close-up of the entrance to the premises, to capture a clear, full length image of anyone entering.
- shall cover any internal or external area of the premises where licensable activities take place.
- recordings shall be in real time and stored for a minimum period of 31 days with date and time stamping.
- footage shall be provided free of charge to Police or authorised council officer within 24 hours of a request.
- a staff member from the premises that is conversant with the operation of the CCTV system shall be on the premises at all times. This staff member will be able to show police or authorised officers of the Licensing Authority recent data footage with the minimum of delay when requested. This data or footage reproduction shall be almost instantaneous
- 2.All staff responsible for selling alcohol shall receive regular training in the Licensing Act 2003 in terms of the licensing objectives, offences committed under the Act and conditions of the Premises Licence. Written records of this training shall be retained and made available to police and authorised officers of the Licensing Authority on request
- 3. The licence holder see shall put arrangements in place to ensure that before serving alcohol or other age-restricted goods to customers they believe to be less than 25 years of age, staff ask to see accredited proof of age: that is, proof of age

cards carrying the 'PASS' logo (and no others), a Passport, or UK Driving Licence bearing the photograph and date of birth of the customer

- 4.The licence holder shall require staff to note any refusals in a refusals log. The refusals log shall record the date and time of the refusal; the name of the staff member refusing; and the reason for refusal. It must be checked and signed monthly by the designated premises supervisor. The refusals log shall be made available for inspection upon request by the Licensing Team, Police or Trading Standards.
- 5.Alcohol supplied for consumption on the premises shall only be supplied with and be ancillary to a substantial meal to be consumed on the premises at the same time.
- 6. Alcohol shall not be sold on days when Fulham Football Club are playing at home or on days when a Fulham victory parade takes place.

Thank you very much for your email below.

On the electrical certificate our contractors (Catersales) have confirmed they have this and are sending a copy through, I've said it's urgent so will get it over asap.

For the fire risk assessment, we followed the same methodology which we've used at our other licensed cafes for their annual statutory inspections by the Lambeth and Wandsworth Councils as landlord. I can request a third party assessment though for the Tea House which I can see for this process will be of assistance.

I appreciate you may only be able to provide conditional consent at this stage on the license application subject to the above, so will progress them as quickly as possible.

Dear Shaafiek

Firstly, my apologies sorry it's taken a few days to come back to you, we've been struck down with Covid in various places so we've been running around plugging holes in the rota etc whilst also keeping the family above water!

There has also been a lot of correspondence on this application with various teams who have been very helpful in developing the application. I'm grateful to you for your patience and assistance on the health & safety side.

Thank you for your note below and in response to your direction, we have prepared the information which I hope is helpful in answering your questions. Please find attached for the Tea House:

- 1. The fire risk assessment (all the equipment has been either installed, upgraded or checked by Ohms Fire & Security within the past six months).
- 2. A statement on disabled access and overcrowding control. This is the first of one these we've been asked for so I hope this provides the right level of information and comfort. We've taken guidance from the HSE website in putting this together.
- 3. Recent PAT & gas inspection reports (we complete these annually at all our cafes as part of our annual compliance)
- 4. A copy of our last EHO inspection I know this isn't directly relevant, but it gives you a sense of an inspection carried out by LBHF as statutory authority (some small amends / updates) and the details of the officer in case you wish to consult.
- 5. I write in reference to the premises licensing application submitted for The Tea House Tea Rooms, Bishop's Park, Bishop's Avenue, London, SW6 6EA and received on 05/01/2022.

I am the member of the Health and Safety team, allocated to review the steps you intend to take to promote the Public Safety Licensing Objective.

Upon review of the licensing application, it is noted that the following measures will be in place: Suitable risk assessments, provision of a sufficient number of people employed or engaged to secure the safety of the premises and patrons, appropriate instruction, training and supervision of those employed and provision of effective CCTV. No alcohol to be served on days where there are football matches at Craven Cottage (Fulham FC's ground).

The following further information will be required to ascertain how public safety objectives will be achieved:

- Please provide a copy of your Fire Risk Assessment as I would like to make sure fire safety arrangements are adequate and that you have all necessary measures in place to prevent fire and evacuate people safely if fire does occur.
- 2) Disabled access and evacuation what is your policy regarding admittance for disabled customers? How are you going to assure their safety at the premises?
- 3) Checks on equipment at specified intervals, e.g. gas safety checks and Portable Appliance Testing.
- 4) Standards to be maintained, e.g. Fixed electrical installations to comply with British Standards:
- 5) Measures to protect against overcrowding;

In the in the meantime I would refer you to our licensing policy, available on our website under this link <u>Statement of Licensing Policy 2017 - 2022.doc (lbhf.gov.uk)</u>, especially pages 17-18, 26-27 and 30 which are relevant to public safety. Please familiarise yourself with it and elaborate on the specific measures which you are going to take to meet this objective. Please provide me with a response by <u>Tuesday</u>, **01 February 2022**.

Fire Risk Assessment & Management Plan The Tea House, Bishops' Park, London SW6 1EA

The Tea House

Background

- This document has been prepared by Parklife Trading Limited ("Parklife" or the "Tenant").
- There is a Site Plan which forms part of this management plan.
- The Tea House is a free-standing building of brick construction located in the centre of Bishops Park, 40 yards from the nearest road access on Bishops Park Avenue. The park is accessible at this point via double gates locked with a FB padlock (the "Property").
- The landlord and freeholder of the Property is the London Borough of Hammersmith & Fulham (the "Landlord").
- The Tenant is the operator of the café on a long lease. The Tenant is broadly responsible for the interior and exterior of the property including tenant's improvements. The Landlord is responsible for the conduits to the building.
- Nearest fire station is the Fulham Fire Station which is 6 minutes normal driving distance from the Property.
- This assessment relates to The Tea House only.

Occupation & main users of the Property

- The Property is principally occupied during the daytime. The café is open seven days per week for 363 days of the year and there are personnel on site between 8.30am-6pm at the minimum each day.
- From time to time, seasonal hours will lengthen, expected to be to 8am to 8pm in the peak of the summer.
- The main users of the site are the café staff, customers across a broad range of demographics, contractors serving the café and suppliers to the café.

Property layout & condition

The Property is arranged over a ground floor comprising an open customer area, service counter, service kitchen, two door access to the kitchen and storage area behind the counter. There is a disabled access toilet accessible directly from the café. The entire property is step free. There is customer seating around the outside of the café and an enclosed yard to the rear for café storage with thumb lock security.

The Property was completely refurbished in 2021, bring stripped back to the shell and core, before being renovated using modern and compliant building materials throughout.

Fire Risk Assessment (Ignition & Fuel) & Mitigating Actions

1. Electrical

- a. All electrical equipment undergoes an annual PAT check and failed items are disposed of or replaced.
- b. Consumer units are checked on an annual basis and any faulty items are replaced.

2. Cooking & gas:

- a. Kitchen staff are trained on safe cooking technique and in the use of fire control equipment.
- b. Extraction deep cleaned to statutory level on an annual basis or more frequently if deemed necessary. Exposed sections facing cooking areas are cleaned in their entirety on a weekly basis.
- c. Natural gas appliances (boiler, chargrill and four burner stove) are tested and certified on an annual basis. They are all supplied via a mains connection to a U16 meter point on the outside wall of the kitchen.
- d. The boiler is housed in an internal cupboard together with a hot water tank and adjacent to foul waste pumping equipment for a manhole outside the property which is the responsibility of the landlord. The boiler is powered by natural gas.

3. Chemicals:

a. Main store is in a locked cupboard in the corner of the café. Other operational stores hold very limited quantities (cleaning chemicals) and are not accessible by the public.

