SUMMARY OF DECISION

The Committee has considered an application for new premises licence for the sale of alcohol off the premises under the Licensing Act 2003 ("the Application").

In summary, the Committee has decided, after taking into account all of the individual circumstances of this case and the promotion of the four licensing objectives to:

1. Grant the Application as follows:

Sale by Retail of Alcohol - Off the Premises

Mondays to Saturdays 09:00 to 23:00

Sunday 09:00 to 22:00

2. The opening hours of the premises are:
Mondays to Sunday between the hours of 08:00 to 23:00.

3. The Licence is subject to any mandatory conditions.

4. The Licence is subject to the conditions proposed by the Applicant as amended by the Committee.
5. The licence is subject to the conditions proposed by Trading Standards as amended by the Committee.
6. The Licence is subject to the following additional conditions proposed by the Committee.
 1. A responsible member of staff shall organise and accommodate meetings to discuss the operation of the premises with residents at least two times per calendar year. The meeting shall be advertised at least 14 days before its due date by letter to residents and residents' associations in the locality as well as to the Licensing Authority.
 2. A telephone number for the premises, or a responsible member of staff on duty, shall be displayed so that it is visible from the public highway for members of the public to lodge complaints.

This licence becomes operational with immediate effect. If problems are experienced, then an application for a review of the premises licence can be made.

A copy of this Committee's full decision including its reasons and the full text of the conditions added to the licence will be sent to the parties forthwith.

If the Applicant or any person who has made a relevant representation is unhappy with the decision, they are entitled to appeal to the magistrates' court within 21 days from the date of notification of the full decision.
