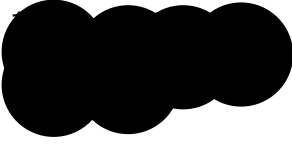

Annex 1 – Mandatory Conditions

1. Mandatory Condition

(1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.

(2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises—

(a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to—

(i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or

(ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);

(b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;

(c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;

(d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner;

(e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of disability).

2. Mandatory Condition

The responsible person shall ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.

3. Mandatory Condition

1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an

age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.

(2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.

(3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either—

- (a) a holographic mark, or
- (b) an ultraviolet feature.

4. Mandatory Condition

The responsible person must ensure that—

(a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures—

- (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
- (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
- (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml;

(b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and

(c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.

5. Mandatory Condition

1. A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.

2. For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 1—

(a) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979;

(b) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula—

$$P = D + (D \times V)$$

where—

- (i) P is the permitted price,
- (ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
- (iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;

(c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence—

- (i) the holder of the premises licence,
- (ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
- (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under

such a licence;

(d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and

(e) "value added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.

3. Where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.

4.(1) Sub-paragraph (2) applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.

(2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

6. Mandatory Condition

(1) No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence-

(a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or

(b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.

(2) Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

Annex 2 – Conditions consistent with the operating Schedule

7. High Definition CCTV shall be installed, operated and maintained at all times that the Premises are open for licensable activities and;

a) shall be checked every two weeks to ensure that the system is working properly and that the date and time are correct. A record of these checks, showing the date and name of the person checking, shall be kept and made available at the Police or authorised Council officers on request;

b) one camera shall show a close-up of the entrance/s to the Premises to capture a clear, full length image of anyone entering;

c) shall cover any external area of the Premises accessible to public;

d) recordings shall be in real time and stored for a minimum of 31 days with date and time stamping;

e) footage shall be provided free of charge to Police or authorised Council's officers within 24 hours of a request;

f) a staff member from the premises that is conversant with the operation of the CCTV system shall be on the premises at all times. This staff member will be able to

show police or authorised officers of the Licensing Authority recent data footage with the minimum of delay when requested. This data or footage reproduction shall be almost instantaneous.

8. Membership of the local Pub Watch scheme shall be entered into when in operation.

9. Alcohol shall not be consumed other than during permitted hours for the sale of alcohol and during a 30-minute period immediately following permitted hours.

10. Appropriate signage shall be displayed in prominent positions, informing customers they are being recorded on CCTV.

11. All staff responsible for selling alcohol shall receive regular training in the Licensing Act 2003 in terms of the licensing objectives, offences committed under the Act and conditions of the Premises Licence. Written records of this training shall be retained and made available to police and authorised officers of the Licensing Authority on request.

12. All staff shall be trained in how to manage a crime scene and crime scene preservation. This training shall be repeated at least once a year and written records of the training kept on the premise and made available to Police and authorised officers of the Licensing Authority on request.

13. No noise or vibration associated with the operation of plant at the Premises shall give rise to a nuisance to the occupiers of the neighbouring properties.

14. No smell generated from the cooking process at the Premises shall give rise to nuisance to occupiers of the neighbouring properties.

15. Rubbish including bottles or cans shall not be deposited outside the Premises and refuse, collections and deliveries shall not take place between 23:00 hours and 07:00 hours the following day.

16. The Licence Holder shall make available to all residents a dedicated telephone number that shall be staffed at all times when the Premises are operating to which complaints of any noise or disturbance may be addressed. The number shall be circulated to all residents with close proximity to the Premises on at least one occasion every three months.

17. The Licence Holder shall keep a record of complaints received, including the complainant's name, the date and time, nature of the incident complained of and subsequent remedial action undertaken. This record shall be kept available for inspection at all reasonable times by the Council's licensing officers.

18. A notice displaying the conditions of the Premise Licence shall be displayed in prominent position at the Premises where they can easily be seen and read by staff members.

19. The premises shall operate a Challenge 25 age restricted sales policy and shall display appropriate signage advising customers of this policy.

20. The number of persons permitted in the restaurant external seating area shall be limited to (excluding staff) 32 persons at any time.

21. Licensable activities in the restaurant external seating area shall stop at 20.30 and in accordance with the external tables & chairs management procedure during the new permitted hours.

22. Licensable activities in the restaurant external seating area shall be limited to seated customers and waiter/waitress service.

23. The restaurant external seating area shall be monitored by staff at all times whilst open to the public.

24. Customers and staff shall be prohibited from accessing the alleyway and using the restaurant alleyway exit/entry after 22:00.

25. Subject to planning approval and in consultation with the Queens Wharf and Chancellors Wharf Residents Associations the Premises Licence Holder shall erect a soundproof structure over the terrace area (as delineated on the plan) in order to minimise noise emanating from customers.

26. The Premises Licence Holder shall ensure that adequate sound proofing is installed in the restaurant.

27. Smoking shall be prohibited in the restaurant external seating area.

28. The Premises shall operate a written dispersal policy and all relevant staff shall be trained in its implementation.

29. The terrace and restaurant external area shall be closed at 21:00 Monday Sunday and access will be prevented to patrons from this time.

30. Off sale of alcohol are limited to outside catering and home delivery service.

Annex 3 – Conditions attached after a hearing by the licensing authority

31. All emergency doors at the Premises to remain closed at all times and used only in emergencies.

32. All windows at the front of the Premises to be closed at 22:00 everyday.

33. The licence holder shall arrange and accommodate a meeting within a month of the anniversary of the grant of the licence to discuss the operation of the premises with residents /resident associations and other interested parties (including councillors and responsible authorities if available). The meeting shall be advertised before its due date to all interested parties within the locality.

34. Signs to be displayed in the outside area reminding customers that smoking is not allowed in the restaurant external area and in the alleyway.

35. No new customers to be allowed to enter the Premises after 23:00.

36. The consumption of alcohol without a meal shall only be permitted until 21:00 in the bar area shown cross hatched on the attached plan.

37. After 21:00, alcohol shall only be served ancillary to a table meal in the licensed area.
