Reasons for Urgency:

The final schools budget allocation from the Education & Skills Funding Agency was received in late December 2018. The deadline for submission of final 2019/2020 Schools Budget Authority Proforma Tool to the Education & Skills Funding Agency is the 21st January 2018 and requires both Schools Forum and Local Authority approval.

Following Schools Forum on the 15<sup>th</sup> January 2019, a Leaders Urgency Decision is required to confirm the proposed schools budget shares by early February 2019. With regard to Hammersmith & Fulham, timescales for the production of cabinet reports mean that this approval can only be obtained by means of a Leader's Urgency Decision Report.

## 1. EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

- 1.1. This report seeks approval of the final proposed 2019/20 schools block allocation and funding to schools through the schools funding formula for the financial year ending 31<sup>st</sup> March 2020.
- 1.2. In December 2018, the Department for Education (DfE) issued the final 2019/20 schools block allocations and the final version of the Authority Proforma Tool (APT). This information enables the local authority to finalise the 2019/20 Individual Schools Budget (ISB) by the DfE's final submission deadline of the 21st January 2019.
- 1.3. A total schools block of £102,876,000 has been confirmed for Hammersmith and Fulham for 2019/20, representing a 0.37% increase per pupil in cash terms versus 2018/19 (and a 1.0% increase versus 2017/18 baseline). It should be noted that schools face significant cost pressures and therefore a real terms reduction in grant funding.
- 1.4. There is some discretion over the local formula as part of the transition to the National Funding Formula (NFF) in 2021/22. The local formula is set within the NFF transitional regulations and guidance as set by the DfE and The Education & Skills Funding Agency (ESFA).
- 1.5. Hammersmith and Fulham Schools Forum agreed the model for 2019/20 budget shares as per the recommendations below on 15<sup>th</sup> January 2019. The ESFA require political endorsement of the schools' forum decision to agree the 2019/20 budget.
- 1.6. An allocation of £74,624 is recommended to the schools listed in 2.4 below which will leave £150,375 of the falling roles fund unallocated and subject to future allocation in liaison with Hammersmith and Fulham Schools Forum. These allocations were approved at the Schools Forum on 15<sup>th</sup> January 2019. Since Schools Forum, an allocation of £20,470 for one school is no longer recommended as the roll reduction is as a result of a bulge class aging out.

# 2. **RECOMMENDATIONS**

- 2.1. To approve the Local Authority formula for allocating resources to Hammersmith & Fulham schools for 2019/20 as set out in Appendix 1, the Authority Proforma Tool (APT) for setting school budgets.
- 2.2. To approve the NFF transitional factors (as set out in Appendix 1 and explained more fully in Appendix 2) as the basis for calculating the 2019/20 schools funding formula, together with a 0.5% per pupil Minimum Funding Guarantee (MFG) protection for individual schools versus 2018/19 funding levels.
- 2.3. To approve the dis-application request to transfer £1m (0.97% of the total schools block allocation) from the schools block to the high needs block in the 2019/20 financial year.

2.4. To approve one off falling rolls protection is awarded to schools with greater than 5% but no more than 20% role reduction year on year to allow support to schools as action is taken to mitigate or reverse the impact of the falling roll, excluding schools where there is a pre- known roll reduction because of a bulge class ageing out. That £74,624 be allocated to the schools listed below:

- 2.5. To approve a provision of up to £148,000 within the remaining unallocated falling roles provision in paragraph 2.4 to provide falling roles protection for one academy secondary school subject to achieving a good or outstanding Ofsted rating in the next financial year in line with government regulations for falling roles financial support.
- 2.6. To approve that the Cabinet Member for Children and Education be delegated decision-making authority with respect to the remaining falling roles provision up to £148,000, on recommendation of the Director of Children's Services and in consultation with Schools Forum.
- 2.7. To approve £706,000 of schools' block budgets be allocated to maintained schools through the Authority Proforma Tool are de-delegated back to the local authority in line with 2018/19. Dedelegation is the process in Schools Finance regulations whereby delegated schools funding is returned to Council control.

