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1. APOLOGIES FOR ABSENCE

2. DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST

If a Councillor has a disclosable pecuniary interest in a particular item, whether or not it is entered in the Authority's register of interests, or any other significant interest which they consider should be declared in the public interest, they should declare the existence and, unless it is a sensitive interest as defined in the Member Code of Conduct, the nature of the interest at the commencement of the consideration of that item or as soon as it becomes apparent.

At meetings where members of the public are allowed to be in attendance and speak, any Councillor with a disclosable pecuniary interest or other significant interest may also make representations, give evidence or answer questions about the matter. The Councillor must then withdraw immediately from the meeting before the matter is discussed and any vote taken.

Where Members of the public are not allowed to be in attendance and speak, then the Councillor with a disclosable pecuniary interest should withdraw from the meeting whilst the matter is under consideration. Councillors who have declared other significant interests should also withdraw from the meeting if they consider their continued participation in the matter would not be reasonable in the circumstances and may give rise to a perception of a conflict of interest.

Councillors are not obliged to withdraw from the meeting where a dispensation to that effect has been obtained from the Standards Committee.

3. POPEYE'S, 348 NORTH END ROAD, LONDON, SW6 1NB

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1. THE APPLICATION

On the 16th October 2024, the Licensing Authority received a valid application for a new premises licence in respect of the premises known as Popeye's, 348 North End Road, London, SW6 1NB submitted by Mr Mark Browning of BA Law, on behalf of PLK Chicken UK Limited ('the applicant').

1.1 Application Requested

The applicant has applied for a premises licence to permit late night refreshment indoors and outdoors as outlined below:

The Provision of Late-Night Refreshment - Indoors and Outdoors

Monday to Sunday 23.00 to 02:00

Hours Premises is Open to the Public

Monday to Sunday 07:00 to 02:30

A copy of the application form and plan can be seen on pages 15-37 of this report.

On the 24th October 2024, following receipt of the Environmental Protection teams' representation, the applicant agreed to reduce the hours applied to as follows:

Provision of Late-Night Refreshment - Indoors and Outdoors

Sunday to Wednesday 23:00 until 00:00 Thursday to Saturday 23:00 until 01:00

Provision of Late-Night Refreshment - Outdoors Only

Sunday to Wednesday 00:00 until 01:00 (deliveries only – no access to members

of the public)

Thursday to Saturday 01:00 until 02:00 (deliveries only - no access to members

of the public)

Hours Premises is Open to the Public

Sunday to Wednesday 07:00 until 00:00 Thursday to Saturday 07:00 until 01:00

1.2 Applicants Operating Schedule

The applicant has proposed a number of additional steps to promote the four licensing objectives in their operating schedule, if the application is granted. A copy of this can be seen on pages **34-36** of this report.

2. BACKGROUND

The main access to the premises is located on North End Road. There is a mixture of commercial and residential premises within the area. A map showing the location of the premises and neighbouring licensed premises can be seen on pages **46-51** of this report.

There are several options for transport away from the area including buses and taxis which run from in and around the North End Road area. Fulham Broadway tube station is a 6-minute walk away, West Brompton tube station is a 14-minute walk away and Parsons Green tube station is a 15-minute walk away.

3. CONSULTATION

A public notice was displayed at the premises for 28 days. The application was advertised in a local circular and all statutory consultees were notified as required by the Regulations. The Council has served written notice of hearing upon the applicant and all those parties that have made representations in respect of the application.

3.1. Relevant Representations

The licensing section received twenty-one representations objecting to the licence application.

One representation was received from John Garcia of the Environmental Protection team, objecting to the licence application. A copy of the representation can be seen on pages **52-54** of this report.

One representation was received on behalf of the Barclay Road Conservation Area Neighbourhood Watch ("Barclay Road Residents"), one representation was received on behalf of the Vanston Place Management Company, one representation was received on behalf of the Co-Chair of Walham Green Ward Panel, one representation was received on behalf of the Secretary of the Fulham Island Residents Association ("FIRA"), and sixteen representations were received from local residents, all objecting the license application. A copy of the representations can be seen on pages **55-99** of this report.

On 5th December 2024, the Licensing Team sent an email to all objectors with the reduction of hours mentioned in section 1.1 of the report. A copy of the correspondence and responses can be seen on pages **100-106** of this report.

4. OTHER INFORMATION

4.1 Enforcement History

There have not been any warnings, simple cautions or prosecutions given in respect of the premises during the past three years.

4.2 Temporary Event Notices ("TENs")

No TENs have been submitted in respect of this premises in the past twelve months.

5. POLICY CONSIDERATIONS

5.1 Section 2 pages 7-8 of the Statement of Licensing Policy ("SLP") states the Licensing Authority is keen to support the licensed sector and leisure offer within the borough, with a particular focus on business resilience and growing a robust and thriving cultural and leisure sector.

To achieve this the Licensing Authority has identified three key themes of the Licensing Policy and the Licensing Authority's approach to implementing it. These are:

- A sustainable, well-run licensed sector;
- Hammersmith & Fulham as a good place to live, work and enjoy leisure; and,
- A safe licensing environment and night-time economy.
- **5.2** Section 5 pages 12 and 13 of the SLP states that to ensure the promotion of the four Licensing Objectives the Licensing Authority will require applicants to detail in their operating schedule:
 - the steps proposed to promote the licensing objective of the prevention of crime and disorder on, and in the vicinity of, the premises, having regard to their location, character, condition, the nature and extent of the proposed use and the persons likely to use the premises;
 - the steps proposed to ensure the physical safety of people using the relevant premises or place:
 - how they intend to prevent nuisance arising, prevent disturbance and protect amenity so far as is appropriate to ensure that the Licensing Objectives are met.
 Where there is a relevant representation regarding extended hours, the Licensing Authority will not permit an extension unless it is satisfied that the Licensing Objectives would be met;
 - the measures and management controls in place to protect children from harm. Where appropriate a written childcare policy should be available and be incorporated in the induction of staff.
- **5.3** Policy 1 pages 18 of the SLP states that applicants are expected to undertake a local area risk assessment as part of any licensing application.

