Annex 1 – Mandatory Conditions

1. Mandatory Condition

(1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.

(2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises—

(a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to—

(i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or

(ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);

(b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;

(c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;

(d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner;

(e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of disability).

2. Mandatory Condition

The responsible person shall ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.

3. Mandatory Condition

1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.

(2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.

(3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either—

(a) a holographic mark, or

(b) an ultraviolet feature.

4. Mandatory Condition

The responsible person must ensure that—

(a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures—

(i) beer or cider: ½ pint;

(ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and

(iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml;

(b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and

(c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.

5. Mandatory Condition

1. A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.

2. For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 1—

(a) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979;

(b) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula—

$$P = D + (D \times V)$$

where—

(i) P is the permitted price,

(ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and

(iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;

(c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence—

(i) the holder of the premises licence,

(ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or

(iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;

(d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and

(e) "value added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.

3. Where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.

4.(1) Sub-paragraph (2) applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.

(2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

6. Mandatory Condition

(1) No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence—

(a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or

(b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.

(2) Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

Mandatory Condition

Admission of children must be restricted in accordance with any recommendation made by the film classification body specified in the licence, or, where the licensing authority has notified the holder of the licence that it considers a classification is necessary then, admission of children must be restricted in accordance with any recommendation made by that licensing authority.

In this section -

"children" means persons under the age of 18; and

"film classification body" means the person or persons designated as the authority under section 4 of the Video Recordings Act 1984 (c.39) (authority to determine suitability of video works for classification).

Annex 2 – Conditions consistent with the operating Schedule

8. The total accommodation figure shall not exceed 1000 persons when patrons are seated, and 1200 at stand-up functions.

9 The Premises shall operate a 'Challenge 25' Age-Restricted sales policy and promote it through the prominent display of posters.

10 The Licence Holder shall put arrangements in place to ensure that before serving alcohol or other Age-Restricted goods to customers they believe to be less than 25 years of age, staff ask to see accredited proof of age: that is, proof of age cards carrying the 'PASS' logo (and no others), a Passport, or UK Driving Licence bearing the photograph and date of birth of the customer.

11 All staff responsible for selling alcohol shall receive relevant training before making any unsupervised sales. The training shall include:

- i) the Licensing Act 2003 in terms of the licensing objectives and offences committed under the Act;
- ii) the conditions of the Premises Licence;
- iii) the sale of Age-Restricted products - the assessment of age; how and when to challenge for proof of age; acceptable proof of age and how to check; and recording refusals. This training shall be refreshed annually. Staff shall sign to confirm that they have received and understood the training. Written records of this training shall be retained and made available to the Police or authorised officers of the Licensing Authority upon request.

12 All staff responsible for selling alcohol shall be trained in how to identify drunk or drug impaired customers. This training shall be refreshed annually. Staff shall sign to confirm that they have received and understood the training. Written records of this

training shall be retained and made available to the Police or authorised officers of the Licensing Authority upon request.

13 The Licence Holder shall require staff to note any alcohol refusals in a refusals log. The refusals log shall record the date and time of the refusal; the name of the staff member refusing; and the reason for refusal. It must be checked and signed monthly by the designated premises supervisor. The refusals log shall be made available for inspection upon request by the Licensing Team, Police or Trading Standards.

14 High Definition CCTV shall be installed, operated and maintained, at all times that the premises are open for licensable activities or customers are on the premises and;

- i) shall be checked every two weeks to ensure that the system is working properly and that the date and time are correct. A record of these checks, showing the date and name of the person checking, shall be kept and made available to the Police or authorised Council officers on request.

- ii) shall cover any internal and immediate external area(s) where the sale of alcohol habitually takes place.

- iii) at least one camera shall show a close-up of the entrance(s) to the main site and the main entrances to the individual site location(s) where the sale of alcohol habitually takes place, to capture a clear, full length image of anyone entering.

- iv) recordings shall be in real time and stored for a minimum period of 31 days with date and time stamping.

- v) footage shall be provided free of charge to the Police or authorised Council officer within 24 hours of a request, subject to a relevant CCTV request document(s) being provided.

- vi) a staff member from the premises that is conversant with the operation of the CCTV system shall be on the premises at all times. This staff member will be able to show Police or authorised officers of the Licensing Authority recent data footage with the minimum of delay when requested. This data or footage reproduction shall be almost instantaneous.

15 Appropriate signage shall be displayed in prominent positions, informing customers they are being recorded on CCTV.

16 Management, bar staff and security shall undertake the relevant training in relation to responding and ensuring the welfare and safeguarding of vulnerable patrons. Management shall risk assess the need for all other relevant staff to undertake such training. This training shall be refreshed annually. Staff shall sign to confirm that they have received and understood the training. Written records of this training shall be retained and made available to the Police or authorised officers of the Licensing Authority upon request.

17 All staff working in any licensable area shall be made aware of the current policies and protocols when dealing with the welfare and safeguarding of patrons.

18 A daily incident log (electric or paper based) shall be kept at the Premises and made available on request to an authorised officer of the Council or the Police or the Fire Service which shall record the following:

- (i) all crimes reported to the venue
- (ii) all ejection of patrons
- (iii) any incidents of disorder

- (iv) seizures of drugs or offensive weapons
- (v) any faults in the CCTV system
- (vi) any visit by a relevant authority or emergency service.

The incident record shall be kept on the premises and be available for inspection by the Police or authorised officers of the Licensing Authority at all times the premises is open.

19. Access to the premises shall be in line with the premises' access policy. This policy shall be made available to the Police or authorised officers of the Licensing Authority upon request.