4. Arson:

a. Wherever practical, no combustible materials are held to the exterior of the property and waste is cleared on a daily basis via a commercial waste contract (fulfilled by LBHF)

5. Accident:

- a. Staff are trained to be vigilant and in the Fire Procedures.
- b. No powered equipment left on overnight other than refrigeration, IT cabinet, CCTV, air conditioning and water heating (closed loop hot water system).
- c. Compliant Fire Procedure signage is placed throughout. There is no smoking permitted in the Property.

Fire Protection

The Property is protected by the following:

- 1. An RCB fuse board (with corresponding sub fuse boards) protecting all circuits within the Property. Enclosed in steel housing and installed by LBHF.
- 2. Smoke detectors within the café, a heat detector in the kitchen and fire alarm system installed by LBHF and checked by Ohms Fire & Security on an annual basis.
- 3. Fire alarm system, local sounding and connected to Parklife management (2 individuals).
- 4. Fire extinguishers throughout the Property water, CO2 and wet chemical. These are checked and tested by Ohms Fire & Security.
- 5. Fire blanket in the kitchen
- 6. Gas interlock & cut-out system in the kitchen extraction.
- 7. Emergency lighting throughout the Property.
- 8. The IT equipment is contained within a fireproof steel and glass cabinet.
- 9. The cooking area is enclosed with a brick wall with steel heat shielding beside the cooking area
- 10. Illuminated emergency exit signs throughout.

Fire Exits


- There are four fire exits as marked on the plan which are unlocked as part of daily operating procedures, which are tracked via a cloud based app called Trail.
- The entire property is level, on one floor and step free. All doors exceed 800mm in width for disabled access.
- All fire exits are kept clear of obstructions.

Fire Procedure

Fire Procedure training is provided to all staff during their induction. If an alarm sounds or a fire is identified, the building is evacuated to the front where the assembly point is in the concrete area by the playground.

The fire and heat alarms also send an alert to the Company's Operations Manager and Managing Director via a mobile app.

A log of this training is kept by the Company Administrator in the Company records.

The Tea House, Bishops Park, London SW6 6EA ("The Tea House") Statement on Crowd Control & Disabled Access



The Tea House is the park café for Bishops Park in the London Borough of Hammersmith & Fulham. It is an historic building that is served this purpose for many decades and the landlord is the London Borough of Hammersmith and Fulham ("LBHF"). It is currently operated by Parklife Trading Limited ("Parklife"), a specialist operator of park cafes in London. Parklife has experience of operating cafes in large green spaces in five London boroughs, including two substantial and high footfall Commons (Wandsworth and Streatham). Further details can be found at

As a park café, it is a highly weather dependent and seasonal business, with much larger volumes of customers in the summer and weekends than the winter weekdays for example. It has been designed and built for the peak days.

Layout & Design

The Tea House benefits from a layout and design that facilitates movement through the site. It has been specifically designed and renovated to maximise speed of service through the building, with a large one way counter system built around the central core of the building. Seating capacity has been reduced in favour of space for customers to steadily progress through the service sequence, with 2-3 metres of clear space around the counter. There is a single 1.2 metre pinch point around one nib wall but ample space either side for movement.

There are three entry and exit points to the building which are even spaced evenly around the customer area on each side of the property. These are unlocked and open during operating hours and this is monitored by Parklife's compliance system, a cloud based app called Trail. These entry and exit points are designed to allow the building to empty rapidly in case of emergency.

The building has ample natural ventilation as well as small scale mechanical heating and cooling.

Service Model

Service is operated in a single lateral flow queuing system as normally found in specialty cafes, with customers moving past product displays (drinks, bakery, snacks) before approaching the till points in turn, as opposed to a pub style counter where all customers can simultaneously approach the counter front on. This eliminates the risk of surges at the counter.

The demographic of park users is diverse across age ranges, family type, ethnicity and socio-economic. This diversity promotes an atmosphere and tolerance, assisted by the cafes core business of being a daytime park café which attracts a regular set of customers who set an example of how to use and behave in the café. This is important to setting the right tone for new customers. Signage and music are also used to create the right atmosphere for calm, efficient and positive service in the café. It is very much family style park café hospitality.

Exterior Considerations

There is substantial space around the café for customers to consume product both in the agreed seating area around the café and in the broader park. Busy days are dry days and on these days, the inside space becomes predominately service space (and less for seating and dwelling), so customer density effectively self regulates.

Moving vehicles are minimised within the park and subject to low speed restrictions and this is regulated by LBHF personnel including parks officers, parks police and the Met police. External lighting and the security of footpaths are the responsibility of LBHF and are of a satisfactory standard, with any issues relating to the café reported to parks personnel.

There are provisions in the lease to ensure that internal music from the café is inaudible from the outside and that no flashing lights are visible from the outside.

Disabled User Considerations

For disabled customers, the spacing around the counter and the café facility has been designed to accommodate wheelchair users, and staff are trained to communicate with all customers to facilitate service to wheelchair users. Furniture is DDA compliant both inside and outside the café and has been selected in consultation with LBHF. There is a DDA toilet facility within the café itself, as well as additional facilities as part of the public toilets 50 yards from the café. Staff are trained to be helpful and mindful of hidden disabilities.

Alcohol Service Considerations

Should alcohol be served in the event of a successful license application, it should be noted that the products that Parklife sells are premium alcohol products such as craft beer and cider, organic wines and artisan spirits. Parklife does not sell low priced high strength products.

As is common in park café operations, beer and cider are sold from self serve fridges by the service point (i.e. under staff supervision, at height away from children, under CCTV surveillance and shuttered for non-licensed opening times). Wines and spirits are ordered from staff at the till point. It should be noted that alcohol forms a small proportion of overall sales in a park café operation.

Parklife has had no incidents of disorderly behaviour since taking on its first licensed park café on Wandsworth Common in 2014, and none at any of the subsequent cafés on Streatham Common and Twickenham Riverside. Parklife's cafés are regularly inspected by parks and Met police which to date has been a mutually constructive relationship, where the café has used as a facility to assist in the safeguarding of the park space more generally.

The property is ultimately controlled by LBHF who set the conditions in the lease and also select the operator based on their operating style. This provides a control over the property being run as a wet led pub style operation for example.

A licensing application has been developed in consultation with the Met police to ensure that it has considered and satisfies the four Licensing Objectives.

Emergency Situation Considerations

Site staff have multiple methods of communication with Parklife management via mobile device (voice, data, messaging) and there is also live CCTV that can be accessed remotely by Parklife management to assist with any emergency situations.

A Fire Risk Assessment and Management Plan has been completed for the Tea House including a site plan, this is available from Parklife.



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

Dear Maria,

I would like to raise my concerns about the above application for the Tea Rooms in Bishops Park. The Park is covered by a Deed of Covenant issued by the Church Commissions which covers appropriate use of the park.

Granting a permanent Alcohol License to these premises is not in keeping with the park. It's close proximity to residential flats in Bishops Mansions and Stevenage Road is only approximately 45 meters away. The premises are in front of the children's playground which is less than ideal. The park is shut and locked at dusk and is a Grade II Listed Park, unlike the commons that the applicants other premises are in. This is a historic park which the Department should be aware does not have the activities or events that are a feature of parks/commons in the borough due to this Deed and the prior License application in 2007.

It might be useful to view the Premises License that the Council applied for in 2007 covered by: 2007/04070/LAPR and various emails about the hours and activities that would be allowed in the park under the Deed of Covenant, for guidance. One off licenses have generally been approved for events such at The Boat Race and Guy Fawkes Night which are a feature of the park, but a permanent license for a 'tea room' is going to set a precedent which will change the ambiance of this lovely quiet park.