The Secretary of State's Guidance states that applicants are expected to obtain sufficient information to enable them to demonstrate, the steps they propose to take to promote the licensing objectives; and that they understand the layout of the local area and physical environment including:

- a. crime and disorder hotspots;
- b. proximity to residential premises;
- c. proximity to areas where children may congregate;
- d. any risk posed to the local area by the applicants' proposed licensable activities;
 and

e. participation in any local initiatives (for example, local crime reduction initiatives or voluntary schemes, such as 'Ask for Angela', local taxi-marshalling schemes, street pastors and other schemes) which may help to mitigate potential risks.

Applicants are expected to include positive proposals in their application on how they will manage any potential risks.

The Guidance goes on to state that 'Applicants are expected to provide licensing authorities with sufficient information in this section to determine the extent to which their proposed steps are appropriate to promote the licensing objectives in the local area. Applications must not be based on providing a set of standard conditions to promote the licensing objectives and applicants are expected to make it clear why the steps they are proposing are appropriate for the premises.'

The Licensing Authority notes the contents of these paragraphs from the Secretary of State's Guidance and, in particular, the use of the word 'expected'. Licence applications that do not in any way address the contents of these paragraphs in their operating schedules may be returned to the applicant as 'incomplete'.

- **5.4** Policy 3 page 21 of the SLP states that where there is a relevant representation, the Licensing Authority will consider each particular case on its merits having regard in particular to the following matters:
- a) Whether the licensed activities are likely to have an adverse impact especially on local residents and, if there is potential to have an adverse impact, what, if any, appropriate measures will be put in place to prevent it;
- b) Whether there will be a substantial increase in the cumulative adverse impact from these or similar activities, on an adjacent residential area;
- c) Whether there is a suitable level of public transport accessibility to and from the premises at the appropriate times;
- d) Whether the activity will be likely to lead to a harmful and unmanageable increase in car parking demand in surrounding residential streets suffering high levels of parking stress or on roads forming part of the Strategic London Road Network or the London Bus Priority Network leading to a negative impact on the Licensing Objectives relating to the prevention of crime, disorder, anti-social behaviour (ASB), nuisance and vehicle emissions:
- e) Whether there have been any representations made by Responsible Authorities, or other relevant agency or representative.

The Licensing Authority will closely scrutinise extended hours applications to ensure that the Licensing Objectives are met. In determining an application, the licensing committee might decide that the circumstances are such that a restriction on hours is the only appropriate means to achieve the Licensing Objectives. If an 'hours' restriction is imposed, the Licensing Authority will normally require that customers should be allowed a minimum of thirty minutes to consume alcohol.

To act as a guide for new or existing operators we have set out the suggested closing times for licensed premises below:

5.5 Policy 4 pages 22 and 23 of the SLP states that in determining an application where there has been a relevant representation the Licensing Authority will, where appropriate, take into account the cumulative effect of the number, type and density of licensed premises already existing in the area. Consideration will be given to the proximity to any drug and alcohol treatment site, A&E department or homeless hostel in a local area type remit i.e. applicants need to make the case for how they would not increase further problems for residents/clients nearby.

In coming to any decision regarding cumulative impact the Licensing Authority will consider other mechanisms outside of the licensing regime which may also be available to address this issue, these include but are not limited to:

- Police and other enforcement of the normal law concerning disorder and antisocial behaviour.
- Police powers to close down instantly any licensed premises or temporary events on grounds of disorder, the likelihood of disorder or excessive noise emanating from the premises, for up to 24 hours.
- The power of the police, other responsible authorities, a local resident, business or Councillor to seek a review of the licence or certificate in question.
- Police and Local Authority power to issue a Closure Notice for up to 48 hours where serious antisocial behaviour is taking place at licensed premises under the Anti-social Behaviour, Crime and Policing Act 2014.
- To ensure that residents are protected from the negative impact of late-night local licensing activities the Licensing Authority may decide to adopt an Area Specific Cumulative Impact Policy in relation to a specific area; where the number, type and density of premises providing licensable activities is having a serious negative impact on the local community and local amenities.
- **5.6** Policy 11 pages 29 to 30 of the SLP states that Licensing law is not the primary mechanism for the general control of nuisance and anti-social behaviour caused by people once they are away from the licensed premises and, therefore, beyond the direct control of the licensee. However, licensing is a key aspect of such control and licensing law is part of a holistic approach to the management of the nighttime economy.

As a matter of policy, the council expects every holder of a licence, certificate or permission, to accept and be responsible for minimising the impact of their activities and anti-social behaviour by their patrons within the vicinity of their premises by taking appropriate measures and action consistent with that responsibility.

Licensees and certificate holders should take reasonable steps to prevent the occurrence of crime and disorder and public nuisance immediately outside their premises, for example on the pavement, in a beer garden or in a smoking area, to the extent that these matters are within their control.

Population densities in this borough are high, with many residential premises located above or in close proximity to licensed premises. This means that the public nuisance

and crime and disorder objectives will be of paramount concern when evaluating Operating Schedules. Licensing Committees will place high regard on the control measures put in place by the applicant to ensure that our residents are protected from the potential detrimental effects of any licensed premises.

5.7 Policy 13 pages 31 and 32 of the SLP in relation to alignment with planning states that despite Licensing and Planning being under different legislation, the Licensing Authority will ensure that the licensing regime is in line with the planning regime in Hammersmith & Fulham as far as is possible.

The local planning authority has powers to control opening times of all new establishments seeking planning permission, where harm might occur. A link to the Planning web page to make a planning application, to find out about planning rules and policy and our regeneration projects, is below:

Licensing applications will not be a re-run of the planning application. If the licensing committee grants any variation of a licence which involves a material alteration to a building, the applicant still needs to apply for planning permission, or building regulation control, where appropriate.

