SUMMARY OF DECISION

The Committee has considered an application for a new premises licence under the Licensing Act 2003 for the following licensable activities:

The Exhibition of Films - Indoors Only

The Provision of Late-Night Refreshment - Indoors Only

The Sale of Alcohol - Both On and Off the Premises

("the Application").

In summary, the Committee has decided, after taking into account all of the individual circumstances of this case and the promotion of the four licensing objectives to

1. Grant the application as follows;

The Exhibition of Films - Indoors Only
Mondays to Sundays 11:00 to 00:00

The Provision of Late-Night Refreshment - Indoors Only
Mondays to Sundays 23:00 to 00:00

The Sale of Alcohol - On the Premises
Mondays to Sundays 11:00 to 23:30

The Sale of Alcohol - Off the Premises
Mondays to Sundays 11:00 to 00:00

2. The opening hours of the premises are
Mondays to Sundays 07:00 to 00:00
3. The licence is subject to any mandatory conditions
4. The licence is subject to the conditions volunteered by the Applicant in the operating schedule as amended by the Committee
5. The licence is subject to the conditions proposed by the Police and agreed by the Applicant
6. The Licensing is subject to the following conditions imposed by the Committee;
 1. All staff responsible for selling alcohol shall receive relevant training from an external source before making any unsupervised sales. The training shall include:
 - the Licensing Act 2003 in terms of the licensing objectives and offences committed under the Act;
 - the conditions of the Premises Licence;
 - the sale of age-restricted products.

This training will be refreshed at least every six months. Staff shall sign to confirm that they have received and understood the training. Written records of this training shall be retained and made available to the Police or authorised officers of the Licensing Authority upon request.

2. There shall be a minimum of one personal licence holder on duty on the premises at all times when the premises are authorised to sell alcohol.

This licence becomes operational with immediate effect. If problems are experienced, then an application for a review of the premises licence can be made.

A copy of this Committee's full decision including its reasons, and the full text of the conditions added to the licence will be sent to the parties forthwith.

If the Applicant or any person who has made a relevant representation is unhappy with the decision they are entitled to appeal to the magistrates' court within 21 days from the date of notification of the full decision