The Ecclesiastical connection is why there are few premises selling alcohol in this part of the ward but their are still a number that are within walking distance, including the bars/cafes in the redevelopment of Fulham Football Club, where more patrons will exit into Bishops Park.

The idea of selling alcohol to patrons before large Council or other large non football events, that are included as part of the recent Fulham Football Club application, is likely to cause increased disturbance to residents and increase rubbish in a park. I am already hearing comments of being that the park is "not well maintained". I would hope that any increase in rubbish etc and its removal is not covered by the Section 106 Funds from FFC 's application as this is not what it was meant for.

The hours of operation 9.00 a.m. - 23.00 p.m. will impact on the amenity of the local residents by increasing the noise levels where currently, this is not an issue. The idea of events being held at night in the Tea Room which can feature amplified music is not in keeping with the park and its quiet residential surrounds. This is a Victorian Park that currently has sufficient issues with anti social behaviour from youths accessing the park when it is closed dealing drugs and drinking. I notice there is no detailed plan submitted to deal with noise or the exit of dinners/patrons from the venues. Doorman can not stop the escaping of noise or light spillage which will be exacerbated when doors or windows are left open.

It also looks from the plans that areas on either side of the tea rooms will become as it were an extension of the actual premises, this too sets a precedent. The Council is the custodian of Bishops Park on behalf of the residents of Hammersmith & Fulham, it is the peoples park and provides open space for various activities that residents and parks users avail themselves.

The park is also the home to various birds, foxes and other animals and a change in their environment will impact on their habitat. What measure have been proposed to address this issue?

If Licensing is minded to grant this License then I would like to suggest some Conditions that should be attached:

Hours of operation 9.00 a.m. - 6.00 p.m. and 9.00 p.m. (Summer)

No alcohol to be sold without a meal

Sales of alcohol be restricted to wines (under ABV 14%), craft beers, Prosecco and champagne but excluding spirits.

No amplified music

Approved method and route for patrons to exit the park

Mainencance plan to clear and dispose of refuse including bottles from the extended premises

Contact details for 'night' manger in the event of noise and nuisance

Review of the application involving the Police at the end of the first year of operation

I'm sending you my objection to the Tea Rooms alcohol license application in Bishops Park, as I'm not convinced my submission via the Council consultation pages went through! It probably did, but just in case...

I do not support this licencing application as described. My concern is that it is too loose in defining what's permissible, and does not recognise nor respect the current closing times and management of the Park. I am also concerned the applicant(s) has not demonstrated an awareness and appreciation of the essence of Bishops Park, it's residential setting, historic affiliation with the Fulham Palace (and status as temperance land) or its peaceful character.

I am also concerned about the immediate proximity of a young children's play area, making the path between the Tea Rooms and the play area entrance busy with young children, parents and carers much of the time. The introduction of an alcohol point of sale would change the dynamic and in my view introduce considerable risk.

In consultation with many local residents and Park users, I ask that:

- 1: Alcohol sales are restricted on on-premises sales only.
- 2: Alcohol for sale is restricted to "craft beer and wine" only, as described at other Roots and Berries establishments.
- 3: Spirits, keg / draft beer, fortified wine, liquors or alcopops should not be sold.
- 4: Alcohol sold on-premises must only be sold with food (alcohol should not be sold on its own without food)
- 5: No alcohol should be sold at all on FFC match days
- 6: Hours of on-premises sale are restricted by the managed locking of the Park by the Parks Police.
- 7: Any license awarded to be subject to annual review and assessment of complaints received, and report from local community representatives (including local elected councilors) with an option for the license to be withdrawn.

I am writing on behalf of the Fulham Society, the largest local amenity Society with some 600+ members, to object to the application for a premises' license that has been submitted by Parklife Trading Ltd to sell alcohol at the Park Cafe, on the grounds that it will cause a public nuisance, increase the incidence of crime and disorder, endanger public safety and possibly cause harm to children.

The Park Cafe is located in the busiest area of the park, directly adjacent to the small children's play area with the nearest play equipment being approximately 15 metres away. The cafe is also some 30 metres away from the central play area, which is used for a wide variety of play and sports activities by children and young people. The path directly in front of the Park Cafe is the busiest walkway in the park and is often crowded with people walking through and around the park.

We consider that introducing alcohol into this environment is totally inappropriate, especially if it became a licensed venue that could be hired out for parties and celebrations during the day and night, especially during the summer months when the park is well used by the public late into the evenings. This area of the park was specifically designed by to be a safe space for young children to play in, so turning the Park cafe into a licensed premises for private and public consumption of alcohol indoors and outdoors would significantly increase the risk of harm to children in their own designated play area.

We note that the applicants have said that they would mitigate harm to children by making sure that any child that visits the cafe is accompanied by an adult. Does this mean that teenage children in the park without their parents would not be able to buy an ice cream or drink in the summer? This is nonsense.

The Park Cafe has outdoor seating areas at the back as well as the front of the building and music and noise will carry down Bishops Park Road. Over the years many Bishops Mansions residents have called the police because 3 or 4 loud and or drunk young people have jumped over the fence and are making noise in the park. The parks police have done an excellent job in attending in these instances. The idea therefore that the local authority would now give a licence for any number of guests to sit outside the park cafe drinking, partying and socializing until 11pm at night in this residential location would be completely nonsensical.

It is reasonable to assume that attendees leaving licensed events at the Park Cafe at 11pm at night will be at their most inebriated and voluble as they exit the park into the local vicinity. Security staff

will not be accompanying these people down the public roads e.g. Stevenage road, Bishops Park Road and Bishops Avenue. These staff will be closing the facility and going home leaving many people who are potentially drunk to hang around the edge of the park, possibly in the park if they have wandered away from the party area. The risk of crime and disorder would be significantly increased. The threat to public safety for night time walkers, dog walkers and joggers, often out on their own around the park perimeter, would be greatly increased.

I am writing as a concerned local resident, a regular park user and as the chairman of Bishops Mansions Ltd. We are the residents' association of the 148 flats that are directly adjacent to and overlook Bishops Park.

I want to object to the application for a premises' license that has been submitted by Parklife Trading Ltd to sell alcohol at the Park Cafe, hereto referred to as the Tea Rooms in Bishops Park on the grounds that it will cause a public nuisance, increase the incidence of crime and disorder, endanger public safety and cause harm to children.

The applicants have applied to sell alcohol in the Park Cafe from 8am to 5pm Monday to Friday and 9am to 5pm on Saturday and Sunday to members of the public, save for match days. The applicants have also applied to sell / serve alcohol to guests attending events at the 'Venue' from 9am to 11pm. Monday to Sunday.

Granting a premises licence to the applicants would turn the park cafe into a licensed premises with a bar that can market itself as a venue to be hired out for parties and events as well as encourage members of the public who want to drink alcohol to visit the premises. The applicants have requested that they can serve alcohol outside as well as inside. Typically, this might involve portable outdoor beer taps/counters, wine and cocktail stations etc.

Impact within the Park:

The Park Cafe is located in the busiest area of the park, directly adjacent to the small children's play area with the nearest play equipment being approximately 15 meters away. The cafe is also some 30 meters away from the central play space in Bishops Park, which is used for skateboarding, basketball, outdoor gym equipment, table tennis, children learning to ride bikes and lots of other play and sports activities.

The path directly in front of the park cafe is the busiest walkway in the park and is often crowded with park users walking, cycling, running, skate boarding, roller blading and parents congregating with prams and young children.