# 3. REASONS FOR DECISION

- 3.1. School's budget shares from the schools' block of the Dedicated Schools Grant are agreed annually according to the process and regulations set out by the Education and Schools Funding Agency.
- 3.2. Schools Forum and the Local Authority must approve the basis for the allocation to schools in January/Early February.

- 3.3. Hammersmith and Fulham Schools Forum agreed the budget model proposed at a meeting on the 15<sup>th</sup> January 2019.
- 3.4. The recommended model of distribution through the Authority Proforma tool provides stability to schools in 2019/20 by ensuring that schools benefit from a 0.5% minimum funding guarantee on a per pupil basis as illustrated in the provisional schools' budget shares by school detailed in appendix 3.
- 3.5. These factors represent a one third move towards NFF rates from the 2018/19 local formula rates used, before each factor being uprated by 3.4% to ensure the full schools block allocation is distributed to schools.
- 3.6. The ESFA require confirmation of schools' budget approval in order to pass the request for £1,000,000 transfer from the schools block to high needs block for Ministerial approval.

# 4. CONSULTATION

- 4.1. The local authority consulted with Schools Forum in November 2018 with respect to two potential models for the distribution of the provisional schools block allocation advised in July 2018 by the ESFA. Two different models were discussed. One based around the current local model for Hammersmith and Fulham and another based on a transitional move to NFF rates. Schools Forum indicated a preference for the latter model.
- 4.2. The local authority consulted with the wider schools' community in November and December 2018 with respect to the proposed options for budget allocation. A budget workshop was held for schools to review the key elements of the proposed model on 8<sup>th</sup> January 2019. This included details of these proposals and the updated provisional allocations based on the final Hammersmith and Fulham allocation by the ESFA.

# 5. EQUALITY IMPLICATIONS

- 5.1. The adoption of the 2019/20 school budget formula acknowledges the need to target investment at schools with high levels of deprivation and additional education need. This is inherent in the transition to the government's National Funding Formula for schools and in the funding proposed to be ringfenced to support Special Educational needs.
- 5.2. The Council has submitted a disapplication request to the ESFA, with LBHF Schools Forum agreement, to move up to 1% of Schools Block DSG to the High Needs block DSG in 2019/20. There is a Minimum Funding Guarantee built into the Schools Block formula, which ensures a minimum funding guarantee for each school for the financial year 2019/20 versus 2018/19. The transfer of

funding will revert back to the schools' block in subsequent years, and would require an annual decision to continue to make this transfer in the future.

#### 7. FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

- 7.1. This report covers the allocation of the amount received by the local authority for the distribution of funds within the Schools Block of the Dedicated Schools Grant across all schools in line with the regulated range of allowable variables.
- 7.2. A disapplication of the regulations has been requested by the local authority to the EFSA with respect to a proposed transfer of £1m from the schools block to the high needs block of the dedicated schools grant. A disapplication is required to transfer more than 0.5% of the total schools block per the grant regulations. This is to support children in Hammersmith and Fulham with Special Educational Needs where current demand led expenditure against the high needs block of the Dedicated Schools Grant is forecast to exceed the grant funding allocation received by the London Borough of Hammersmith and Fulham from the Education & Skills Funding Agency.
- 7.3. Agreement to this transfer was confirmed at Schools Forum on the 15<sup>th</sup> January 2019 and the transfer disapplication is progressing with the EFSA. Other than the proposed transfer between blocks, the remaining funds are distributed to individual schools in line with their individual characteristics and with regard to the local formula.
- 7.4. The budget for the falling rolls protection fund for 2019/20 is available from the unallocated falling rolls budget top sliced from the 2018/19 budget shares. No additional top slice of the 2019/20 budget is proposed in the recommended model for 2019/20.