Where an applicant is granted a premises licence with operating hours that are different to the hours permitted by the premises planning permission, the applicant must observe the earlier closing time. Premises operating in breach of their planning permission would be liable to prosecution under planning law. We would suggest that the applicant contacts Planning apply to vary their conditions.

The Licensing Authority may refuse to grant a licence if a representation from the Planning Department has been received AND ONE or more of the licensing objectives would not be promoted.

5.8 Policy 14 pages 32 and 33 of the SLP states that the Licensing Authority expects licence applications for delivery services, which include late night refreshment after 11pm or the delivery of alcohol, to consider how to reduce public nuisance related to delivery vehicles, ensure the security of premises and delivery drivers and to protect children.

Since the last Statement of Licensing Policy there have been an increasing number of applications for licences relating to delivery services, these tend to fall into three groups:

- Premium specialist product mail-order type services;
- Food delivery services (both meal and grocery) that include alcohol delivery but are primarily food lead; and,
- Convenience type alcohol delivery services that are targeted at convenience for those drinking at home.

Although these types of services are not provided for in the Licensing Act 2003 or in the s182 guidance in any way differently from other licensed premises they do provide

their own unique circumstances that need to be addressed. In particular the Licensing Authority has concerns with the potential for the following:

- The safety of delivery drivers at the point of delivery;
- Safety of the premises from which orders are taken and sent out for deliver; and,
- Possible public nuisance and anti-social behaviour (ASB) caused by delivery drivers collecting deliveries from the licensed premises.

The Licensing Authority is likely to place the following conditions on to a premises licence for delivery services where it is appropriate and relevant to the individual licence application:

- Alcohol shall only be delivered to a residential or business address and not to a public place.
- Appropriate security will be in place at the premises as agreed with Police.
- Measures for minimising noise and disturbance and anti-social behaviour (ASB) caused by the dispatch of deliveries to be identified in the operating schedule.
 In particular applicants are expected to consider the use of electric vehicles to minimise air pollution and noise. The Licensing Authority expects that applicants will make arrangements for all deliveries after 8 pm to be made using electric vehicles or non-motorised vehicles i.e. bicycles.
- A requirement for a specific delivery collection area to be made clear to any third-party delivery service. This area may not be directly outside the licensed premises to take account of any residential accommodation close by or obstructing the pavement/highways.

5.9 Policy 16 pages 33 and 34 of the SLP in relation to the safety of women and girls in a licensed setting states the Licensing Authority expects licence applications to specifically include measures to ensure the safety of women and girls in licensed premises.

The Licensing Authority will use its powers to regulate the night-time economy, both with specific regard to spiking incidents and more generally in relation to violence against women and girls. This may include:

- a) Using the Licensing Authority's powers to impose conditions or revoke premises licenses, where venues do not take sufficient measures to protect and provide support to customers in spiking incidents;
- b) Considering the prevalence, prevention and reporting of sexual harassment and misconduct and gender-based violence in licensed premises.
- c) Requiring the presence of suitably trained and accredited door staff,
- d) Require presence of CCTV, or to introduce entry searches for example.

Licence applicants and existing licence holders are encouraged to include in their operating schedules clear polices relating to potential abuse or violence against women and girls.

This would include, but is not limited to the 'Ask for Angela' programme, Welfare and Vulnerability Engagement' training package (WAVE) for staff to identify and assist women and girls being at risk or being subjected to violence, and the implementation of clear policies in the premises on preventing and addressing violence against women and girls. The Licensing Authority would also encourage off licensed premises to take part in the Ask for Angela scheme in an effort to increase the visible promotion of the scheme in all licensed premises across the borough.

Implementing these measures, particularly for on-licence premises, providing training for staff to increase awareness and provide skills and tools for identifying and assisting when it is at risk of happening or is happening, and having clear policies against violence against women and girls provide a solid basis for addressing the issue when it occurs in licensed premises. Furthermore, having policies on staff reporting incidents to Police and Council officers will help to ensure that these incidents are addressed.

- **5.10** Annex 1 pages 35 and 36 of the SLP in relation to the prevention of crime and disorder states licence applicants will be expected to demonstrate the following in their operating schedules:
- g)Conditions will, so far as possible, reflect local crime prevention strategies, and the Licensing Authority will also have regard to the views of the local Crime and Disorder Reduction Partnership.
- h) Crime and disorder in the vicinity of the premises: this may include the crime and disorder risks arising from persons queuing to enter the premises; persons exiting the premises and customers smoking eating or drinking in outdoor areas and on the highway outside the premises. This can also include crime arising from pickpockets and bag snatchers, particularly in open spaces or crowded areas where alcohol is being consumed.
- j) **CCTV** using CCTV inside and/or outside the premises together with appropriate procedures and having staff properly trained to use CCTV equipment
- k) **dispersal procedures** establishing appropriate dispersal procedures to minimise the potential for crime and disorder when customers are leaving the premises.
- I) dealing with and reporting crime and disorder training for staff and door security aimed at reducing crime and disorder in the premises and its vicinity and dealing with and reporting incidents if they occur.
- m) **door staff** considering whether the premises employs enough SIA registered door staff, whether Door Premises Supervisors check the legitimacy of the badges and whether SIA staff display their badges prominently. (Note: All door supervisors must be Security Industry Authority (SIA) registered).
- n) **drugs and weapons** ensuring compliance with relevant guidance regarding illegal drugs and weapons. Attention should be paid to search procedures, procedures for the safe storage and surrender of seized drugs and weapons and drug awareness issues, designing out the ability to take drugs in the premises, etc.
- 5.9 Annex 1 pages 37 to 38 of the SLP in relation to the prevention of public safety states that the Licensing Authority will require the applicant to demonstrate the steps proposed to ensure the physical safety of people using the relevant premises or place. This does not cover the separate need for applicants to provide relevant public safety requirements dealt with by Environmental Health. This is expected to include:

