2. DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST

If a Councillor has a disclosable pecuniary interest in a particular item, whether or not it is entered in the Authority's register of interests, or any other significant interest which they consider should be declared in the public interest, they should declare the existence and, unless it is a sensitive interest as defined in the Member Code of Conduct, the nature of the interest at the commencement of the consideration of that item or as soon as it becomes apparent.

At meetings where members of the public are allowed to be in attendance and speak, any Councillor with a disclosable pecuniary interest or other significant interest may also make representations, give evidence or answer questions about the matter. The Councillor must then withdraw immediately from the meeting before the matter is discussed and any vote taken.

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1. THE APPLICATION

On the 03 March 2022, Gardening Club Fulham Limited ("the applicant") submitted an application to vary the premises licence in respect of premises known as Bloom, located at 399 Fulham Palace Road, London SW6 6TA.

1.1 Current Hours of Operation

1.2 Application Requested

The applicant has applied to vary the premises licence to extend the time for live music. The proposed days and times are as follows:

Performance of Live Music -Indoors Only

Sunday	10:00 - 22:00

No other changes to the permitted hours, activities or conditions are sought or implied.

A copy of the application form and further comments from the applicant can be seen on pages 22-43 of this report.

1.3 Applicants Operating Schedule

The applicant has proposed a number of steps to promote the four licensing objectives if the application is granted. A copy of these steps can be seen on pages 38-39 of this report.

On 05 April 2022, following correspondence received from Health and Safety, the review of Public Safety element has been completed for this premises with no issues raised. A copy of this relevant correspondence can be seen on pages 48-49 of this report.

2. BACKGROUND

The main access to the premise's unit is located on Fulham Palace Road. There is a mixture of both residential and commercial premises within the area. A map showing the location of the premises and neighbouring licensed premises can be seen on pages 44-45 of this report.

There are several options for transport away from the area including buses and taxis which run from in and around the Fulham Palace Road area. Putney Bridge tube station is a 11-minute walk away and Parsons Green tube station is a 15-minute walk away.

3. CONSULTATION

A public notice was displayed at the premises for 28 days. The application was advertised in a local circular and all statutory consultees were notified as required by the Regulations. The Council has served written notice of hearing upon the applicant and all those parties that have made representations in respect of the application.

3.1. Relevant Representations

The licensing section received one representation from Cllr Alford Adronie objecting to the licence variation application. A copy of this representation can be seen on page 46 of this report.

The licensing section received one representation from a local resident objecting to the licence variation application. A copy of this representation can be seen on page 47 of this report.

4. OTHER INFORMATION

4.1 Enforcement History

There have not been any warnings, simple cautions or prosecutions given in respect of the premises during the past three years.

4.2 Temporary Event Notices ("TENs")

A number of TENs have been submitted in respect of this premises in the past twelve months. A list of these TENs can be seen on pages 50-51 of this report.

5. POLICY CONSIDERATIONS

- **5.1** Section 5.1 page 12 of the Statement of Licensing Policy ("SLP") states that where there is a relevant representation, the Licensing Authority will consider each particular case on its merits having regard in particular to the following matters:
 - Whether the licensed activities are likely to have an adverse impact especially on local residents and, if there is potential to have an adverse impact, what, if any, appropriate measures will be put in place to prevent it;
 - Whether there will be a substantial increase in the cumulative adverse impact from these or similar activities, on an adjacent residential area;
 - Whether there is a suitable level of public transport accessibility to and from the premises at the appropriate times;
 - Whether the activity will be likely to lead to a harmful and unmanageable increase in car parking demand in surrounding residential streets suffering high levels of parking stress or on roads forming part of the Strategic London Road Network or the London Bus Priority Network leading to a negative impact on the Licensing Objectives relating to the prevention of crime, disorder and nuisance; and
 - Whether there have been any representations made by Responsible Authorities, or other relevant agency or representative.
- **5.2** Section 8.1 page 15 of the SLP states that the Licensing Authority will require applicants to detail in their operating schedule the steps proposed to ensure the deterrence and prevention of crime and disorder on, and in the vicinity of, the premises, having regard to their location, character, condition, the nature and extent of the proposed use and the persons likely to use the premises.

