SUMMARY OF DECISION

The Committee has considered an application for the variation of a premises licence of the following:

Expansion of the red line of licensable activity
The Supply of Alcohol (On and Off the Premises)
Hours Open to the Public
under the Licensing Act 2003 ("the Application").

In summary, the Committee has decided, after taking into account all of the individual circumstances of this case and the promotion of the four licensing objectives to:

1. Grant the Application as follows:

Expansion of the red line of licensable activity:

To include outside the premises building, as per Appendix 2 proposed premises licence plan.

The Supply of Alcohol (Off the Premises):

Monday to Sunday: 08:00 to 23:00.

The Supply of Alcohol (On the Premises):

Monday to Sunday: 08:00 to 23:00 (inside building). 08:00 to 22:00 (outside building).

Hours Open to the Public:

Monday to Sunday: 07:00 to 23:00.

- 2. To add the conditions proposed by the Police and agreed by the Applicant.
- 3. To add the following conditions proposed by the Committee:
- 1. A responsible member of staff shall organise and accommodate meetings to discuss the operation of the premises with residents at least once per calendar year. The meeting shall be advertised at least 14 days before its due date by letter to residents and residents' associations in the locality as well as to the Licensing Authority.

This licence becomes operational with immediate effect. If problems are experienced, then an application for a review of the premises licence can be made.

A copy of this Committee's full decision including its reasons and the full text of the conditions added to the licence will be sent to the parties forthwith.

If the Applicant or any person who has made a relevant representation is unhappy with the decision, they are entitled to appeal to the magistrates' court within 21 days from the date of notification of the full decision.

Sunday to Wednesday: 09:00 to 23:00. Thursday to Saturday: 09:00 to 00:00.

2. The opening hours of the Premises are as follows:

Hours Open to the Public:

Sunday to Wednesday: 07:00 to 23:00. Thursday to Saturday: 07:00 to 00:00.

- 3. The licence is subject to any mandatory conditions.
- 4. The licence is subject to the conditions proposed by the Applicant as amended by the Committee.
- 5. The licence is subject to the conditions proposed by the Police and agreed by the Applicant

This licence becomes operational with immediate effect. If problems are experienced, then an application for a review of the premises licence can be made.

A copy of this Committee's full decision including its reasons and the full text of the conditions added to the licence will be sent to the parties forthwith.
