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**Please give a general description of the premises (please read guidance note 1)**

This is an application for a Premises Licence to cover 676-680 Fulham Road, London. There is a current Premises Licence numbered 2024/00973/LAPR for 676 Fulham Road, held by the current applicant for this premises. It is understood from the Licensing Authority that there is also a current Premises Licence in place for 678-680 Fulham Road.

The holders of the current Premises Licence for 676 Fulham Road have acquired 678-680 and the proposal is to combine the two premises by altering the layout as approved for 676 Fulham Road combining with 678-680 Fulham Road.

The proposed application is to cover 676-680 Fulham Road but on substantially the same terms as for the current Premises Licence covering 676 Fulham Road, a copy of which is attached.

Attached is a copy of a plan which shows the existing layout for 676 Fulham Road (number 1320/1234/SK04).

Also attached is a copy of the proposed layout for the combined premises 676-680 Fulham road as follows:

- Plan number 554807/01

It can be seen when comparing the two plans that the proposal is to enlarge the existing facilities but to continue the format of operation of the premises as a licensed premises and a public house. Essentially the application is to increase the area currently operated in line with 676 Fulham Road.

The licensable activities requested will remain as approved under the existing Premises Licence for 676 Fulham Road being:

- Recorded music – indoors only
- Provision of Late Night Refreshment between 23:00 and 00:00 hours Monday to Saturday and 23:00 to 23:30 hours on Sunday
- Sales of Alcohol for consumption on and off the premises 08:00 to 00:00 Monday to Saturday and 08:00 to 22:30 on Sunday

In addition there are non standard timings as detailed in the application.

The opening hours of the premises will be 08:00 to 00:30 hours Monday to Saturday, and 08:00 to 00:00 on Sunday.

**a) General – all four licensing objectives (b,c,d,e) (please read guidance note 9)**

We have undertaken our own risk assessment to propose the following steps:-

The following conditions are to be retained as existing on the Premises Licence for 676 Fulham Road.

10. CCTV covering areas inside and outside of the premises shall be installed and maintained to police recommendations with properly maintained log arrangements. All images shall be stored for a minimum of 31 days.

11. CCTV shall comply with the Data Protection Act 2018 and shall be working and recording correctly at all times that the premises are open to the public. If the CCTV is not working, the premises shall comply with police requests, including suspension of licensable activity.

12. A staff member from the premises that is conversant with the operation of the CCTV system shall be on the premises at all times that the premises are open to the public. This staff member will be able to show police or authorised officers of the Licensing Authority recent data footage with the minimum of delay when requested. This data or footage reproduction shall be almost instantaneous.

13. Appropriate signage shall be displayed in prominent positions, informing customers they are being recorded on CCTV.

14. The Premises shall operate a 'Challenge 25' age-restricted sales policy where the only acceptable forms of identification are recognised photographic identification 18.07.20242005/02143/LAPRT Page 7 of 11 cards, such as a driving licence, passport or proof of age card with the PASS Hologram.

15. A daily incident log shall be kept at the Premises and made available on request to an authorised officer of the Council or the Police or the Fire Service which shall record the following:

- (a) all crimes reported to the venue
- (b) all ejection of patrons
- (c) any complaints received
- (d) any incidents of disorder
- (e) seizures of drugs or offensive weapons
- (f) any faults in the CCTV system
- (g) any refusal of the sale of alcohol
- (h) any visit by a relevant authority or emergency service.

16. The licence holder shall require staff to note any refusals in a refusals log. The refusals log shall record the date and time of the refusal; the name of the staff member refusing; and the reason for refusal. The refusals log shall be made available for inspection upon request by the Licensing Team, Police or Trading Standards.

17. On any day that Chelsea Football Club play Fulham Football Club either at home or away, between the hours of 08:00-10:00 alcohol shall only be sold ancillary to

food.

**b) The prevention of crime and disorder**

No further risks have been identified which need to be addressed, save as below

1. The use of door staff will be risk assessed on an ongoing basis by the licence holder of premises supervisor. Where engaged, door staff shall be licensed by the Security Industry Authority.
2. Staff will receive training on matters concerning underage sales, drugs policies and operating procedures.
3. There shall be a zero tolerance policy in relation to drugs at the premises and there shall be regular checks by management to prevent the use of drugs by patrons. Drugs seized shall be stored securely and handed to the police.
4. The management of the premises will liaise with police on issues of local concern or disorder.

**c) Public safety**

No further risks have been identified which need to be addressed, save as below

1. To comply with the reasonable requirements of the fire officer from time to time.
2. The premises will have adequate safety and fire fighting equipment and such equipment will be maintained in good operational order.
3. Staff will be trained on matters of safety, evacuation and use of emergency equipment as required.
4. Spillages and breakages will be removed as soon as possible to reduce the risk to patrons and staff.
5. Toughened glasses will be used in the premises where appropriate.
6. Fire Exits and means of escape shall be kept clear and in good operational condition.

