# TEXTILE TRIBUTE, 30 GOLDHAWK ROAD, LONDON, W12 8DH (6:30PM)

#### SUMMARY OF DECISION

The Committee has considered an application for a new premises licence for the sale of alcohol off the premises only under the Licensing Act 2003 ("the Application").

In summary, the Committee has decided, after taking into account all of the individual circumstances of this case and the promotion of the four licensing objectives to:

1. Grant the Application as follows:

The sale of alcohol - off the premises Mondays to Sundays 10:00 to 23:00

2. The opening hours of the premises are as follows:

Mondays to Sundays 08:00 to 23:00

- 3. The licence is subject to any mandatory conditions
- 4. The licence is subject to the conditions volunteered by the Applicant in the operating schedule and amended by the Committee.

This licence becomes operational with immediate effect. If problems are experienced, then an application for a review of the premises licence can be made.

A copy of this Committee's full decision including its reasons, and the full text of the conditions added to the licence will be sent to the parties forthwith.

If the Applicant or any person who has made a relevant representation is unhappy with the decision, they are entitled to appeal to the magistrates' court within 21 days from the date of notification of the full decision.

# BOHA LONDON, 562 KING'S ROAD, LONDON, SW6 2DZ (8:00PM OR AFTER CONSIDERATION OF THE FIRST ITEM)

### **SUMMARY OF DECISION**

The Committee has considered an application for a variation of the existing premises licence for adding an additional condition to the licence as follows: "Conditions on this Premises Licence that relate to the ID scanner (Conditions 30, 31 and 32) shall only take effect when the Premises Licence Holder is given 10 days' written (including email) notice by the Metropolitan Police licensing officer. The premises will

continually risk assess the use of the ID scanner" under the Licensing Act 2003 ("the Application").

In summary, the Committee has decided, after taking into account all of the individual circumstances of this case and the promotion of the four licensing objectives:

- (a) To reject the additional condition proposed by the Applicant.
- (b) To amend existing conditions 30 and 32 to require that any patrons/customers that the Licence Premises Holder believes to be less than 25 years of age, have their ID scanned on entry to the Premises.

A copy of this Committee's full decision including its reasons, and the full text of the conditions added to the licence will be sent to the parties forthwith.

If the Applicant or any person who has made a relevant representation is unhappy with the decision, they are entitled to appeal to the magistrates' court within 21 days from the date of notification of the full decision.