Introducing alcohol into this environment for members of the public to day drink from 9am to 5pm is totally inappropriate. It would similarly be inappropriate and unnecessary to create a licensed venue that can be hired out for parties and celebrations during the day and night in this location primarily populated by 2-15 year old's and their parents. For example, an event with music and alcohol from 5pm to 11pm, where guests were quite reasonably expecting to drink and party, play music, both inside and outside would inevitably disturb/cause nuisance to other park users who are engaged in play and exercise very close by. It would also unacceptably impact on the

public safety and increase the occurrence of anti-social behaviour and crime/damage.

It is important to remember that the park is in a conservation area and is used for play, peaceful river walks, exercise and leisure until 9.30pm during the summer months. Turning the park cafe into a licensed venue would have a negative impact on the character and atmosphere of this historic park in this unique location.

Furthermore, playing music, partying and drinking alcohol at licensed venues is available in so many locations in Fulham and there is no sense whatsoever that granting an alcohol license in this location would be fulfilling any public need or creating a useful location amenity, in fact the very opposite would be the case.

Licensing the park cafe would also would also significantly impact on public safety in this crowded location. Mixing potentially large numbers of people drinking and partying outdoors with joggers cyclists, skateboarders would create a safety hazard.

This area of the park was specifically designed by the borough architect to be a safe space for young children to play in, (I was on the stakeholder group for the heritage lottery fund bid for the park), so turning the park cafe into a licensed premises for private and public consumption of alcohol indoors and outdoors significantly increases the risk of harm to children in their own designated play area. The idea that these children would be on the swings or the slide or the train right next to a licensed venue where private parties are taking place and adults would be drinking, being loud, wandering into the play area etc. would seem non sensical and a failure to protect these most vulnerable park users.

I note that the applicants have said that they would mitigate harm to children by making sure that any child that visits the cafe is accompanied by an adult. This is totally impractical. Is it being suggested that a 12 year old child who may not be in the park with their parent is not going to be able to buy an ice cream or a drink, or that all the skateboarders, basketball players and older children using play equipment can longer go to the cafe? If the local authority approves this license with this stipulation, then it will either be ignored from day 1 which will endanger children and if it is adhered to it will prevent children, particularly 10 to 15 year olds, from accessing the park cafe situated in the middle of a children's play area. This would be unfair to children and totally wrong.

Granting this license would also allow the applicants to sell alcohol to members of the public 7 days a week. As we all know during the spring and summer the park is crowded all day and evening with many park users spending significant periods of time in the park – sand and water play, picnicking, sunbathing exercising, cycling etc. As well as turning the park cafe into a sit down, indoor and outdoor drinking venue, granting this licence would also allow the applicants to sell alcohol from an indoor bar and or outdoor

mobile beer and wine stations to members of the public for consumption in the wider park.

Introducing the sale of alcohol into this environment would certainly increase the incidence of drunk people, particularly in the younger drinking age group (18-30) throughout the whole of Bishops Park. Whilst the applicants might be able to make good profits from this activity, I cannot see how the local authority would see this as a desirable or a progressive move. Granting this licence and introducing instant access to alcohol in the middle of this diverse park user community will cause a public nuisance, increase the incidence of crime and disorder, endanger public safety, promote antisocial behaviour and potentially harm children.

Impact in the vicinity of the park;

The park cafe is situated 75 metres from the nearest residential dwellings which are Bishops Mansions apartments. These apartments have balconies and living and sleeping spaces that overlook the park and approximately 40 of the 148 apartments directly overlook the area of the park where the park cafe, bowling green and club house are situated.

Granting this licence and creating a venue for private hire, for parities and events indoors and outdoors would cause a totally unacceptable noise nuisance for local residents until late at night.

I note that the applicants have said that the no amplified music is to be heard outside the premises. I am afraid that this statement is at best naïve and at worst disingenuous. I live in one of the apartments overlooking the park cafe area and the river. We are able to hear the words of songs being played at licensed weekend events at the boat houses on the other side of the river which are 400 meters away. We also clearly hear the noise of people socializing and drinking outside at these events.

Any amplified music being played in the park cafe would be very clearly audible to many residents in Bishops Mansions in their homes, even if every door and window was closed at an event. The reality of course is that doors and windows will be open during events and people will be moving from indoor and outdoor seating, to and from the bar, potentially dancing, especially in the spring and summer months. The park cafe has an outdoor seating area at the back as well as the front of the building and music noise will carry right the way down Bishops Park Road.

Down the years many Bishops Mansions residents have called the police because 3 or 4 loud and or drunk young people have jumped over the fence and are making noise in the park. The parks police have done an excellent job in attending in these instances. The idea therefore that the local authority would now give a licence for any number of guests to sit outside the front and back of the park cafe drinking, partying and socializing until 11pm at night in this residential location would be completely nonsensical.

Allowing amplified music and outdoor socializing/ partying with alcohol in this location 7 days a week until 11pm at night would therefore cause a significant noise nuisance and ignore the rights of local resident to peaceful enjoyment of their own homes. It would affect their ability to open windows and balcony doors, sit on their balconies, watch TV and go to sleep on school/ work nights as well as weekends. To be clear, the staging of a well-managed licensed event in the park cafe would cause an unacceptable nuisance to local residents specifically because it is a totally unsuitable location to hold such an event.

I note that the applicants have talked about staff training, CCTV and managing dispersal of groups following events. Event guests and party goers will naturally spread out into the wider park, particularly the central play area, children play area, river walk and duck pond. There is no structural way of fencing or meaningfully segregating off the cafe for an event save for the usual bar barriers that will be stepped past easily. There is a hammock style children's swing right next to the park cafe which would be an irresistible draw to party goers, who are drinking after the park has closed at night!

These events therefore will still cause a significant nuisance, promote criminal damage and disorder and disturb local residents in their homes very close to the park at night when the park would normally be closed.

It is reasonable to assume that attendees leaving licensed events at the Park Cafe at 11pm at night will be at their most inebriated and voluble as they exit the park into the local vicinity. Security staff will not be accompanying these people down public roads e.g. Stevenage road, Bishops Park Road and Bishops Avenue.

These staff will be closing the facility and going home leaving many people who are potentially drunk to hang around the edge of the park, the tennis courts and the allotment as well as walk past Bishops Mansions apartments, with front gardens, balconies, living rooms and bedrooms just feet away.

Park benches down Bishops Avenue will be perfect spaces for attendees to carry on socialising and the walkway that splits the tennis courts will also be used.

The public nuisance would be inevitable and immediate and not adequately mitigated. The risk of crime and disorder would be significantly increased and not adequately mitigated. The threat to public safety for night time walkers, dog walkers and joggers, often out on their own around the park perimeter, would be greatly increased and not adequately mitigated against. Preventing children being able to sleep, particularly on school nights would cause harm to children, which has not adequately been mitigated against.

In my view and the view of many others I have spoken to this week, the reason that these four licensing objectives have not been adequately mitigated against by the applicants, both inside the park and its immediate

vicinity, is because it is simply not possible to do so as this is a totally unsuitable location for a licensed premises and event venue.

I sincerely hope that the licensing committee will agree and not grant this licence application and thereby protect the rights and the safety of the vast majority of park users and local residents in this instance.

Correspondence to the Parks and Leisure Department pertaining to our objection as a residents' group to this application.

Dear Stephen,

Thanks for your email. I'm afraid its content and approach left me very concerned and with a worrying sense of déjà vu.

The tenants or private contractors of a facility in any publicly owned space would rarely bother to submit serious plans and applications for something new without the support or acquiescence of the managers of that space, who in the case of Bishops Park are the Parks and Leisure Department of LBHF.

