Sunday: 12:00 to 23:00

3. The Licence is subject to any mandatory conditions.
4. The licence is subject to the conditions proposed by the Applicant as amended by the Committee.
5. The licence is subject to the conditions proposed by the Police and agreed by the Applicant.
6. The Licence is subject to the following additional conditions proposed by the Committee:
 - a. A responsible member of staff shall carry out proactive litter patrols outside the premises at least **6 times** throughout the premises' opening hours and specifically at the end of trading hours to ensure that there is no litter associated with the premises in the immediate vicinity and any such litter found shall be collected and returned to the premises for disposal with the premises' normal waste / refuse collection.
 - b. Signs shall be prominently displayed at the exits from the premises asking patrons to dispose of their waste in litter bins.

This licence becomes operational with immediate effect. If problems are experienced, then an application for a review of the premises licence can be made.
