Title and details of proposals:

Increase in Temporary Accommodation Households in more expensive accommodation - £1.2m

An increase in the use of more Bed and Breakfast (B&B) and B&B annexes as Temporary Accommodation (TA) for homeless households at more costly rates combined with constraints in the supply of private sector leased (PSL) accommodation is resulting in additional costs for the Council's Temporary Accommodation service.

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Part 1 - Partial EIA

As a minimum, part 1 must be completed for any proposal.

It is expected that this proposal will have a positive impact on groups that share protected characteristics as the budget growth will fund the increasing cost of homelessness within the borough and assist in having a positive impact on the cohort.

The budget growth will enable the Council to meet the increased cost of providing temporary accommodation for homeless households. A mitigation strategy is in place to ensure homeless households that the Council has a duty towards are placed into suitable but affordable accommodation. This is being achieved through measures including improved procurement of lower cost temporary accommodation and supplementing the supply of properties by discharging the Council's main housing duty into the private rented sector.