The last time your team negotiated with a private company, who were tenants and managers of a public facility in Bishops Park, the results were disastrous. In that case, your team were cajoled and misled into allowing a private company to construct three padel tennis courts, gain sponsorship for these courts and bank the profits with no planning consent given or applied for and without any public consultation.

The private company in that instance were very quick to tell your team that padel tennis worked in other London parks with 'no issues'. Your team seemed to accept this at face value. As the managers of Bishops Park, the question that your department should have considered in the first instance was this; would playing padel tennis in Bishops Park, a narrow and relatively small park with residential dwellings directly adjacent, cause an issue, not did playing padel tennis in Hyde Park cause no issues?

As the managers of Bishops Park, the Parks and Leisure Department apparently made no assessment as to the specific suitability of this park for this activity, and did not intervene when padel courts were erected and became operational. Local residents were subjected to an unacceptable and completely predictable noise nuisance in their homes for a year and a half and a portion of the public tennis amenity just disappeared.

Despite dealing with the padel company throughout, it was not your department as managers of Bishops Park, that eventually reported the company to the planning department for erecting a structure with no planning permission. It was however your department that, despite the obvious nuisance being caused to local residents, joined the padel company in staging an opening ceremony for the 'London Padel Centre' in Bishops Park and invited unwitting elected borough officials to cut the ribbon.

It was a local resident whose daily life at home had been badly impacted that reported the company to the planning department. The planning department and then elected officials from the current administration on the planning committee were left to turn things around and protect local residents.

In this new planning application, you have noted that you are aware that the 'operator has two licenced cafes in Wandsworth Parks i.e. the Sky Lark Café on Wandsworth Common, and the Rookery Café on Stretton Common with no issues'.

Have your team looked at those other cafes in any detail? Wandsworth Common is over 5 times bigger than Bishops Park and Streatham Common is over 4 times bigger than Bishops Park. The two cafes that you mention that have 'no issues', are much further away from young children's play equipment than is the case in Bishops Park, are nowhere near as

close to residential dwellings as the case in Bishops Park, and are on open public commons, with both café's closing at 5pm.

Whilst the company may be the same, this application covers a completely different location and environs, and of course goes so much further than introducing the sale of alcohol into a park cafe during the day (which many people believe would have a different impact in this location). As a result of discussions with your team, the applicants have thought it appropriate and sensible to apply to extend the license to turn the park café into a venue for private hire for events and parties until 11pm at night, 7 days a week with indoor and outdoor seating, drinking alcohol and amplified music.

You have stated, 'it will up to the licencing committee to consider any objections'. This is obviously the case, but it is not the point. This is about the Parks Department's assessment of the application as the managers of Bishops Park, i.e. the department's written comments that will form part of the documentation for the licensing committee to consider and concerned parties to view and read.

Your department cannot be allowed to do what it did with regard to the padel courts, which was to be approached by a private business and then simply go along with their ideas to increase profit, abdicating your responsibility as park managers to properly assess the impact of an activity on park users in Bishops Park and local residents in the immediate vicinity of Bishops Park.

It is your team, along with the police and noise and nuisance departments, that are required to comment on the application in a considered and detailed manner as part of the licensing process. The idea that the Parks Department would comment on this application in a generic or brief way would be totally wrong and the victims would be local residents and park users.

Comparing to and conflating a situation where cafes close at 5pm in other boroughs on public commons, with a cafe in a historic gated park in a conservation area, surrounded by residential dwellings, hired out as a party venue until late at night would be totally unacceptable. Furthermore, to omit to comment on the issues that this application obviously raises would, I believe, be a negation of the duty of care of the managers of Bishops Park to adequately and professionally respond in this instance.

In light of the above and as the managers of Bishops Park, I would ask your department to consider the following when formulating your comments to the licencing committee about this application.

The planning consent objection that I have forwarded to you. Whilst taking into account the applicant's attempt to meet the four licencing objectives, this objection details the main issues that many local residents and park users are very concerned and angry about.

The Licensing officer in charge of this application has confirmed that they have received a lot of resident-representations which due to the big number are going to be acknowledged in bulk. As you say, these representations will be considered by the licensing committee. In formulating their own comments to the licencing committee, can the Parks Department, as managers of Bishops Park, stop and think about why so many people, not just Bishops Mansions residents have taken the time and energy to say that this wrong for Bishops Park?

As managers and custodians of Bishops Park, can your team comment on how hiring out the park cafe as a private venue will impact upon the covenants under which the park was given to the residents of the borough?

As the managers of Bishops Park, can your team think about whose interests are being served and what needs are being anticipated by turning the park cafe into a private night

time event venue? It is not any group of park users, it is not any local residents, and it is not any borough residents, who can access night time licensed venues for private hire, that are far more suitably located, throughout the whole borough. It does of course serve the interests of a private company and their need to drive revenue and increase profits. To be honest, many local residents can't think of a more inappropriate location for a licensed late night party venue than the park cafe in Bishops Park.

Before commenting on this application as the managers of Bishops Park, I would encourage you or a member of your team, to go to the park cafe and stand in the back seating area and look at the nearby mansion flats on Bishops Park Road and stand in the large outdoor seating space between the park cafe and the public toilets at the front of the building and look at the nearby mansion flats and houses on Stevenage Road. Envisage a night time event with guests sitting outside, socialising drinking and partying and amplified music being played inside, with windows open and doors opening and closing constantly, until 11pm at night on work/school nights as well as weekends. How could a venue like this, however well run, be anything but a public nuisance in this specific location? It would immediately and unacceptably affect the ability of local residents to open windows and balcony doors, sit on their balconies, watch TV and go to sleep on school/ work nights as well as weekends. Then also imagine the aftermath as guests leave the park into local streets. Do the managers of Bishops Park really want to inflict that on their neighbours and if so why and in the service of what?

I sincerely hope that the comments that the Parks and Leisure department submit to the licensing committee on this application are thoughtful, comprehensive and appropriate and as such may go some way to restoring the confidence of many people in this part of the borough who have become understandably disillusioned with your department's apparent lack of thought and care about how local residents' lives could be adversely affected when considering new initiatives in Bishops Park.

Dear Steve.

The licensing department have now written to all 165 objectors with details of amendments to the above application including the parks departments comments that they are now content with the application, subject to police amendments and the lease.

I received an email from you on Friday February 4th saying that, 'I can confirm I have spoken to the applicant and he is revising his application to exclude evening events' As I said in my email of the same day, there is a confusion here about private events and your contractor applying for a premises licence.

I also note that alcohol is still proposed to be served until 8pm at night in the spring and summer months.

I am still waiting to hear from you with the answer to the following questions.

1. Could you please confirm whether your department has given or intends to give any permission to the contractors to hire out the park café for private events in the day or night?

I am sure that you are aware as landlords on the lease with this contractor and the managers of Bishops Park that one of the covenants which LBHF (The Vestry), are bound by with regard to the use of the park clearly states,

'That the said hereditaments and premises hereby conveyed and every part thereof shall at all times hereafter be appropriated kept and maintained by the Vestry then successors and assigns as an open space for perpetual use thereof by the Public for exercise and recreation and shall not at any time or times be appropriated converted or used or permitted or suffered to be permitted appropriated converted or used for any other purposes or purposes whatsoever.'

It would therefore be a prima facie breech of these covenants to allow private hire of the park cafe in Bishops Park at any time of the day or night.

The licencing committee need confirmation of this if any mention about events still remains in the application. Furthermore, even if there is no such mention of events left in the application, confirmation of this covenant still needs to be given by the parks department to the licensing committee, with regard to any future temporary event licences that the applicant may try to apply for, that would also be discussed at the forthcoming hearing - Temporary Event Licences only go the police and noise nuisance for comment, and not back to the licensing committee if a licence is already in place for a premises.