- a) Maximum occupancy limits will be specified on the licence only where necessary for the promotion of public safety or the prevention of disorder. Where a capacity limit is already specified in a fire risk assessment, the Licensing Authority will not normally include that limit as a licence condition.
- c) The Licensing Authority will, where appropriate, attach conditions to a licence to ensure public safety, dealing with, but not limited to. the following:
 - i. Checks on equipment at specified intervals, e.g. gas safety checks;
 - ii. Standards to be maintained, e.g. temporary electrical installations to comply with British Standards;
 - iii. The number of people on the premises to ensure it is appropriate having regard to the activities taking place and reliable ways of counting the number;
 - iv. The use of door supervisors to manage the entrance and exit from the premises and to protect public safety as customers leave the premises;
 - v. The provision of air conditioning and ventilation;

The following provides a non-exhaustive list of risks associated with the public safety objective that applicants may want to consider when preparing their Operating Schedule:

- **e) incident and occurrence book** keeping an incident book on the premises so staff can record any instances of crime, disorder, refused sales, ejections and intimidating behaviour.
- **g) getting home safely** providing information to customers and staff (including contact telephone numbers) regarding safer options available for travelling home late at night including night buses, licensed taxis and private hire (mini-cabs).
- **h) overcrowding** developing policies and procedures regarding capacity to prevent overcrowding and patrons possibly becoming aggressive.
- i) premises environment applicants should consider the physical environment of the premises and have regard to issues that could increase the likelihood of patrons becoming agitated or aggressive. This may include procedures regarding door supervision, identification and management of drunken customers and issues of overcrowding and capacity, which may result in patrons becoming aggressive or rowdy.
- **5.10** Annex 1 pages 38 to 40 of the SLP in relation to the prevention of public nuisance states that the Licensing Authority will particularly consider the following matters where they are material to the individual application:
- ii. The proximity of residential accommodation:
- iii. The type of use proposed, including the likely numbers of customers, proposed hours of operation and the frequency of activity;
- iv. The steps taken or proposed to be taken by the applicant to prevent noise and vibration escaping from the premises, including music, noise from ventilation equipment, and human voices. Such measures may include the installation of soundproofing, air conditioning, acoustic lobbies and sound limitation devices;
- v. The steps taken or proposed to be taken by the applicant to prevent disturbance by customers arriving at or leaving the premises.
- viii. The steps taken or proposed to be taken by the applicant to prevent queuing (either by pedestrian or vehicular traffic). If some queuing is inevitable then queues should be diverted away from neighbouring premises or be otherwise managed to prevent disturbance or obstruction:
- ix. The steps taken or proposed to be taken by the applicant to ensure staff leave the premises quietly;

- x. The arrangements made or proposed for parking by patrons, and the effect of parking by patrons on local residents;
- xi. The provision for public transport in the locality (including taxis and private hire vehicles) for patrons;
- xii. The level of likely disturbance from associated vehicular and pedestrian movement to and from the premises;
- xiii. The delivery and collection areas and delivery/collection times;
- xv. The arrangements for refuse disposal, storage and the prevention/tidying of litter (including fly posters and illegal placards);
- xviii. The generation of odour, e.g. from the preparation of food;
- xix. Any other relevant activity likely to give rise to nuisance;
- xx. Any representations made by the Police, or other relevant agency or representative;

The following provides a non-exhaustive list of risks associated with the public nuisance objective that applicants may want to consider when preparing their Operating Schedule:

- j) **Deliveries/collections** noise from deliveries to and/or collections (e.g. refuse) from the premises are another common source of complaint. Consider the times of such deliveries/collections and make sure you specify to any contractors that deliveries/collections should not be made at anti-social times. As a guide, the Noise and Nuisance Service recommend that deliveries/collections should only be made between the hours of 7:30am and 9:00pm, depending on the proximity of residential and/or other noise sensitive properties.
- k) Late night refreshment applicants in respect of late night takeaways should demonstrate that they have assessed the risk of persons congregating in large numbers in the vicinity of their premises. Where appropriate, applicants should demonstrate suitable measures to address this problem.
- l) **Light pollution** this is an increasingly common source of complaint, particularly from illuminated signs and external security lighting. Where provided, illuminated signs should not cause glare to neighbouring properties, ideally being turned off at night, and external lighting should be angled and/or diffused to also prevent nuisance.
- n) **External Areas** External areas such as gardens can be the source of noise disturbance to surrounding premises. Consider limiting the use of the garden to a reasonable time and number of people.
- o) **Odour** odour from cooking is a common source of complaint, particularly from restaurants and fast[1]food takeaways. The Council's Noise and Nuisance Service may therefore require evidence that the kitchen ventilation and/or extract systems are regularly maintained and serviced to ensure that it is operating efficiently and with minimal nuisance to neighbours arising from odour and also noise. This includes the siting of BBQs.
- p) **Queue management** establishing appropriate procedures to avoid the need for customers to queue before entering the premises or, where queuing cannot be avoided, to manage queues so as to minimise the potential for crime and disorder or public nuisance by customers who are queuing.
- q) **Ventilation** where regulated entertainment is to be provided there may be a requirement to keep doors and/or windows closed during its provision to limit noise breakout, consider therefore the provision of air conditioning for the comfort of your customers if doors and windows have to be closed during the summer. However, also note air conditioning can be the source of noise complaints in itself, so careful consideration also needs to be given to the siting of this equipment.
- r) **Waste** consider how and where waste will be stored/disposed of at the end of trading hours, particularly if trading until late at night. This is important because the disposal of

glass and/or cans to outside bin areas can be very noisy and give rise to complaints, so it may be necessary to store such items and other non-degradable refuse inside the premises until the next trading day. Consideration should also be given to the time of deliveries to minimize disruption to local residents.

