SUMMARY OF DECISION

**PLANET PLENTY, 123-125 WANDSWORTH BRIDGE ROAD, LONDON, SW6 2TS
("THE PREMISES")**

The Committee has considered an application for a variation of the existing premises licence under the Licensing Act 2003 ("the Application") as follows:

1. Varying the hours for the sale of alcohol off the Premises

Mondays to Saturdays 07:30 to 23:00

Sundays 08:00 to 23:00

Non-Standard Timing on New Years Eve to 00:00 (Midnight)

2. Varying the opening hours the Premises is opened to the public

Mondays to Saturdays 07:30 to 23:00 Sundays 08:00 to 23:00 Non-Standard Timing:
On New Years Eve to 00:00 (Midnight)

3. Remove condition 10 of the existing premises licence which state

10. No super-strength beer, lagers or ciders of 5.5% ABV (alcohol by volume) or above shall be sold at the premises save for premium beer or ciders in glass bottles unless agreed in writing with the metropolitan police.

In summary, the Committee has decided, after taking into account all of the individual circumstances of this case and the promotion of the four licensing objectives to grant the application in part as follows:

a) The Committee has agreed to vary the hours for the sale of alcohol off the Premises and the hours the Premises is opened to the public as proposed by the Applicant.

b) The Committee did not agree to remove condition 10 from the existing licence.

A copy of this Committee's full decision including its reasons will be sent to the parties forthwith.

If the Applicant or any person who has made a relevant representation is unhappy with the decision they are entitled to appeal to the magistrates' court within 21 days from the date of notification of the full decision
