SUMMARY OF DECISION

The Committee has considered an application for a new premises licence for the provision of late-night refreshment operating as a hot food restaurant and take-away under the Licensing Act 2003 (“the Application”).

1. Grant the application as amended by the Police.

SUMMARY OF DECISION

The Committee has considered an application for a new premises licence for the sale of alcohol off the premises via an online retail location under the Licensing Act 2003 ("the Application").

In summary, the Committee has decided, after taking into account all of the individual circumstances of this case and the promotion of the four licensing objectives to:

1. Grant the application as amended by the Noise and Nuisance Team
2. Modify the conditions as set out below:-
 - i. The premises shall install and maintain a comprehensive CCTV system. All entry and exit points will be covered, enabling frontal identification of every person entering in any light condition. The CCTV system shall continually record whilst the premises is open for licensable activities and during all times when customers remain on the premises. All recordings shall be stored for a minimum period of 31 days with date and time stamping. Recordings shall be made available immediately upon the request of the Police or authorised officer throughout the preceding 31-day period.
 - ii. Deliveries shall only be made to persons aged over 18. The delivery shall be signed for and photographic proof of age shall be requested and recorded.

iii. Deliveries shall be made to a building which is used for residential and/or work purposes. Deliveries shall not be made to outdoor spaces.

This licence becomes operational with immediate effect. If problems are experienced, then an application for a review of the premises licence can be made.

A copy of this Committee's full decision, including its reasons and the full text of the conditions added to the licence will be sent to the parties forthwith.

If the Applicant is unhappy with the decision, they are entitled to appeal to the magistrates' court within 21 days from the date of notification of the full decision.