20. All children shall be accompanied by an adult when in the bar areas.

Annex 3 – Conditions attached after a hearing by the licensing authority

21. When outside events are taking place noise 'nuisance' shall be monitored to ensure there is no disturbance to neighbours.

22. Security staff shall be provided when deemed necessary.

22. Live amplified music is permitted outdoors during the following hours:

Up to 5 occasions per annum 5pm until 11pm

Up to 1 occasion per annum 1pm until 11:30pm

23. Un-amplified music on unlimited occasions provided it is restricted to a maximum of four performers at any one time termination no later than 11.00pm (outdoors only).

24. A complaints book shall be held on the premises to record details of any complaints received from neighbours.

25. Signs shall be displayed at the exits of the premises and in appropriate external areas instructing patrons to recognise the residential nature of the area and to conduct their behaviour accordingly.

26. Alcohol shall not be consumed other than during the hours permitted by this licence for the sale of alcohol and during a 30-minute period immediately following the permitted hours.

27. The applicant shall take all reasonable steps to ensure that at least fourteen days notice shall be given to local residents of performances of amplified live music outdoors on the six occasions per annum permitted.

28. The licensee shall ensure that music provided at the premises shall not cause a nuisance to nearby residents and any form of amplification shall be so controlled by the licensee as to prevent such a nuisance.

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



EXISTING GROUND FLOOR PLAN

"film classification body" means the person or persons designated as the authority under section 4 of the Video Recordings Act 1984 (c.39) (authority to determine suitability of video works for classification).

Mandatory Condition

Where this licence includes a condition that at specified times one or more individuals must be at the premises to carry out a security activity, each individual must be licensed by the Security Industry Authority, with the following exceptions:

a) premises where the premises licence authorises plays or films

b) any occasion mentioned in paragraph 8(3)(b) or (c) of Schedule 2 to the Private Security Industry Act 2001 (premises being used exclusively by a club with a club premises certificate, under a temporary event notice authorising plays or films or under a gaming licence), or

c) any occasion within paragraph 8(3)(d) of Schedule 2 to the Private Security Industry Act 2001.

Annex 2 – Conditions consistent with the operating Schedule

9. The premises shall implement a dispersal policy to ensure that as far as practicable customers leaving the premises at the end of each night's trading session do so

quickly and quietly. A copy of the dispersal policy shall be available upon request to the Police or officer of the Local Authority.

10. The Premises shall have a policy to ensure the welfare and safeguarding of vulnerable patrons. Staff shall be able to support and assist people who feel unsafe, vulnerable or threatened. Should customers approach the venue for assistance, these incidents shall be recorded in the incident log. This policy shall be made available to police or authorised officers of the Licensing Authority upon request.

11. The premises licence shall only be in force on four days during 2025 and 2026 with the specific dates being notified to the Licensing Authority.

12. Only ticket holders shall be permitted entry to the premises.

13. A minimum of 5 SIA licensed door supervisors shall be on duty at the premises during the hours of 12:00 to 22:00.

14. When door supervisors are on duty, 'Clickers' or other recognised counting devices shall be used. An accurate log of patron numbers shall be maintained by door supervisors.

15. A maximum of 700 customers shall be permitted on the premises at any one time.

16. The premises shall install and maintain a CCTV system which will cover all entrances/exits to the venue.

17. Appropriate signage shall be displayed in prominent positions, informing customers they are being recorded on CCTV.

18. All staff responsible for selling/serving alcohol shall receive relevant training before making any unsupervised sales/service. The training shall include:

- a) the Licensing Act 2003 in terms of the licensing objectives and offences committed under the Act;
- b) the conditions of the Premises Licence;
- c) the sale/provision of age-restricted products.
- d) how to identify drunk or drug impaired customers.

Staff shall sign to confirm that they have received and understood the training. Written records of this training shall be retained and made available to the Police or authorised officers of the Licensing Authority upon request.

19. A daily incident log (electric or paper based) shall be kept at the Premises and made available on request to an authorised officer of the Council or the Police or the Fire Service which shall record the following:

- (a) all crimes reported to the venue
- (b) all ejection of patrons
- (c) any complaints received
- (d) any incidents of disorder
- (e) seizures of drugs or offensive weapons
- (f) any faults in the CCTV system
- (g) any visit by a relevant authority or emergency service.

The incident record shall be kept on the premises and be available for inspection by the Police or authorised officers of the Licensing Authority at all times the premises is open.

20. The Premises shall operate a 'Challenge 25' age-restricted sales/provision policy and promote it through the prominent display of posters.

21. The Licence Holder shall put arrangements in place to ensure that before serving alcohol or other age-restricted goods to customers they believe to be less than 25 years of age, staff ask to see accredited proof of age: that is, proof of age cards carrying the 'PASS' logo (and no others), a Passport, or UK Driving Licence bearing the photograph and date of birth of the customer.

22. The Licence Holder shall require staff to note any refusals in a refusals log. The refusals log shall record the date and time of the refusal; the name of the staff member refusing; and the reason for refusal. It must be checked and signed monthly by the designated premises supervisor. The refusals log shall be made available for inspection upon request by the Licensing Team, Police or Trading Standards.

23. The Premises shall operate a zero tolerance policy to drug use and posters shall be prominently displayed to this effect.

24. A drugs policy shall be in effect and all staff shall be trained in the implementation of the policy. The policy should be made available to the Police or authorised officers of the Licensing Authority upon request.

25. Notices shall be displayed throughout the premises to advise customers of the potential for thefts.

26. The Premises shall maintain a lost property record. As a minimum this will include details of type of property, numbers of mobile phones, personal details attainable and restoration efforts. This will be available to the Police or authorised officers of the Licensing Authority upon request.