- s) Litter for example, litter patrols for late night take-away premises
- **5.11** Annex 1 page 40 of the SLP in relation to the protection of children from harm, states that the Licensing Authority will require operating plans to specify the measures and management controls in place to protect children from harm. Where appropriate a written childcare policy should be available and be incorporated in the induction of staff.

6. DETERMINATION

- **6.1** In determining this application, the Committee must have regard to the representations and take such of the following steps as it considers necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives. The steps are:
- (a) Grant the application in full
- (b) Grant the application in part modifying the proposed hours, activities or conditions.
- (c) Reject the application

Much of the late night concerns are caused by alcohol led premises. - 1. A CCTV system with recording equipment must be installed and maintained at the premises and operated with cameras in positions agreed with the Police. All recordings used in conjunction with CCTV must:
 - Be of evidential quality in all lighting conditions;
 - Indicate the correct time and date; and
 - Be retained for a period of 31 consecutive days.

A member of staff trained to use the system must be on duty at all times licensable activities are taking place, as the recorded images must be available for inspection immediately upon request to all officers of Responsible Authorities. A system must be in place to provide images for uploading upon request to the Police. There must also be adequate portable hardware (such as compact disks or USB storage devices) at the premises, as the recorded images must be available for downloading immediately upon request to officers of other Responsible Authorities.


- 2. All images downloaded from the CCTV system, must be provided in a format that can be viewed on readily available equipment without the need for specialist software.

- -illegal residential roads race track antics (crime),
- -illegal residential roads cut through tactics (crime) and
- -leading to overall nuisance, including
- —causing residents to awake from the slumber of very necessary sleep (noise),
- —causing emissions nuisance from scooters/motorbikes

Opening Hours after 23:00 rather se far too many problems n North End Road.

Crime Hot Spot:

This stretch of North End Road is a defined Metropolitan Police Crime Hot Spot.

Only shorter operating hours will assist in decreasing crime by not attracting customers during food service operating hours and not attracting delivery drivers during the proposed 'delivery only'/so-called 'Outdoors only' hours, in licensing parlance.

Bus stop J:

348 North End Road is directly at the TfL Bus Stop J (which stretches from the Charity Shop to Ladbrokes betting shop @344 NER).

According to Google Maps, this Ladbrokes opens at 08:00 and closes at 22:00 Mon-Fri, 21:00 Sat and 21:30 Sun (this timing on Sunday seems odd—later on Sun than Sat—, I am asking for the licensed hours as they are not available on the Public Register.

In any case, it closes well before 10pm/22:00, apparently.

348 North End Road was a Nando's which closed at 23:30, and opened at 11:30.

346 North End Road is a Tattoo shop which closes at 19:00 and opens at 11am.

338 NER British Heart Charity shop closes at 18:00 336 NER Rymans stationary shop closes at 18:00

A retail parade of shops:

This parade is predominantly a daytime use offering with a few food offerings that end around 23:00/23:30.

Presumably this developed as such due to the number of residents living above, across and around.

Ramping up an after 23:00 hours delivery service based at 348 NER will bring at least 30-50 deliveries per hour after 23:00 from this premises, and with it, the usual increase in nuisance, crime etc. As well, an industry has developed of delivery drivers 'owning' certain pitches/territory in front of premises. This can turn into problems involving innocent bystanders at the bus stop. This territorial approach leads to the delivery guys returning to their pitch, so multiply 30/50 x2 = 100 per hour. The commercial pressure is built into the formula of no passing trade means more orders needed to make hours till 2am viable.

07:00am opening takeaways

H&F Council has a policy not to allow takeaways within 400 meters of where children congregate especially this includes schools, bus stops etc. we have plenty of schools within 400 meters as well as places where children congregate.

Therefore this premises should at least not open before 10am.

In theory, it should not be allowed to operate at all. We need to protect our children.

The H&F Plan 2018 specifically states that other legislation will be used to curtail hours if planning hours are not conditioned. That is the case here. Therefore we ask the Committee to use their appropriate authority to curtail hours to reduce crime and nuisance and to protect children from harm.

I am choosing to send an email for this representation (rather than using your portal) as Im including three images. Please acknowledge receipt of this within the allotted time.

I am writing on behalf of Vanston Place Management Company, who look after the interests of the residents of Dungannon House, a block of 42 residential apartments fronting onto Vanston Place a stones throw from Popeyes .

Our block consists of 8 floors with 12 flats including 24 bedrooms - many of them children's bedrooms, directly facing Vanston Place, and many more at the side of our building partially facing Vanston Place.

Popeyes is on the North End Road, which as they mention in their application is a main road, **by day**.

However **by night**, the road quietens considerably after the neighbouring food outlets close - KFC and Amigos 11pm and Papa Johns 11.30. Then after the evening flights into Heathrow end and there is little traffic, quietness descends. This is the time residents should be able to sleep.

We mustn't forget that although there are many retail units on the NER there are residents in flats above them, to all sides of them, and in all the neighbouring roads that would be affected greatly by an increase of hours, particularly with motorbike delivery services. For most of this area on the NER there is one floor of retail with three floors of flats above. Residential square footage far out weighing that of retail.

It's not just the increased hours but particularly the delivery only times that worry us as lot. This will result in noise as the drivers arrive/depart or congregate waiting for deliveries. We are not sure of the numbers of delivery bikes that would be used, but to make the business viable I suggest they will be quite numerous. One main route the scooters will take is past the front of our building along Vanston Place, cutting through the pedestrianised section beside Vagabond (illegally) and onto the Broadway. As I mentioned the NER and even more so Vanston Place, is currently a quiet area in the early hours of the morning and all noise like this is loud and troublesome, having a negative impact on our residents' sleep and in particular our children's sleep.

