Annex 1 – Mandatory Conditions

1. Mandatory Condition

(1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.

(2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises—

(a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to—

(i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or

(ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);

(b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;

(c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;

(d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner;

(e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of disability).

2. Mandatory Condition

The responsible person shall ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.

3. Mandatory Condition

1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.

(2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.

(3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either—

- (a) a holographic mark, or
- (b) an ultraviolet feature.

4. Mandatory Condition

The responsible person must ensure that—

(a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures—

- (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
- (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
- (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml;

(b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and

(c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.

5. Mandatory Condition

1. A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.

2. For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 1—

(a) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979;

(b) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula—

$$P = D + (D \times V)$$

where—

- (i) P is the permitted price,
- (ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
- (iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;

(c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence—

- (i) the holder of the premises licence,

(ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
(iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;

(d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and

(e) "value added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.

3. Where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.

4.(1) Sub-paragraph (2) applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.

(2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

6. Mandatory Condition

(1) No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence-

(a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or

(b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.

(2) Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

7. Mandatory Condition

Where this licence includes a condition that at specified times one or more individuals must be at the premises to carry out a security activity, each individual must be licensed by the Security Industry Authority, with the following exceptions:

a) premises where the premises licence authorises plays or films

b) any occasion mentioned in paragraph 8(3)(b) or (c) of Schedule 2 to the Private Security Industry Act 2001 (premises being used exclusively by a club with a club premises certificate, under a temporary event notice authorising plays or films or under a gaming licence), or

c) any occasion within paragraph 8(3)(d) of Schedule 2 to the Private Security Industry Act 2001.

Annex 2 – Conditions consistent with the operating Schedule

8. After 23:00 all external doors and windows shall be kept closed at all times during the provision of regulated entertainment, save during access and egress.

9. A responsible member of staff shall carry out proactive noise assessments outside the premises at the boundary of the nearest residential property periodically after 23:00, during the provision of regulated entertainment and take any necessary remedial action.

10. A written record of proactive external noise assessments and, where applicable, remedial actions taken shall be kept for a minimum of 31 days from the date of the last entry in the record and this record shall be available for inspection on demand by authorised Council officers at all times the premises are open.

11. All stereo / television or other audio equipment including wall-mounted and / or free-standing / portable speakers shall be mounted on anti-vibration mountings / pads, as appropriate, to prevent vibration transmission of sound energy to adjoining properties.

Annex 3 – Conditions attached after a hearing by the licensing authority

12. High-Definition CCTV shall be installed, operated and maintained, at all times that the premises are open for licensable activities or customers are on the premises and;
a) shall be checked daily to ensure that the system is working properly and that the date and time are correct. A record of these checks, showing the date and name of the person checking, shall be kept and made available to Police or authorised Council officers on request.

b) at least one camera will show a close-up of the entrance/entrances to the premises, to capture a clear, full-length image of anyone entering.

c) shall cover any internal or external area of the premises where licensable activities take place.

d) recordings shall be in real time and stored for a minimum period of 31 days with date and time stamping.

e) footage shall be provided to Police or authorised council officer within 24 hours of a request.

f) a staff member from the premises that is conversant with the operation of the CCTV system shall be on the premises at all times. This staff member will be able to show police or authorised officers of the Licensing Authority recent data footage with the minimum of delay when requested. This data or footage reproduction shall be almost instantaneous.

13. A refusals record shall be kept at the premises to record details of all refusals to sell alcohol. This record shall contain the date and time of the incident, a description of the customer, the name of the member of staff who refused the sale, and the reason the sale was refused. The record shall be made to police and authorised officer of the Licensing Authority on request.

14. All staff working at the premises shall be given compulsory training on the following issues: Welfare and Vulnerability engagement (WAVE) , Ask for Angela, Drink Spiking and Safeguarding . Written records of this training, and a policy to

cover each of these topics, shall be retained and be made available to the Police or authorised officers of the Licensing Authority upon request.

15. A challenge 25 proof of age scheme for the sale of alcohol shall be operated at the premises and shall be promoted through the prominent display of posters.

16. The Licence Holder shall put arrangements in place to ensure that before serving alcohol or other age-restricted goods to customers they believe to be less than 25 years of age, staff ask to see accredited proof of age: that is, proof of age cards carrying the 'PASS' logo (and no others), a Passport, or UK Driving Licence bearing the photograph and date of birth of the customer.

17. On days where the premises are open after 23:00 there shall be 1 SIA on duty from 20:00 until close. The requirement for additional SIA shall be continually risk assessed by the premises. A copy of the risk assessment shall be kept for a minimum of 31 days and be made available to Police or the Local Authority upon request.

18. All staff responsible for selling alcohol shall receive regular training in the Licensing Act 2003 in terms of the licensing objectives, offences committed under the Act and conditions of the Premises Licence. Written records of this training shall be retained and made available to police and authorised officers of the Licensing Authority on request. This training shall be refreshed every six months.

19. The training for sale of alcohol shall cover the following steps: the assessment of age; how and when to challenge for proof of age; acceptable proof of age and how to check; and recording refusals.

20. Any alcohol sold for consumption off the premises shall be sold in a sealed container. Patrons are permitted to take from the premises resealed bottles of wine.

21. On days when Fulham Football Club are playing at home, or on days when a Fulham Football Club victory parade takes place, the Premise shall not allow any drinking, or provision of food, in any area outside the front of the premises for three hours before the advertised kick off time until one hour after the match has been completed.

22. A daily incident log (electronic or paper based) shall be kept at the Premises and made available on request to an authorised officer of the Council or the Police or the Fire Service which shall record the following:

- (a) all crimes reported to the venue
- (b) all ejection of patrons
- (c) any complaints received
- (d) any incidents of disorder
- (e) seizures of drugs or offensive weapons
- (f) any faults in the CCTV system
- (g) any visit by a relevant authority or emergency service.

23. The premises shall operate a dispersal policy and all staff shall be trained in its implementation. The dispersal policy will set out the steps that management will take to ensure that customers leave the premises quickly and quietly and do not loiter

outside. The Policy shall be retained and made available to police and authorised officers of the Licensing Authority on request.

24. Deliveries and collections (including refuse/recycling collections) associated with the premises shall be arranged between the hours of 08:00 to 20:00 only. Empty bottles / other glass and non-degradable refuse shall remain in the premises at the end of trading hours and shall not be taken out to the refuse point between the hours of 23:00 and 07:00.

25. All ventilation and extraction systems or odour abatement equipment shall be correctly installed, operated, maintained and regularly serviced, all in accordance with the manufacturer's instructions, to ensure that they are operating correctly and efficiently so as not to cause an odour or noise nuisance to neighbours.

26. Waste receptacles shall be emptied on a regular basis.

27. Signs shall be placed in prominent places reminding patrons there are residents living nearby and instructing them to respect the neighbours and to conduct their behaviour accordingly.

28. Litter shall be prevented at all times and where identified cleared from the vicinity of the premises.

29. The area to the immediate front of the premises shall be swept clear of litter after the Premises is closed to the public.