**d) The prevention of public nuisance**

No further risks have been identified which need to be addressed, save as below

1. Where appropriate, prominent, clear and legible notices shall be displayed at all exits requesting the public respect the needs of local residents and to leave the premises and area quietly.
2. Patrons will be encouraged by staff to leave quietly and respect the interests of the occupiers of any nearby noise sensitive premises, Where appropriate the licensee or a suitable staff member will monitor patrons leaving at the closing time.
3. Noise or vibration shall not emanate from the premises so as to cause a nuisance to nearby properties.
4. Contact numbers for local taxi firm(s) shall be kept at the premises and made available to patrons requiring a taxi.

**e) The protection of children from harm**

1. The restrictions set out in the Licensing Act 2003 will apply. No unusual or additional risks of harm to
  - a. children have been identified.
2. There shall be adequate controls in place including staff training to safeguard against the sale of
  - a. alcohol to persons under 18 years.
3. The premises supervisor or appointed staff member shall ensure that when children are admitted to
  - a. the premises their presence is not inconsistent with the style of operation of the premises at that time
  - b. and the licensable activities that are being carried out.
4. Policies in relation to children shall be adequately communicated to patrons by staff or through appropriate signage.

    - a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
    - a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.
  - Recorded Music: no licence permission is required for:
    - any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
    - any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
    - any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the

relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school proprietor or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.

- Dance: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 500. However, a performance which amounts to adult entertainment remains licensable.
  - Cross activity exemptions: no licence is required between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, with no limit on audience size for:
    - any entertainment taking place on the premises of the local authority where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the local authority;
    - any entertainment taking place on the hospital premises of the health care provider where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the health care provider;
    - any entertainment taking place on the premises of the school where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the school proprietor; and
    - any entertainment (excluding films and a boxing or wrestling entertainment) taking place at a travelling circus, provided that (a) it takes place within a moveable structure that accommodates the audience, and (b) that the travelling circus has not been located on the same site for more than 28 consecutive days.
3. Where taking place in a building or other structure please tick as appropriate (indoors may include a tent).

Please give information about anything intended to occur at the premises or ancillary to the use of the premises which may give rise to concern in respect of children, regardless of whether you intend children to have access to the premises, for example (but not exclusively) nudity or semi-nudity, films for restricted age groups or the presence of gaming machines.
  10. Please list here steps you will take to promote all four licensing objectives together.
  11. The application form must be signed.
  12. An applicant's agent (for example solicitor) may sign the form on their behalf provided that they have actual authority to do so.
  13. Where there is more than one applicant, each of the applicants or their respective agent must sign the application form.
  14. This is the address which we shall use to correspond with you about this application.

**15. Entitlement to work/immigration status for individual applicants and applications from partnerships which are not limited liability partnerships:**

A licence may not be held by an individual or an individual in a partnership who is resident in the UK who:

- does not have the right to live and work in the UK; or
- is subject to a condition preventing him or her from doing work relating to the carrying on of a licensable activity.

Any premises licence issued in respect of an application made on or after 6 April 2017 will become invalid if the holder ceases to be entitled to work in the UK.

Applicants must demonstrate that they have the right to work in the UK and are not subject to a condition preventing them from doing work relating to the carrying on of a licensable activity.

They do this in one of two ways:

- 1) by providing with this application, copies or scanned copies of the documents which an applicant has provided, to demonstrate their entitlement to work in the UK (which do not need to be certified) as per information published on gov.uk and in guidance.
- 2) by providing their 'share code' to enable the licensing authority to carry out a check using the Home Office online right to work checking service (see below).

**Home Office online right to work checking service.**

As an alternative to providing a copy of original documents, applicants may demonstrate their right to work by allowing the licensing authority to carry out a check with the Home Office online right to work checking service.

To demonstrate their right to work via the Home Office online right to work checking service, applicants should include in this application their share code (provided to them upon accessing the service at <https://www.gov.uk/prove-right-to-work>) which, along with the applicant's date of birth, will allow the licensing authority to carry out the check.

In order to establish the applicant's right to work, the check will need to indicate that the applicant is allowed to work in the United Kingdom and is not subject to a condition preventing them from doing work relating to the carrying on of a licensable activity.

An online check will not be possible in all circumstances because not all applicants will have an immigration status that can be shared digitally. The Home Office online right to work checking service sets out what information and/or documentation applicants will need in order to access the service. Applicants who are unable to obtain a share code from the service should submit copies of documents as set out above.