Along with the scooters racing past the front of our building it must be of concern when the riders reach their destination in the early hours. Neighbours will be woken by motorbikes arriving, bells ringing, conversations being had at the point of drop off. This will impact many residents' sleep and will have a negative effect on the promotion of licensing objective of prevention of public nuisance.

It is well documented that in this section of Fulham we have a high level of crime and disorder with people fighting, taking drugs, urinating on our residential premises and we feel that by increasing the hours will only add to this sort of anti-social behaviour.

Popeyes is next door to a bus stop (see attached image) and we are concerned that the early opening of 7 am may well encourage school children to take on board this fast food. This is something that should not be encouraged and by simply having a later opening time when school children are in school, say 9.30am, this would negate this issue.

Finally I would like to point out that as of today - 13th November there is no notice visible on the front of the premises detailing this application, which I believe there should be. My attached image was taken today at 11.34 am.

The Vanston Place Management Company objects to this application, on the grounds it would likely cause increased crime and disorder, noise and nuisance to local residents and also cause children harm.



Good evening,

I wish to submit an objection to this application from PLK Chicken Uk Limited to increase the opening hours at this premises known as Popeyes to 1am on Thursday to Saturday and for late night refreshment (to be used for deliveries) to 1am on certain nights and 2am on other nights.

I am writing in my capacity as Co-Chair of Walham Green Ward Panel, with this premises being situated in this ward. The premises is situated in a stretch of the North End Road which is classified as the crime hot spot of Fulham by the local Safer Neighbourhood team of the Metropolitan Police. The centre of the hotspot is MacDonalds at 312 North End Road, which is 2 minutes' walk from Popeyes.



This crime spot is regularly referred to at the quarterly ward panel meetings and has been the focus of a considerable amount of police time and resources to reduce crime and antisocial behaviour. There has also been a recent focus by the police on tackling rising crime and violence in the nearby Clem Atlee estate, which is only 5 minutes' walk from Popeyes.

Having extended hours at Popeyes will only add to the continuing policing challenges and is very likely to result in increased crime and anti-social behaviour on the North End Road and nearby side streets. This application does not support the licensing objectives of preventing crime and disorder and preventing public nuisance.

The application also ignore the impact of extended hours on local residents in the form of noise and pollution. The North End Road isn't solely a commercial street, there are many residents who live above the commercial premises the length of the road including several large mansion blocks. Residents including young children on the North End Road and side streets such as Shorrolds Road, Epirus Road and other nearby side streets will have their sleep disturbed by customers, delivery drivers collecting take away orders and delivery drivers delivering supplies to the premises. In addition to the direct noise at the premises, the residents will be woken by the sound of additional delivery drivers whizzing around. The noise of their e-bikes, motor scooters and motor bikes interrupts the sleep of residents and makes a significant contribution to the pollution in this built-up area. This conflicts with the licensing objectives of protecting children from harm and public safety.

The Walham Green Ward Panel and local residents would be very grateful if the Licensing Committee could please reject this application for extended hours and keep the existing hours.

Please accept this email as my written OBJECTION to the above application where the Applicant runs a Louisiana Chicken Restaurant/Takeaway. I am writing in my capacity as Secretary of the Fulham Island Residents Association (FIRA), and also as the owner of

Fulham Island comprises 32 flats, which are members of the Association, and a further 8 flats in Albion House (fronting Vanston Place), which are not part of the Association. We have approximately 80 residents ranging in age from 92 to 6 years of age, not including those in Albion House.

The Fulham Island site is bounded by two pedestrianised roads: Jerdan Place, Vanston Place and to a degree Farm Lane, as there is no through access on Farm Lane.

It is a very short walk from the North End Road and, inevitably, both Jerdan Place and Vanston Place are used as cut-throughs from the North End Road to Fulham Broadway and beyond.

My concerns are written under the headings of three of the four licensing objectives.

1. Prevention of crime and disorder

I am sure you are aware that the Metropolitan police have designated the NER as a "hotspot" for anti-social behaviour and disorder. Adding another takeaway, open until the early hours, even if it is just for "outside" deliveries and not in-person purchases can only add to the issue of public safety. There Is no mention in their application as to how they will prevent customers trying to access the takeaway after official closing times, as surely they will need the doors open for delivery drivers to enter.

The police are under-resourced at the best of times – more potential for crime and disorder will only exacerbate their ability to police our streets safely.

2. Prevention of nuisance

The wards of Walham Green, Lillie Road and West Kensington consist of residential roads, all leading off the semi-residential / semi-commercial North End Road (NER).

As residents of Fulham, we are becoming increasingly concerned with the increase in the number of take-aways situated on the NER, and the noise nuisance this causes.

Not only in terms of the delivery drivers themselves, who seem to totally disregard road safety, cutting in front of cars, not signalling etc., and who are a clear danger to other road users and pedestrians, but the noise their (mostly L-plated) scooters make, especially during the quiet hours of the night, when residents are sleeping.

The drivers generate noise whilst they congregate waiting for take-aways to deliver; noise as they speed away and noise when they deliver.

My particular road – Vanston Place, despite being partly pedestrianised and despite a prominent notice stating "no through route to Fulham Road" is regularly used as a cut through, to avoid the traffic lights on the corner of Dawes Road and NER and also the roundabout between NER and Fulham Road. The noise of the scooters at night is an issue.

We residents have a "window" of quiet for sleeping, which would be considerably jeopardised with delivery drivers on the roads up until

1.00 am. Sleep deprivation, which is well documented in Fulham, is a big issue for residents and any increase in noise generation will only have the potential to worsen the situation.

3. Public Safety

The applicant's premises are very close to a four-way junction of the NER, Shorrolds Road, Walham Grove and Vanston Place, all of which comprise 100% residential properties.

The delivery drivers at other take-away venues in the area all park outside the premises, waiting to collect deliveries (sometimes illegally).

