This location, at the top of Loftus Road and off the Uxbridge Road, is an area of high crime and anti social behaviour. This is a residential area where residents are heavily impacted on by local businesses who use delivery drivers and are hubs for taxi drivers and magnets for groups to gather during the day but also cause more of a concern to residents at night. Complaints are not seasonal. Whilst the majority of shops are cafe's and take aways I feel to have an additional outlet selling alcohol is a recipe for disaster. Also, for 1-11/2 hours at the end of the evening (could have read this incorrectly) does not seem profitable.

Thank you for your email.

My representation still remains as there is currently no indication of how staff are able to monitor delivery drivers / riders collecting from them. The area is already overrun with delivery drivers who use residential streets to wait for collections. Loftus Road itself is a hotspot location for Community Safety, Police, Parking, ASB and other teams for this reason alone.

There is already a café on the other corner (to the right) of Tigers Diner who we receive regular complaints about. From my experience, take away businesses operating adjacent or on residential streets cause issues with the local residents. Issues which stem from blocking pavements when they congregate, idle vehicles, noise from groups talking / hanging around, litter from cigarettes to food/drink packaging, spitting, illegally parking, motorbikes on pavements and in some instances drug taking.

I appreciate the need to see businesses thrive in this economic climate but knowing the issues already facing this location, I can but only object and let the panel decide.