- 5.3 Section 8.10 page 16 of the SLP states that it is important that staff working at off licences are suitably trained and receive appropriate refresher training in their responsibilities under the Act and can discharge their duties in full compliance with the licence conditions and requirements of the Act. This includes the ability to competently check a customer's age with acceptable forms of identification where necessary. The Licensing Authority will particularly consider the following matters where they are material to the individual application:
 - The likelihood of any violence, public order or policing problem if the licence is granted;
 - The measures taken to control admission to the premises, and to take reasonable steps to prevent the occurrence of crime and disorder and public nuisance immediately outside the premises, where and to the extent that these matters are within their control.
 - Past conduct and prior history of complaints against the premises;
 - Whether a dispersal policy has been prepared to minimise the potential for disorder as customers leave the premises; and
 - Any relevant representations.
- **5.4** Section 9.6 page 18 of the SLP states that the Licensing Authority will, where appropriate, attach conditions to a licence to ensure public safety, dealing with, but not limited to. the following:
 - The number of people on the premises to ensure it is appropriate having regard to the activities taking place and reliable ways of counting the number;
 - The steps taken to manage the risk from glass, the use of bottle bins, glass collectors and door supervisors to prevent glass being taken off the premises;
 - The use of door supervisors to manage the entrance and exit from the premises and to protect public safety as customers leave the premises; and
 - The provision of air conditioning and ventilation.
- **5.5** Section 10.3 page 19 and 20 of the SLP states that the Licensing Authority will particularly consider the following matters where they are material to the individual application:
- One of the most common complaints the Licensing Authority receive is about nuisance caused by customers as they leave licensed premises at night. The Licensing Authority recommends that primarily alcohol led premises such as nightclubs and pubs, located close to any residential premises, implement a dispersal policy at their venue. All relevant staff should be trained on any policy, and all reasonable steps should be taken to ensure it is fully implemented and adhered to at all times.
- The proximity of residential accommodation;
- The type of use proposed, including the likely numbers of customers, proposed hours of operation and the frequency of activity;
- The steps taken or proposed to be taken by the applicant to prevent noise and vibration escaping from the premises, including music, noise from ventilation equipment, and human voices. Such measures may include the installation of soundproofing, air conditioning, acoustic lobbies and sound limitation devices;
- The steps taken or proposed to be taken by the applicant to prevent disturbance by customers arriving at or leaving the premises. This will usually be of greater importance late at night and/or in the early hours of the morning. However nuisance can arise at any time of the day or night so the Licensing Authority will consider

representations from Responsible Authorities and/or Interested Parties relating to potential nuisance from any activity at all times dependant on the merits of the application/steps taken or proposed to prevent nuisance.

- Limiting the number of people permitted to use a garden/other open-air areas, including those for the use of smoking, at any one time.
- Restricting the use of a garden/other open-air areas, including those for the use of smoking, after a particular time e.g. 11:00pm (or such earlier time as may be considered appropriate).
- The steps taken or proposed to be taken by the applicant to prevent queuing (either by pedestrian or vehicular traffic). If some queuing is inevitable then queues should be diverted away from neighbouring premises or be otherwise managed to prevent disturbance or obstruction;
- The steps taken or proposed to be taken by the applicant to ensure staff leave the premises quietly;
- The arrangements made or proposed for parking by patrons, and the effect of parking by patrons on local residents;
- The provision for public transport in the locality (including taxis and private hire vehicles) for patrons;
- The level of likely disturbance from associated vehicular and pedestrian movement to and from the premises;
- The delivery and collection areas and delivery/collection times;
- The siting of external lighting, including security lighting that is installed inappropriately;
- The arrangements for refuse disposal, storage and the prevention/tidying of litter (including fly posters and illegal placards);
- The history of previous nuisance complaints proved against the premises, particularly where statutory notices have been served on the present licence holder;
- The history of the applicant in controlling anti-social behaviour and preventing nuisance;
- The generation of odour, e.g. from the preparation of food;
- Any other relevant activity likely to give rise to nuisance;
- Any representations made by the Police, or other relevant agency or representative;

6. DETERMINATION

- **6.1** In determining this application, the Committee must have regard to the representations and take such of the following steps as it considers necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives. The steps are:
- (a) Grant the application in full
- (b) Grant the application in part modifying the proposed hours, activities or conditions.
- (c) Reject the application

It is the Council's duty under the Licensing Act 2003 ("The Act") to determine applications with a view to promoting the four licensing objectives; Prevention of Crime and Disorder, Public Safety, Prevention of Public Nuisance and the Protection of Children from Harm.

In reaching a decision the Council shall consider the details of any relevant representations received; the applicant's Operating Schedule; the Council's adopted

Statement of Licensing Policy and the guidance issued by the Secretary of State under section 182 of the Act.

If the Committee is minded to grant the application conditions may be attached to the licence to alleviate the concerns raised through the representations.

Annex 1 - Mandatory Conditions

- 1. Mandatory Condition
- (1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
- (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises—
- (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to—
- (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
- (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
- (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
- (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
- (d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner;
- (e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of disability).
- 2. Mandatory Condition

The responsible person shall ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.

