Dear Sir/Madam, our current premises license starts at 11.00am we have a lot of customers that ask us for alcohol before that but we cannot supply due to our timing restrictions in the license. It would be heavily appreciated if you can change our licensing timing from 8.00am. In addition to that our license finishes at 23.00pm Mon-Sat and at 22.30 on Sundays we would also like to change the timing for that to midnight from Mon-Thurs and Fridays and Saturdays till 1.00am and 23.00 on Sundays. Besides that we are not permitted to sell beers more than 5.5%, we would also appreciate if you can give us a strong beer license or even till 9%. I can understand I am probably asking for too much but as you know we are a new business it is hard to survive with all the costs going up with utilities etc we do require more profit in order for us to keep going and keeping up to our expenses. In addition the area we are located in has a very high foot fall as we have the high street near to us and so many hotels which tourists reside in, we can not provide the required customer service to them due to all the restrictions we have on our premises license.

# LICENSING OBJECTIVES

Describe the steps you intend to take to promote the four licensing objectives:

a) General – all four licensing objectives (b,c,d,e)

List here steps you will take to promote all four licensing objectives together.

I will train staff to contribute to well-run the premises and have a responsible approach to the sale of alcohol. All staff will be advised of licensing law in writing before they are allowed to serve alcohol.

b) The prevention of crime and disorder

An alarm and other security measure are installed at the premises to protect it when closed or empty with CCTV footage up to 31 days. A panic alarm connected to verisure is also installed in the matter of crime.

c) Public safety

A risk assessment is carried out each 12 months to identify potential hazards posed to staff or customers and setting out precautions to manage the hazards. All staff will also be made aware of the risk assessment and precautionary measures.

d) The prevention of public nuisance

We will reduce the potential for excessive queue lines with a well managed and efficient door policy. Queues should be actively managed by door staff,especially later in the evening, to keep noise to a minimum. Rowdy behavior from people queuing to get will not be tolerated. Door staff will refuse entry to anyone behaving in an anti-social way.

e) The protection of children from harm

A documented policy is set out measures to protect children from harm is in place at the premises. We operate a strict 'No ID – No Sale' policy. No alcohol 'Challenge 21' scheme serves as a reminder to staff of

the need to be vigilant in preventing underage sales and to customers that it is against the law for anyone under 18 to purchase alcohol. A 'Challenge 25' scheme gives staff additional support and encouragement to ask for ID from any person appearing to be under 25 years of age to prove that they are over 18. We also Keep a refusals book and ensure it is completed whenever a sale is refused to a person who cannot prove they are over the age of 18.

# NOTES ON REGULATED ENTERTAINMENT

In terms of specific regulated entertainments please note that:

- Plays: no licence is required for performances between 08:00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
- Films: no licence is required for 'not-for-profit' film exhibition held in community premises between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day provided that the audience does not exceed 500 and the organiser (a) gets consent to the screening from a person who is responsible for the premises; and (b) ensures that each such screening abides by age classification ratings.
- Indoor sporting events: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 1000.
- Boxing or Wrestling Entertainment: no licence is required for a contest, exhibition or display of Greco-Roman wrestling, or freestyle wrestling between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 1000. Combined fighting sports – defined as a contest, exhibition or display which combines boxing or wrestling with one or more martial arts – are licensable as a boxing or wrestling entertainment rather than an indoor sporting event.
- Live music: no licence permission is required for:
  - o a performance of unamplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, on any premises.
  - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
  - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a workplace that is not licensed to sell alcohol on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
  - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
  - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.
- Recorded Music: no licence permission is required for:
  - o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
  - o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
  - o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school proprietor or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.

- Dance: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 500. However, a performance which amounts to adult entertainment remains licensable.
- Cross activity exemptions: no licence is required between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, with no limit on audience size for:
  - any entertainment taking place on the premises of the local authority where the entertainment is provided 0 by or on behalf of the local authority;
  - any entertainment taking place on the hospital premises of the health care provider where the 0 entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the health care provider;
  - any entertainment taking place on the premises of the school where the entertainment is provided by or 0 on behalf of the school proprietor; and
  - any entertainment (excluding films and a boxing or wrestling entertainment) taking place at a travelling 0 circus, provided that (a) it takes place within a moveable structure that accommodates the audience, and (b) that the travelling circus has not been located on the same site for more than 28 consecutive days.
