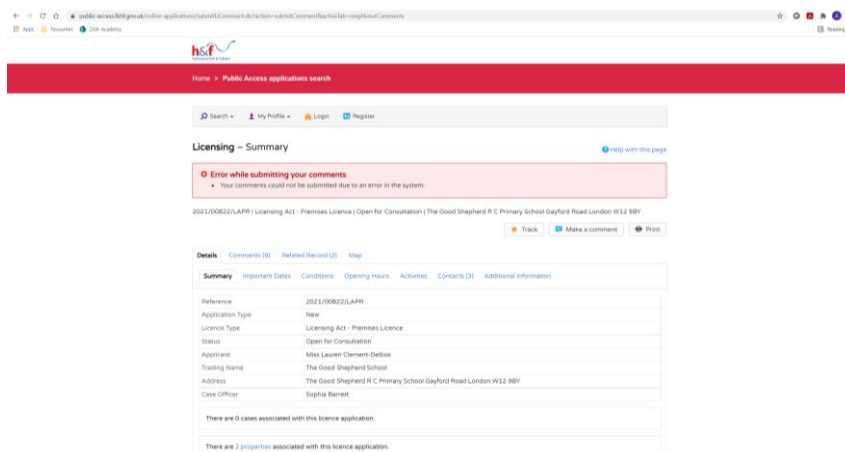

**Our Comments:**

Our house is adjacent to the school, as well as the side entrance to the school on Rylett Road. We already witness an increase in traffic in the early hours of Sunday morning with delivery vans

unloading and setting up their stalls for the farmers market, and there is also significant noise during the day, not only by the music being played, but also (naturally) by the visitors to the market.

This license effectively provides the school the ability to run indoor and outdoor events on Thu, Fri, Sat & Sun, and not only that, but everyone knows full well that events where alcohol is being served, will naturally become noisier as people lose their inhibitions.

This is a highly residential area, with many back gardens and houses immediately adjacent to the school and its playground, and therefore this location is not at all suitable for recreational use in combination with the use of alcohol.

I'm also concerned about how well noise levels will be managed. Not so long ago (a couple of months), the school alarm had gone off around 11.30pm. No one attended to this until the the next morning. We asked the school for an explanation and what steps and measures would be taken to prevent this happening in the future, and whilst the school did write to the residents (after I called them and asked for a statement), the letter did not give us any details on what would be done differently to ensure this doesn't happen again. I have little confidence that school management will take the matter of minimising the inconvenience of outdoor events/use of alcohol, to residents seriously.

A school is not a place where alcohol should be consumed, nor is this location in any way suitable to host extra-curricular events for purposes other than education. Therefore, I object strongly to this application, as I believe it will severely impact the quality of life of the adjacent residents and families, of which there are many, including people with young children.