Therefore, in this case the licensing committee would need to know from the parks department whether there was anything that prevented the applicants from applying for a temporary event licence, for a private event, in the future, which in this case there clearly is, before the hearing stage. This is particularly relevant if the committee are being asked by any objectors to make the exclusion of any such applications a condition of the granting of a premises licence, which in this case I can confirm they will be. This is a very important procedural point.

This direction about private hire, from the managers of the park, therefore needs to be part of 'fit for purpose' comments that the parks department provide to the licensing committee as part of the statutory consultation process in this case.

2. Can you please confirm if your department has given or intends to give permission to the contractors to play amplified music at the park cafe in Bishops Park.

I'm sure that you are aware as landlords on the lease with this contractor and the managers of Bishops Park, that one of the covenants which LBHF (The Vestry) are bound by with regard to the use of the park clearly states,

'That the Vestry successors and assigns shall not do or suffer to be done to any part of the said hereditaments and premises hereby conveyed any act deed matter or thing which may be or tend to the nuisance damage annoyance or disturbance of the Commissioners their successors or assigns or the owners or occupiers of any property in the neighbourhood.'

This covenant is an even lower threshold for challenge than noise nuisance legislation.

If the applicant is still requesting permission to play amplified music at any time of the day or night as part of their application, then the parks department need to communicate the terms of this covenant as part of a 'fit for purpose' response to the licensing committee in the statutory consultation process in this case.

3. Could you also please confirm that the sale of alcohol in this location does not breach of any of the covenants in place in this part of the park.

We believe that additional covenants that relate to West Meadow, where the park cafe is situated, may specifically prevent the sale/consumption of alcohol (we have not yet had sight of these particular covenants).

Again, confirming whether or not this application can be considered by the licensing department from the point of view of any alcohol prohibition covenants in this part of Bishops Park, must form part of a 'fit for purpose' response to the licensing committee from the parks department in the statutory consultation process in this case.

Failing to advise the licensing committee on these 3 points, so that such advice can be included in the hearing papers, even more so as they have now been specifically raised, would in our view constitute a failure in your departments duty of care to comment appropriately and professionally on this premises licence application.



Dear Steve/Simon

I know you are waiting to hear from legal colleagues regarding the email below. I am writing with regard to my question 2.

2. Can you please confirm if your department has given or intends to give permission to the contractors to play amplified music at the park cafe in Bishops Park?

I am now aware that a number of changes have been made to the Licensing Act 2003 resulting from new legislation being implemented, namely the Live Music Act 2012, Licensing Act 2003 Entertainment Amendment Order 2013.

This legislation now means that if a premises licence is granted to the Park Cafe, that the current contractors and indeed any future contractors who may inherit the lease, will have the automatic right to play amplified live music and recorded music, potentially up to 11pm at night, 7 days a week, with no further consent being needed.

Question two therefore becomes,

2. Can you please confirm why the Parks Department/LBHF do not believe that playing amplified live and recorded music at the park cafe, (which would automatically be part of the granting of a premises licence), is a breech of the below covenant.

'That the Vestry successors and assigns shall not do or suffer to be done to any part of the said hereditaments and premises hereby conveyed any act deed matter or thing which may be or tend to the nuisance damage annoyance or disturbance of the Commissioners their successors or assigns or the owners or occupiers of any property in the neighbourhood.'

As I have said in previous correspondence,

- The park cafe is situated 75 metres from the nearest residential dwellings which are Bishops Mansions apartments. These apartments have balconies and living and sleeping spaces that overlook the park and approximately 40 of the 148 apartments directly overlook the area of the park where the park cafe, bowling green and club house are situated.
- I note that in their application the contractors have said that the no amplified music is to be heard outside the premises. I am afraid that this statement is at best naïve and at worst disingenuous. I live in one of the apartments overlooking the park cafe area and the river. We are able to hear the amplified music very clearly at weekend events at the boat houses on the other side of the river, which are 400 meters - over 4 times further away than the park cafe.
- Any amplified music being played in the park cafe would therefore be very clearly audible to many residents in Bishops Mansions and on Stevenage Road and some of Cloncurry, Doneraile and Ellerby streets, in their homes, even if every door and window was closed at the Park Cafe. The reality of course is that doors, including the big bi-fold doors, and windows will be open and people will be moving from indoor and outdoor seating, especially in the summer months.

- There is no way therefore that playing amplified live and recorded music would not be heard outside the premises and would definitely cause <u>nuisance damage annoyance or disturbance....</u> of the owners or occupiers ofproperty in the neighbourhood.
- Furthermore, if the contractors continue to try to apply for private event hire and/or Temporary Event Licenses, in an attempt to turn the Park Cafe in Bishops Park into a licensed event venue, then the <u>nuisance damage annoyance or disturbance.... of the owners or occupiers ofproperty in the neighbourhood'</u> would be greatly increased.

The reality of amplified live and recorded music being automatically bolted on to the granting of a premises licence is yet further evidence that the park cafe in Bishops Park is not a suitable location for a licensed premises, with specific reference to the parks covenants and the close proximity of residential dwellings.

Firstly there would be a major public safety risk from the increased use of alcohol in this busy area of the park. The cafe is on a busy path shared by walkers, cyclists, skateboarders and the like.

Secondly the park is usually closed after dark but this application proposes allowing the park to be open for evening events up to 11pm. It is difficult to see how this will not lead to more crime in the park and the surrounding area. Not only will it increase the risk of vandalism which has been an after dark problem for the park in the past, it opens up a huge dark secluded space where robberies and other crimes of violence might occur. The current lighting in the park is totally insufficient for public safety after dark and the police do not need to patrol a closed park. Is the council going to provide funds to enhance the lighting and provide greater police presence?

Thirdly the proximity of the children's play area to the cafe selling alcohol seems most inappropriate. I am surprised the covenant put in place when the church gifted the park for public use does not prevent this mixing of alcohol and children. I also think it is most unfair that the solution to keeping the

children away from the alcohol is to prevent unaccompanied children going into the cafe to buy a soft drink or an ice cream.

Fourthly, as a local resident I am concerned about the public nuisance this proposal could cause. Loud music, people meandering round our quiet streets late at night when inebriated, an increase night traffic and litter are I suspect just some of the likely issues.

I'm objecting to the giving of a premises license to the cafe in Bishops Park. The cafe is situated within a few metres of the children's play area and is about 50 metres from local residents' dwellings on Bishops Road and Stevenage Road. The park is a gated park and I cannot see how a licensed venue can be made to operate safely and without disturbance to park users and local residents.

The temporary structure next to Fulham Palace is an example of a venue that is a lot further away from dwellings, and is in an area with controlled access. Why is there a need for another venue so close by? The park cafe is right in the middle of the most-used part of Bishops Park, in particular by children of various ages. It's just not suitable for the purpose of being a licensed and/or a hired out venue in terms of noise, public access, and loss of amenity to other users.

The park is for day use. It is not a common. The gates are shut at dusk. The covenant governing the use of the park for residents of the borough is not met by a licensed venue in this location.

Any local resident will be able to describe the noise that already comes, with absolute inevitability, from a licensed venue such as the temporary structure in Fulham Place. Another example is the noise from night time opening hours at bars in the boat clubs on the riverside in Putney which can clearly be heard by local residents this side of the river.

