SUMMARY OF DECISION

The Committee has considered an application for the grant of a timed premises licence under the Licensing Act 2003 for the performance of live and recorded music,

performance of a play, exhibition of films, performance of dance and sale of alcohol only (“the Application”)

In summary, the Committee has decided, after taking into account all of the individual circumstances of this case and the promotion of the four licensing objectives to:

1. Grant the Application for a time limited for one day only on 16 June 2026 as follows:

Performance of a Play - (Indoors and Outdoors): 16:00 – 23:00

Exhibition of Films - (Indoors and Outdoors): 16:00 – 23:00

Playing of Live Music - (Indoors and Outdoors): 16:00 – 23:00

Playing of Recorded Music - (Indoors and Outdoors): 16:00 – 23:00

Performance of Dance - (Indoors and Outdoors): 16:00 – 23:00

Supply of Alcohol – (On Sales Only): 16:00 – 23:00

2. The hours the Premises is open on 16 June 2026 are as follows:

16:00 – 23:30

3. The licence is subject to any mandatory conditions
4. The licence is subject to the conditions proposed by the Applicant

This licence becomes operational with immediate effect. If problems are experienced, then an application for a review of the premises licence can be made.

A copy of this Committee’s full decision including its reasons and the full text of the conditions added to the licence will be sent to the parties forthwith.

If the Applicant is unhappy with the decision they are entitled to appeal to the magistrates’ court within 21 days from the date of notification of the full decision.

RECORD OF PROCEEDING

A review application under section 51 of the Licensing Act 2003 (“the Application”) was submitted by Trading Standards Officer, Mr Doug Love, lead practitioner of Hammersmith and Fulham Council’s Trading Standards Team on 16 December 2025. The Application was accepted and duly advertised in accordance with the statutory requirements. No responsible authority or other person submitted any relevant representations during the consultation period.

On 13 February 2026 prior to the scheduled hearing, the Applicant notified the Licensing Authority in writing of their decision to withdraw the review application.

The Sub-Committee noted:

- the withdrawal of the review Application;
- that no valid relevant representations have been made by any responsible authority or interested party; and
- that an agreement has been reached between the Applicant and the Premises Licence Holder to add one additional condition to the existing licence and to amend condition 17 attached to the existing licence by way of a minor variation as follows:

Add a new additional condition to the existing licence as follows:

- The DPS or manager shall ensure that when written enquiries are received from a Responsible Authority that an initial response is made within five working days of the original enquiry with a substantive response within an agreed timeframe to follow.”

The existing condition 17 is to be amended as follows:

- 17. Strong beer and cider above 5.5% ABV shall not be displayed or sold with the exception of craft beers and craft ciders (‘craft’ in the context of this condition to refer to products using premium ingredients, brewed in small batches using traditional brewing techniques- as opposed to mass produced products).

All other hours activities and conditions are to remain unchanged.

The Sub-Committee therefore closed the hearing without making a determination.
