Few minutes before the hearing the Committee received a request from the applicant's representatives of the withdrawal of the application for variation of the existing premises licence of the Premises under the Licensing Act 2003

At the hearing the Chair of the Committee confirmed the application was withdrawn.

SUMMARY OF DECISION

The Committee has considered an application for a new premises licence for the sale of alcohol off the premises only under the Licensing Act 2003 (“the Application”).

In summary, the Committee has decided, after taking into account all of the individual circumstances of this case and the promotion of the four licensing objectives to :

1. Grant the application as follows:

The sale of alcohol off the premises only
Monday – Sunday: 09:00 – 23:00

2. The opening hours of the premises
Mondays to Sundays 08:00 - 23:00

3. To add to the licence the conditions proposed by the Applicant in the operating schedule.

4. To add to the licence four conditions proposed by the Trading Standards

5. The licence is subject to mandatory conditions.

This licence becomes operational with immediate effect. If problems are experienced, then an application for a review of the premises licence can be made.

A copy of this Committee’s full decision including its reasons and the full text of the conditions added to the licence will be sent to the parties forthwith.

If the Applicant is unhappy with the decision, they are entitled to appeal to the magistrates’ court within 21 days from the date of notification of the full decision.