I have been trying to place an objection along with my comments on your website about this above application but try as I might it keeps saying that there is an error on the system and I can't get it to go through. Can you help me with this please or can you you log this objection for me? I would like to object and place these comments as a neighbour:

Whilst I welcome the much needed refurbishment of this local cafe I cannot see the need for the serving of alcohol during the day let alone into the night at this location. It will turn what should be a quiet, friendly local meeting place into a daytime drinking location as well as a private venue with amplified music where clientele could stay drinking both in and outside until 11pm. It is totally inappropriate for this location and will hugely negatively impact us as residents of the immediate local area as well as the wider community of park users. Amplified music in the park should not be a regular occurrence and would seriously impact residents close to the cafe especially as it has a large outdoor seating area. If attendees leave licenced events at this venue around 11pm, many possibly inebriated, there is a strong likelihood that they will be very audible to local residents with the potential to linger socialising on the edge of the park near to residences trying to sleep - many of these with young children who will have school the next day. There would also be an increased risk of crime and disorder along with a threat to public safely for night time walkers, dog walkers and joggers.

The area of the park in which the cafe is situated is designed to be a safe space for young children being directly next to the childrens playground and is the busiest part of the park. Allowing the licensing would significantly increase the risk of harm to children in this designation play area. It would also increase the risk of drunken individuals throughout the park along with the public nuisance that would go hand and hand with this; endangering public safety particularly that of children and other vulnerable persons wishing to enjoy the park for their own wide ranging reasons.

Turning the cafe into a licenced venue would be totally inappropriate for Bishops park and would have a hugely negative impact on the character and atmosphere of this historic park. It is in a conservation area and is used for play, exercise and much needed peace in nature for many who do not have their own quiet outside spaces and today more than ever this is much needed for mental health reasons alone. An alcohol licence here is not fulfilling any public need let alone creating a useful local amenity and would in fact be creating quite the opposite. There are plenty of public houses, bars and restaurants in the nearby neighbourhood that provide such a provision in much more suitable and less residential areas.

For all the above reasons I do not approve the granting of this licence.

The Bishop's Park area benefits from being reasonably 'pub' free - a legacy of the Bishop of London's days I understand. This means that the area rarely suffers from raucous drinkers and their associated behaviour. Even on football days the fans disperse quickly as there is little to cause them to hang around and drink alcohol either in celebration or commiseration.

The park itself is heavily used by children and families, who themselves have no need to take recourse to alcohol. Other adult users are frequently passing through, on foot, running or on bikes. Then there are the dog owners simply exercising their dogs. It feels like a safe area where there is little to no abuse and no need for alcohol.

One can drink pretty well all over the borough. Bishops Park is one of the few oases where one can escape avoid drink and the behaviours and litter it entails and refresh oneself in a pleasant place. Please keep it that way.

Let us be clear: there is nothing to stop alcohol coming into the park at present. In the summer people bring bottles for picnics on the grass during the day. They almost always take their rubbish home with them. In the summer evenings, they bring bottles of wine, beer and spirits - sometimes in surprising quantities - along with their takeaways. The evening crowd obligingly leave the evidence for everyone to discover in the morning.

- our family friendly cafe will be turned into a licensed bar within feet of what is currently a well used amenities for children of all ages, families and local people who enjoy the company of their neighbours in a peaceful, attractive park, making it no longer a safe place for children to play and rendering the excellent facilities of the children's play area redundant as adults will not wish their children to be in such an environment

I live at Bishop's Mansions, SW6 6DX. I have tried to submit online my objection to the above application for an alcohol license, but your website has a technical problem - hence my email.

Please consider my objection and the following comments:

This application for an alcohol licence is undesirable and inappropriate for this location and neighborhood. It should be rejected for four main reasons, all of which contravene important policies of LBHF itself in the following areas: avoidance of public nuisance, maintenance public safety, prevention of crime and disorder, and protection of children.

i. Public nuisance. The intended extended use of this family-friendly cafe as a place for alcohol-fuelled parties and other events, with or without loud music, will cause unavoidable nuisance within a residential area which has hitherto been peaceful and pleasant for more than 100 years. The cafe is very close to Bishop's Mansions, especially flats (one of which is ours) and even spoken sounds, especially at night, in Bishop's Park Road and in the park itself near the gate serving the bowling green, children's play areas and the applicant's adjacent cafe. In spite of claims to the contrary, music and other party noises cannot be baffled, even when indoors, because windows and doors will certainly often (and ecessarily) be opened. ii. Public safety. The potential 'nuisance' could also affect 'safety' through the fear or threat of danger, imagined or real, for residents and visitors walking through this much used area for recreation, exercise or getting to the tube station. when people (maybe worse off for drink or otherwise in high spirits), singly or in groups, are obviously hanging around or heading home with little likelihood of doing so quietly. Bottles and glasses - empty, half-full or broken - are likely to be left lying around and represent a danger of injury or other harm to the public in all age-groups.

iii. Crime and disorder. This partly overlaps with the above. Additionally there have been a number of incidents in our block, maybe ten in the past year, of opportunistic robberies and thefts by people loitering with intent, If the cafe were to serve alcohol and host events in the evenings, we as residents face a genuine threat of increased criminal activity and disorderly behaviour. This would also extend to possibly more frequent damage to the vehicles of residents and visitors parked nearby.

iv. Child protection. The cafe is situated next to play areas provided for the safe enjoyment of small children, larger children and older young people. This is a family park - the cafe is a currently a family-friendly facility. Children would be placed in greater danger if this licence were to be granted.

My objections are based on the following:

Public Nuisance. Increased noise affecting local residents. The noise will be amplified and able to travel further based on the open layout of the area around the venue itself. Events will inevitably spill outside with crowd noise until late in the evening and post-closing of events. Additional noise will likely occur as attendees disperse thought the local residential roads, likely in some level of intoxication, creating higher volumes of conversation and activity. There will be no requirement for the event organisers to disperse these people once they are outside the immediate vicinity of the venue.

Prevention of Crime and Disorder. There is a very significant potential for levels of crime and disorder to increase. This will be exacerbated by concentrating groups of individuals into a late night location, with little in the way of members of the public or policing to prevent potential contraventions. There is also the increased possibility of harassment and confrontation with local residents who are either using the areas around the venue or reasonably asking attendees to leave the venue quietly. There is also the risk that, should the park itself be opened to allow the venue to operate after normal park closing hours, attendees will move to other parts of the park and commit antisocial or illegal acts under cover of darkness.

Protection of Children. As well as the above potential issues highlighted in regard to the safety of local residents, there is the potential risk to other users of the park at other times. There are obvious areas that are used by children. With the proximity of the venue to children play areas there is a significantly increased risk that items discarded by attendees at the venue may end up in the childrens areas (broken glass, cigarette ends, vomit etc) and thereby render these areas unusable until cleaned.

Public safety. As well as the aforementioned risks to the childrens area, items discarded or areas vandalised by venue attendees would cause increased issues to users of the park during the daytime, especially as the usual policing and dissuasion that members of the public provide during the daytime to vandalisation and anti-social behaviour would not be in existence in the evenings.

These are my objections to the granting of this proposed licence. The venue, in my opinion, was never built or designed in anticipation of what this licence is putting forward for approval.

With reference to the above I wish to raise the following objections in the strongest possible terms.

The public nuisance is unavoidable. People of any age get drunk with the resulting lack of control, particularly on hot summer nights. There is no specific police presence in the park but it will be necessary causing more pressure on our already overstretched force. Public nuisance will inevitably occur as people leave the park & neighbouring roads will not be respected in terms of litter/ front gardens used as toilets/ noise/ applified music & general disruptive & agressive behaviour as a result of drink.

