There is a school opposite the shop so it is unthinkable that the shop should start selling alcohol which will cause issues for young people. This is a resident area and selling alcohol will threaten the security of the area especially as the shop is open 24/7. We recently had a serious car crash caused by the driver buying alcohol late at night and then speeding down Felden street and crashing into cars and houses in Swift Street. The shop already leaves rubbish in the street causing obstruction to pedestrians and that would only become worse with empty bottles. Also the shop is located next to an emergency barrier which makes it more vulnerable to alcohol drinkers. For these reasons we neighbours of Felden and Swift Street all object to this shop acquiring an alcohol licence. Thank you.

In the last months since this store opened, this quiet area has seen an increase of traffic flow with loud delivery motorbikes operating at all times of the night and customers loitering in their cars after hours, running their engines while staying parked on Munster Road and neighbouring streets.

Currently delivery motorbikes drive through the area at all times creating a constant flow of noise and traffic way past midnight.

If this small store is allowed to sell alcohol in the middle of our highly residential area, which also sits next to a Primary School, it would mean a further increase of noise and nuisance, but also an unsafe environment for the residents and pupils alike.

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It will deteriorate the safety of our area with people coming through for the sole purpose of getting alcohol late at night early morning past pub closing times and before and after games at nearby Craven Cottage.

I wholeheartedly object to this application and further deterioration of the neighbourhood.

This in turn will increase antisocial behaviour and crime which are already significant and increasing issues in the area</li><li>- the applicant states that the sale of alcohol will be a valuable service in the local community.
