**Annex 1 – Mandatory Conditions**

1. Mandatory Condition

1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.

(2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.

(3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either—

- (a) a holographic mark, or
- (b) an ultraviolet feature.

2. Mandatory Condition

1. A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.

2. For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 1—

- (a) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979;
- (b) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula—

$$P = D + (D \times V)$$

where—

- (i) P is the permitted price,
  - (ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
  - (iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;
- (c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence—
- (i) the holder of the premises licence,
  - (ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or

(iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;

(d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and

(e) "value added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.

3. Where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.

4(1) Sub-paragraph (2) applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.

(2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

### 3. Mandatory Condition

(1) No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence-

(a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or

(b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.

(2) Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

## **Annex 2 – Conditions consistent with the operating Schedule**

4. Alcohol shall not be sold or supplied in an open container or be consumed in the licensed premises.

## **Annex 3 – Conditions attached after a hearing by the licensing authority**

5. Appropriate signage shall be displayed in prominent positions, informing customers they are being recorded on CCTV.

6. CCTV covering areas inside and outside of the premises shall be installed and maintained to police recommendations with properly maintained log arrangements.

7. A staff member from the premises that is conversant with the operation of the CCTV system shall be on the premises at all times that the premises are open to the public. This staff member will be able to show police or authorised officers of the

Licensing Authority recent data footage with the minimum of delay when requested. This data or footage reproduction shall be almost instantaneous.

8. CCTV shall be working and recording correctly at all times. All images shall be stored for a minimum of 31 days.

9. All bottles and cans of beer, lager or cider shall be clearly labelled or marked with the name of the premises.

10. There shall be a minimum of 1 personal licence holder on duty on the premises at all times when the premises are authorised to sell alcohol.

11. The premises shall operate a Challenge 25 age restricted sales policy and shall display appropriate signage advising customers of this policy.

12. A refusals record shall be kept at the premises to record details of all refusals to sell alcohol. This record shall contain the date and time of the incident, a description of the customer, the name of the staff member who refused the sale, and the reason the sale was refused. The record shall be made available to police and authorised officers of the Licensing Authority on request.

13. The Licence Holder / Designated Premises Supervisor shall undertake checks that the supply of alcohol comes from a legitimate supplier and shall undertake checks to ensure legitimacy of the supplier. Signs shall be displayed at the main public entrance of the premises stating that premises will buy alcohol only from authorised wholesalers.

14. Where the Licence Holder/Designated Premises Supervisor/Manager becomes aware that any alcohol or tobacco products on the licensed premises may not have had duty paid the Police and the Licensing Authority shall be informed within 1 working day.

15. The Licence Holder shall ensure that all invoices for alcohol goods purchased include the seller's name and address, the seller's company details (if applicable) and the seller's VAT details (if applicable). Copies of the invoices shall be retained at the premises for a period of not less than 12 months and shall be made available for inspection by the police, HMRC and authorised officers of the Licensing Authority within five working days of request.

16. All staff responsible for selling alcohol shall receive regular training, to be repeated biannually, in the Licensing Act 2003 in terms of licencing objectives, offences committed under the Act, conditions of the Premises Licence, Cumulative Impact Policy ( CIP) and immigration.

17. Strong beer and cider above 5.5% ABV shall not be displayed or sold.