(The area is adequately served by pubs or wine bars an acceptable distance from the Park & particularly across Putney Bridge where there are numerous well established venues if people want to drink)

<u>Public safely</u> is of major concern. Many young children use the Council facilities provided by the Council until late in the evening at all times of year. Vulnerable teenagers use the skate boarding rink to work off their energy putting them at risk from less desirable elements of society & both young & old enjoy a walk by the river, often alone. It is an acknowledged fact that drink & drugs go together, the area will generally become less safe as a result.

(The Park enjoys a reputation as being a tranquil & enjoyable green space but could easily become the opposite. Fulham Palace, a National Heritage, is used for licensed events & would become a less welcoming venue.

<u>Prevention of crime is</u> a major concern, cars are parked in Bishops' Park Road & surrounding streets for business & pleasure, forced locks & break ins would increase & front garden could provide sufficient cover for criminal activities & double doors, particularly in mansion blocks are often not closed properly by deliver drivers. Thus making them more inviting to crime than they are at present.

<u>Protection of children & young people.</u> Drink promotes disorder & aggressive behaviour at all times of day. Young children & teenagers walking home often alone in dark winter afternoons from several adjacent schools become more vunerable. I most strongly OBJECT to Bishops Park Tea Rooms seeking to obtain an after hours alcohol license, (Licensing Application Ref. No. 2022/00010/LAPR), until 23.00pm. Such a license would be a public nuisance, be a hazard to public safety, encourage crime & disorder, & put children at risk. Amplified music would be a feature and cause much disturbance to the neighbouring residents & ambience of the immediate area. Socialising & drunken behaviour would be a major factor long into the night, especially as Park's Security will not be policing this far into the night. There will be loud noise & rowdy socialising/partying for most of the day & well into the night as most of the participants will be inebriated through prolonged alcohol consumption, stumbling out into the nearby roads & very likely causing trouble. The London Borough of Hammersmith & Fulham's Parks section comments as follows on the premises licence application by ParkLife Trading Ltd.

Parks oversees the operation of the Tea House through a lease with the tenant, ParkLife Trading Ltd.

The revised and amended premises licence application conforms with the key lease conditions of use, namely:

If required, the tenant shall apply for any licence required to sell alcohol: We understand that the growing café culture in this country has expanded to parks and green spaces where cafés are operated to meet customer expectations and help support and contribute to making these venues viable and contribute to the wider operation of the park itself. Many London parks have café's and eating establishments which sell alcohol to accompany their food offering. We do not anticipate the Tea House being any different to these other establishments such as just across the river at Putt in the Park in the Grade II listed Wandsworth Park and similar facilities run by ParkLife Company, or those in the Royal Parks run by external contractors.

The property shall close for business no later than thirty (30) minutes before the closing time of Bishops Park: The parks in Hammersmith & Fulham including Bishops' Park close at dusk and are locked by the council's Law Enforcement Team. The annual timetable of closing times is seasonal and differs between winter and summer closing times and we understand the licence application will follow the parks closing times with alcohol served no later than 8pm in the summer earlier in the winter.

The lease also states that there should be no alcohol served on Fulham FC match days: We now understand since the tenant has met with the MET Police's licencing officer that this amendment has been made to revised application.

Providing the tenant's application meets the terms of the lease we are content with the revised premises application.

Dear Donald,

This was raised at our PR SNP meeting on Thursday and concerns were raised about the appropriateness of the application, hours and impact on the local residents. With around 30 residents in attendance, the Council Community Officers, L.E.T. and Met Police the discussion was very open and useful. The hours yes seem to be more in keeping but the fundamental issue is, are the Council able to approve a permanent Premises License at the Tea Rooms which is at odds with the Dead of Covenant that applies to this part of Bishops Park? Whether one agrees with a permanent alcohol license being granted to a business so close to the children's playground or close proximity to residents homes, is irrelevant if as I believe the Covenant excludes this type of use in the park.

Council Officers stated that they were having their legal team look at the Covenant now, since they now have a copy. Very odd since they have one of the only two original copies, the Church Commissioners have the other, it does seem yet again the Council has not done its due diligence with regard the park, as this was always

going to be raised. I have a copy, Marc Medina has a copy as do the Friends of Bishops Park.

There was no comment on how the park was to be cleared after the closure of the tea rooms. This needs to be addressed, and who will be responsible for any anti social behaviour since the L.E.T do not have the powers yet to do anymore than issue FPN for spitting and litter, as approval have not been given.

It is welcome that events will not be allowed as there were no plans provided in the application as on how this would be managed.

There is a way forward but from my understanding it will be approved with some conditions (which I have forwarded in my previous email) but with over 100 objections this is not a welcome addition as it stands. There has also been a Premises License application by FFC to extend their hours to 11.00 p.m. which was lodged around the same time. This does not bode well for local residents in a Conservation Area, we are not a Town Centre where this would be more acceptable.

There is a reason why Palace Riverside has so few licensed premises which is historic and relate it to the land being Church of England land. I would refer the Council yet again to their Premises License Application for Bishops Park in 2007 and notes which should provide background information for those who were not around at the time.

Has anyone taken into account the huge numbers of football fans drinking at the establishment before and/or after attending any given Fulham FC match?

Has no reference to the proximity of the children's playground been mentioned?

I am quite unhappy about the proposal of an 11am to 8pm alcohol licence being granted so close to 1) a children's playground and 2) a football stadium. It does not set a particularly familial tone and seems to put the needs of the few above those of the many.

Again, I wholeheartedly object to this application and hope that you will reconsider granting an alcohol licence 1) from 11am (which is both irresponsible and poses serious dangers to children and the local community) and 2) until 8pm, when most football matches begin and will remain mobbed with football fans for several hours until close.

I would like to caveat the above with letting you know I am not completely against the alcohol licence in its entirety.

A maximum capacity must be maintained to ensure that the area does not become a meeting place for heavy drinking, and a more suitable time frame would be midday until 6pm, which would not only allow responsible drinkers access to a drink during

the day, but also filter out many of the vagrants, football fans and alcoholics from threatening the already fragile environment of beautiful Bishop's Park.

Thank you for your update on the above application. Obviously the amendments proposed mitigate some of the potential issues and therefore the relevance of some details within the four main areas of my objection. There remain, however, some important points which are ambiguous or missing from the new information which you provided and need clarification.

If the licensed activity is to be only available to the paying public and therefore not for private events, the amendments can be seen as a significant improvement on the initial and unacceptable application. Otherwise the proposed new shorter hours of opening/closing, to fit with the normal and seasonally variable opening/closing times for the park itself, may yet leave a loophole through which the applicant may decide to close the cafe to the public early, at say 5pm, and then accommodate a private party or event, with all the related noise and potential nuisance, during the evening in the spring/summer months.

There is no reference to the unwelcome possibility of live or recorded amplified music being played. Were a licence will be granted to serve alcohol, even if strictly as accompaniment to a 'substantial' meal, it would be a necessary condition specifically to prohibit the playing of amplified music on or within the premises. Otherwise significant disturbance for local residents, many living very close by, would be inevitable and should not be ignored.

The applicant cites other instances of alcohol being served in comparable cafes, including in Wandsworth Park and some Royal parks: but those examples are different from our situation, because the other establishments are located at significantly greater distances from residential accommodation and therefore do not give rise to similar potential disturbances.

The selling of alcohol in a family environment and adjacent to facilities specifically provided for and enjoyed by children and young people seems both morally and socially wrong. The application not only raises an issue of public amenity but also, more seriously, one of potentially compromised child protection (which may even be a legal consideration, though I do not know the relevant legislation in any detail).

As they stand, the amendments do not address all of my concerns and therefore I shall not withdraw my basic objection. Meanwhile I shall look forward to clarification on these matters and further reassurance.
