SUMMARY OF DECISION

The Committee has considered an application for a new premises licence for late night refreshment, indoors and outdoors, under the Licensing Act 2003 (“the Application”).

In summary, the Committee has decided, after taking into account all of the individual circumstances of this case and the promotion of the four licensing objectives to:

1. Grant the Application as follows:

Provision of Late-Night Refreshment - Indoors and Outdoors

Monday to Saturday 23:00 until 00:00

Provision of Late-Night Refreshment - Outdoors Only

Friday to Saturday 00:00 until 01:00 (deliveries only – no access to members of the public)

2. Hours open to the Public

Monday to Saturday 10:00 to 00:00

Sunday 10:00 to 23:00

3. The licence is subject to any mandatory conditions
4. The licence is subject to the conditions volunteered by the Applicant in the operating schedule and amended by the Committee
5. The licence is also subject to the following conditions imposed by the Committee:
 1. A Noise Management Plan detailing the Noise insulation to be implemented shall be submitted to and approved in writing by the Environmental Protection Team.
 2. The Licence shall not be implemented until the Noise Insulation has been installed and tested to the satisfaction of the Environmental Protection Team.
 3. The contact details for the manager of premises and the contact details of an operational manager from the head office shall be displayed so that it is visible for members of the public to lodge complaints.

4. A responsible member of staff shall organise and accommodate meetings to discuss the operation of the premises with residents at least two times per calendar year. The meeting shall be advertised at least 14 days before its due date by letter to residents and residents' associations in the locality as well as to the Licensing Authority.

If problems are experienced, then an application for a review of the premises licence can be made.

A copy of this Committee's full decision including its reasons and the full text of the conditions added to the licence will be sent to the parties forthwith.

If the Applicant or any person who has made a relevant representation is unhappy with the decision, they are entitled to appeal to the magistrates' court within 21 days from the date of notification of the full decision.