If the Applicants' delivery drivers choose to congregate outside the applicant's premises, they will be parking on a designated bus stop, which will cause a public safety issue for other road users. The NER is constantly snarled up with traffic, and delivery bikes/scooters parked illegally, on a designated bus stop, will only exacerbate the traffic situation.

General Observations:

1. The "overview" on Google maps states that they are open from 8.00 am until 11.00 pm seven nights a week.

Their application to extend their opening hours asks for new hours as follows: 07.30 am daily until 12.00 am Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday and Sunday, and until 1.00 am Thursday, Friday and Saturday.

These closing hours are substantially beyond the closing hours of other "restaurants"/takeways already operating on the NER.

If the Committee approves this application then it is a foregone conclusion that the other establishments will seek to extend their hours of operation as well, to the detriment of all residents in the surrounding area.

This evaluation essentially states:

Introduction Access to hot food takeaways, particularly near schools, is of growing concern for policymakers seeking to reduce childhood obesity globally. In England, United Kingdom (UK), local government jurisdictions are implementing planning policies to reduce access by restricting or denying planning permission for new takeaway outlets near schools.

Results Participants explained that they mostly thought the policies facilitated the refusal of applications for new takeaways near schools. However, participants speculated that businesses identified alternative opportunities to operate including functioning as 'restaurants' or within other locations. Effective working relationships between planners and public health officers were important for adoption and implementation, although planning and public health agendas did not always align and there were tensions between economic development and health improvement goals.

Conclusion Although sometimes challenging, the policies were commonly described as feasible to implement. However, they may not completely prevent new takeaways opening, particularly where takeaways are relied upon to enhance local economies or where takeaway businesses find alternative ways to operate. Nevertheless, the policies can serve to shift the balance of power that currently favours commercial interests over public health priorities.

ALSO:

In <u>London</u>, <u>a ban on fast-food takeaways</u> opening within 400 metres of schools was put in place in 2017, in an attempt to tackle the <u>capital's child obesity epidemic</u>. The Mayor said the move would help deal with the "ticking time bomb" of childhood obesity in London.

The new Fulham Boys School on the Fulham Road is 321.869 metres from Popeyes, and clearly falls within the ban implemented by the mayor of London in 2017.

For these reasons and the further reasons set out by other residents, I ask the H&F Licensing Sub-Committee to reject the application.

I am writing to formally object to the premises licence application for late-night operations at Popeyes, 348 North End Road, London SW6 1NB. I am a resident of 346C North End Road, and my neighbours and I have already experienced considerable disturbance due to noise from this establishment.

- 1. Noise During Renovations: On multiple occasions during renovations, Popeyes played loud music at 1:00 AM and 2:00 AM for three consecutive days. The noise was loud enough to travel through the building's structure, disturbing residents in adjacent apartments. I personally had to go downstairs several times to request they lower the volume. Other residents, including Andrew Noakes of 346B and Yann of 348B, also experienced similar disruptions.
- 2. Noise from Fridge Units: Popeyes has installed fridge units behind the building, directly adjacent to the bedrooms of flats 346B, 346C, and 348B. These units produce a high-pitched noise that disrupts our sleep, especially during the night. Despite our repeated requests to management to address this issue, their response has been dismissive. One manager even remarked, "I have Heathrow planes flying over my house, why are you complaining?"
- 3. Planning Concerns: To the best of my knowledge, some of these fridge units were installed without proper planning permission from the council. This disregard for proper procedures further raises concerns about the company's commitment to being a responsible and considerate neighbor.

Given these past incidents and Popeyes' apparent lack of respect for the surrounding community, I strongly believe they are not capable of managing noise levels during latenight hours. Approving this application would likely lead to ongoing disruptions and further negative impact on residents' quality of life.

I am writing to formally object to the license application reference 2024/01664/LAPR submitted by PLK Chicken Uk Limited for extended opening hours from 7:00 AM to 2:30 AM. As a resident of North End Road, I am concerned about the potential impact of this application on our community.

Reasons for Objection:

- 1. Prevention of crime and Disorder: Operating a food establishment until 2:30 am in a residential area may attract patrons involved in late-night drinking and socializing, increasing the risk of criminal behavior. Late-night openings often correlate with heightened incidents of public disorder, vandalism, and anti-social behavior, which could disrupt the safety and peace of the community. Additionally, extended hours could place a strain on local police resources, detracting from overall community safety.
- 2. Public Safety: Late-night opening hours could lead to increased risks of anti-social behavior, including noise and altercations, compromising neighborhood safety. With customers likely to congregate outside or around the shop, especially during late hours, there is a greater likelihood of disturbances. This could inadvertently encourage loitering in the area, increasing the potential for accidents and confrontations. Operating late in a largely residential zone jeopardizes the welfare of residents, who may feel unsafe traversing the area.
- 3. **Prevention of Public Nuisance:** Extended hours may lead to increased noise and smell levels during the late night and early morning hours, negatively affecting the quality of life for nearby residents. The area is primarily residential, and late-night

operations could disrupt the peaceful environment that we currently enjoy. Additionally, Delivery drivers arriving on scooters and motorcycles contribute to loud noise, both in front of the shop on North End Road and on Shorrolds Road where they usually gather. There is also an existing issue with littering; many neighbors including myself, have reported bags and leftover food littered on the street. Extended hours will likely exacerbate this problem.

4. The Protection of Children From Harm: Late operating hours for a fast-food chain in a residential area raise significant concerns for the well-being of children. The noise and disturbances mentioned above could disrupt the sleep of residents, including children. North End Road is home to some of the most vulnerable families in the borough, and disturbed sleep can adversely affect children's school performance. Furthermore, children walking in the area late in the evening may encounter undesirable activity or individuals, creating risks that would be mitigated with earlier closing hours.