3. Mandatory Condition

- 1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
- (2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
- (3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either—
- (a) a holographic mark, or
- (b) an ultraviolet feature.
- 4. Mandatory Condition

The responsible person must ensure that—

- (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures—
- (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
- (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
- (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml;
- (b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
- (c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.
- 5. Mandatory Condition
- 1. A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.
- 2. For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 1—
- (a) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979;
- (b) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula— $P = D + (D \times V)$

where-

- (i) P is the permitted price,
- (ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
- (iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;
- (c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence—
- (i) the holder of the premises licence,
- (ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or

- (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;
- (d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
- (e) "value added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.
- 3. Where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that subparagraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.
- 4.(1) Sub-paragraph (2) applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.
- (2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.
- 6. Mandatory Condition
- (1) No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence-
- (a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
- (b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
- (2) Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

7. Mandatory Condition

Where this licence includes a condition that at specified times one or more individuals must be at the premises to carry out a security activity, each individual must be licensed by the Security Industry Authority, with the following exceptions:

- a) premises where the premises licence authorises plays or films
- b) any occasion mentioned in paragraph 8(3)(b) or (c) of Schedule 2 to the Private Security Industry Act 2001 (premises being used exclusively by a club with a club premises certificate, under a temporary event notice authorising plays or films or under a gaming licence), or
- c) any occasion within paragraph 8(3)(d) of Schedule 2 to the Private Security Industry Act 2001.

Annex 2 - Conditions consistent with the operating Schedule

8. CCTV covering areas inside and outside of the premises shall be installed and

maintained to police recommendations with properly maintained log arrangements. All images shall be stored for a minimum of 31 days.

- 9. CCTV is to comply with Data Protection Act 2018 and is to be working and recording correctly when the premises are open to the public. If the CCTV is not working then the premise will comply with requests by police, including suspension of licensable activity.
- 10. A staff member from the premises that is conversant with the operation of the CCTV system will be on the premises at ALL times that the premises are open to the public. This staff member will be able to show police recent data footage with the minimum of delay when requested. This data or footage reproduction should be almost instantaneous.
- 11. Appropriate signage shall be displayed in prominent positions, informing customers they are being recorded on CCTV.
- 12. On days when Fulham Football Club are playing at home or on days when a Fulham victory parade takes place plastic glasses shall be used for three hours before the advertised kick off time until three hours after the match has been completed.
- 13. On days when Fulham Football Club are playing at home or on days when a Fulham victory parade takes place, there shall be a minimum of one personal licence holder on duty from three hours before the advertised kick off until three hours after the match has been completed.
- 14. Alcohol shall not be served before 11am on days when Fulham FC plays at home.
- 15. On days when Fulham Football Club are playing at home or on days when a Fulham victory parade takes place the premises will have a minimum of one SIA registered door staff, or such other number as agreed with Hammersmith and Fulham Police Licensing Unit in writing, on duty for three hours before the advertised kick off time until three hours after the match has been completed. At least one SIA door staff to be located at the entrance to the terrace when the terrace is open for licensable activities.
- 16. On days when Fulham Football Club are playing at home no away fans shall be admitted to the premises from three hours after the match is completed.
- 17. No music shall be generated within the Premises so as to give rise to nuisance within neighbouring dwellings.
- 18. Clearly legible notices shall be displayed at all exits from the Premises requesting patrons to respect the needs of local residents and to leave the Premises and area quietly.
- 19. There shall be no customers in the front, rear, side after 23:00.
- 20. 30 places for seating shall always be made available inside the premises whilst licensable activities are being carried out.

- 21. The premises shall operate a Challenge 25 age restricted sales policy and shall display appropriate signage advising customers of this policy.
- 22. All staff shall be trained in the Proof of Age policy and how to identify acceptable means of identification.
- 23. Live music shall not be permitted in the outside space/areas of the premises.
- 24. Recorded music shall not be permitted outside the premises after 23:00 hours.
- 25. An electronic noise limiting device shall be installed on the premises and set to noise officers' satisfaction so as to ensure that nuisance is not caused in any unassociated premises. The device shall be pre-approved by officers before the use commences and maintained in good working order throughout the duration of use.
- 26. If requested by the Noise & Nuisance Team the noise limiter shall be adjusted and set to a satisfactory level so that local residents are not disturbed.
- 27. Any television in the outside area shall be set to background level only.
- 28. The Licence Holder / Designated Premises Supervisor shall respond promptly and positively to any noise complaints from residents.
- 29. There shall be no admittance or re-admittance to the premises after 23:00 except for existing customers who have been outside to smoke.
- 30. All staff shall be trained in how to identify drunk or drug impaired customers. This training shall be repeated at least biannually and written records of the training kept and made available to police and authorised officers of the Licensing Authority on request
- 31. All staff responsible for selling alcohol shall receive regular training in the Licensing Act 2003 in terms of the licensing objectives, offences committed under the Act and conditions of the Premises Licence. Written records of this training shall be retained and made available to police and authorised officers of the Licensing Authority on request.




