SUMMARY OF DECISION

The Committee has considered an application for the grant of a premises licence under the Licensing Act 2003 for the provision of late-night refreshment (Indoors and Outdoors) (“the Application”)

In summary, the Committee has decided, after taking into account all of the individual circumstances of this case and the promotion of the four licensing objectives to grant the application as follows:

1. The Provision of Late-Night Refreshment (Indoors and Outdoors):
Sunday to Thursday: 23:00 to 00:00
Friday and Saturday: 23:00 to 01:00

2. The hours the Premises to be open to the public are as follows:
Sunday to Thursday: 08:00 to 00:00
Friday and Saturday: 08:00 to 01:00

3. To impose to the Licence the conditions proposed by the Police and agreed by the Applicant
4. To impose to this Licence the existing condition 8 (restricting the use of the first-floor terrace area to 22:00) and also conditions 10, 11, 14, 18, 19, 22 and 24 attached to the premises licence number 2019/00248/LAPR as amended by the committee where appropriate.

A copy of this Committee's full decision including its reasons and the full text of the conditions added to the licence will be sent to the parties forthwith.

If the Applicant or any person who has made a relevant representation is unhappy with the decision, they are entitled to appeal to the magistrates' court within 21 days from the date of notification of the full decision