I respectfully urge the council to consider these points and deny the application for extended hours. I believe that maintaining a balance between local business operations and the quality of life for residents is essential.



and have been for 24 years. We live a walk away from the Application site. The site is in an intensely residential area with 100% residential roads in the immediate and very close proximity. These roads include Shorrolds, Epirus, Tournay, Walham Grove, Farm Lane, Vanston Place, Eustace, Armadale, Halford, Haldane, Knivet, Anselm, Racton, Barclay, Dawes being just those on the doorstep.

The applicant wants to extend their opening hours for late night refreshment (on and off the premises) from 23:00 to 01:00 Sunday – Wednesday (so plus 2 hours for deliveries) and 23:00 – 02:00 Thursday – Saturday (plus 3 hours for deliveries). Our objection and very real concerns about this application are that, in summary, it is inconsistent with the licensing objectives because:

the proposed extended hours fall significantly outside those recommended for mixed use (residential/commercial areas) for takeaways (the recommended closing time in the LBHF Statement of Licensing Policy 2022 – 2027 is Friday/Saturday 00:30 and Sunday 23:30 – page 22). I note that the application is for hours which also fall outside the guide hours for town centres or extended town centres! Whilst guidance is not binding it is a useful and sensible set of handrails by reference to which decisions should be made on the merits or otherwise of each case;

- 2. this will risk a significant increase in the noise nuisance to residents caused by dispatch riders/food delivery motorbike drivers (Getir, Uber, Just Eat etc.). The vast majority of riders drive pollution emitting diesel or petrol motorbikes (not bicycles or electric bikes) that regularly travel at speeds in excess of the speed limit, are noisy when they use 100% residential roads to find the fastest route to make a delivery and also make noise at the point of delivery;
- 3. the noise nuisance will take place during the hours critical to sleep and in which each resident has a right to sleep and quietly enjoy their property at night sleep is essential for all; a chicken burger is a nice to have luxury for some;

If half (16) the other takeaways follow suit in addition to the Applicant, then that is 765 deliveries in this area per night seven days a week. How can LBHF prevent this if they grant this application? There is no cap on this and in truth the numbers could be much much larger. We note that there is no enforceable condition that could be attached to any license to prevent this;
- 6. condition 8 is meaningless and unenforceable in any real sense in the face of the nuisance caused by the congregation of numbers of drivers and people at the site and the immediate vicinity and the noise nuisance referred to above. The reality is that once drivers and customers have left the site there is nothing the applicant can do to prevent crime. Disorder or noise nuisance;

- 7. there is a significant public safety issue with the ever-increasing use of unregulated delivery drivers. As you know residents must pay to park on the road they live on (in addition to paying Council Tax and the usual car tax and cost of insurance as required by law). Dispatch/delivery riders are neither required to register with LBHF, pay to park on any road and to operate their vehicle they are not required to hold anything more than a "L plate". For me to insure my car I must have a full driver's license - a mere L plate is not acceptable. The standard of driving of delivery/dispatch riders for the large part is poor. They consistently exceed the speed limit, park on pavements, fail to signal, drive on the wrong side of the road, fail to stop at junctions and become irate if you don't give them enough space when they do so, they very often play roulette by forcing drivers to stop when they speed into small and narrow spaces, they cut in without signalling and rarely look left or right when pulling out rather they expect everyone else t break and let them through. Sadly, several residents have had their vehicles scratched and damaged by this type of activity. The fundamental point is that in increasing the demand for and use of such riders (if they allow this application) LBHF will be sanctioning and permitting a significantly lower standard of driving by L plate riders when compared to the legal requirements of fully insured, permit paying, full license holding residents. The motorcycle bay on our road is not used by residents because it is overrun by dispatch/delivery riders from early in the morning to late at night. The numbers far outweigh the allotted parking space, so they encroach into the resident parking bays which we have paid to use. They are effectively allowed to carry out a commercial activity on residential roads for free 7 days a week when we must pay to park and comply with higher (and rightly safer) driving standards;
- 8. whilst earlier decisions of the licensing committee on the same issue of late opening hours opening are not binding, it is noted that recently the committee has recognised the above concerns by rejecting applications from the likes of Papa Johns, Selekt Chicken, Morleys and others. This is an important indication and reflection of the Committee's view of how the Committee consistently balances the competing issues on applications like these; and
- 9. the extension of early hour opening times is also extremely concerning given that the application site is right next to a bus stop that is used by large numbers of school children.

Please consider this a statement of objection to the licensing application from Popeye's Chicken. As a resident on nearby , we are plagued by delivery drivers both from a noise, disturbance and criminal standpoint. If they are permitted to operate late into the night, this will disturb the sleep of the hardworking residents and their children nearby even more. Need I remind you of the severe implications of lack of sleep on mental health and school attainment (protection of children from harm).

Additionally, on many occasions I have witnessed the illegal behaviour of these delivery drivers (Crime). For example, they frequently drive illegally at 60+mph the wrong way down Haldane Road, to reach their fast food outlets faster so they can make more money, from more deliveries, with total disregard for other vehicles going the right way, as well as pedestrians / animals on what should be a quiet residential street (public safety). Additionally, they park their bikes in the middle of the road and pavements, making it impossible to enter the street either by foot or by vehicle (public nuisance), also restricting wheelchair access for some senior residents who live on the street. Thank you for your email.

Assuming my late response is still relevant, I would still object on the grounds of likelihood of noise nuisance from the food delivery riders ((loud voices, loud music and revving of moped engines) which would disturb the sleep of local residents.

From my experience, food business operators (FBOs) tend to de-associate themselves from the activities of the food despatch riders, arguing that they are 'self-employed' persons/contractors.

On a more positive note, the adjusted hours are better, seeing the Noise Team will still be on duty during those hours to investigate any complaints from residents.

In the event that the Council opts to grant the extended hours of operation, I would strongly recommend that the FBO be requested to provide a written undertaking that they will be responsible for the management and supervision of the despatch riders so as not to cause nuisance to nearby occupied residential premises. This should also be inserted as a **condition** of the new licence.
